In spite of this, we actually served more meals than last year and because our diners preferred the baked entrées more than the fried, we actually showed more income than last year. We'll have a more complete accounting of the fish fry in time for our May meeting. Again, thanks to all!

We look forward to having **Sister Marie Sullivan** join us this month at our April meeting. Over the winter, Council 11402 provided a drywall ceiling and touch-up painting for the Sullivan Center in S.W. Atlanta.

The Sullivan Center provides job retraining and life skills development training for those who often fall through the cracks. We will also be assisting Sister Marie in a few months in preparation for her summer camp for underprivileged youth.

We are busy making plans to hold two events over the next few months. First is a fund-raiser for the Wheelchair Foundation sponsored, in part, by the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council. This will be our contribution to the boxcar load that the Georgia Council has as its goal.

Also, we're planning a fundraiser for Southern Catholic College, probably later in the summer. As a tie-in with the College, we're also holding our 3rd weekend-retreat on the Southern Catholic cam-

State of the Council Report

There has been a very healthy shift in the enrollment makeup of All Saints Council in the last year. Not only has our enrollment increased, but the distribution of brothers has shifted upward throughout the degrees.

One year ago our membership looked like this:

75 first degree, 2 second degree, 75 third degree, and 75 fourth degree Sir Knights for a total of 227 members.

Presently, our membership looks like this:

49 first degree, 8 second degree, 106 third degree, and 73 fourth degree Sir Knights, for a total of 236 members.

Several brothers have recently moved to other states and transferred councils. Sadly, two brothers have passed away. Three brothers are scheduled to progress from 3rd to 4th degree on April 12th. We are also blessed with an unprecedented number of candidates having submitted Form 100's. This bodes very well for the future.

It is important that healthy councils have large numbers of high-ranking brothers. These become the officers, activity directors, and frequent volunteers making the programs successful. Brothers with rank higher than first degree rarely leave the Order. They become Knights for life even when they move to other locations.



Religious Golfing Retreat—Who Would Guess?



Deacon Ray Egan is coordinating a contract with *Southern Catholic College* of Dawsonville, GA to hold a weekend retreat there on Aug 2-3, and then switch gears to play Sunday golf on the adjacent Gold Creek Course. We should have final retreat pricing and details once the contract is in-hand. We expect a better rate than at Simpsonwood last year.

Our retreat master, Fr. Marty Kopchik, was appointed Associate Pastor of St. Jude in June of 2004. Ordained in May of 1986, he has served in the Archdiocese since 1987, serving in St. Patrick's (1988-1989, 1995-2001) and St. Lawrence (1989-1994) at various times. This constitutes 20 years of service. He is now the Chaplain of the *North Metro Serra Club*.

He was born on February 16, 1949 in Gary, Indiana and raised in a Byzantine Rite Catholic Church which sang the mass in chants of Old Slavonic. After attending Catholic grade school at his home parish and a Catholic High School run by the Basilians, Fr. Marty went to Indiana University and Purdue University.

Retreat Master: Fr. Martin (Marty) Kopchik, MSFS

Before religious life Fr. Marty was a computer programmer for Simmons Corporation in Munster, Indiana. He was transferred to Atlanta where they centralized their Data Processing System in the Central Office in 1975. Having no family or friends in Atlanta, Fr. Marty

soon got involved in his extended family, St. Patrick Catholic Church in Norcross, Georgia. There were no Byzantine Catholic Churches at the time in Atlanta. St. Patrick was staffed at the time by the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales (MSFS) who encouraged him to become a priest in their order.


Fr. Marty was sent to Washington, DC, where he received a BA in Philosophy from Oblate College in 1982 and an MA in Theology at Catholic University of America 1985. He received a License in Sacred Scripture at Catholic University of America in 1987. He spent a year in Spain studying the Spanish Mystics (2002) and on vacation in Spain walked the famous 80-mile Camino of Sandiago de Compostela Trail. Fr. Marty was the Vocation Director for the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales for a year (2003) before he was assigned as Associate Pastor of St. Jude (2004-present).

Besides the normal pastoral/sacramental responsibilities of the parish, Fr. Marty loves to teach. He teaches the Gospel of Luke on Tuesday at noon, and he does a class on Salesian Spirituality on Friday at noon. Parishioners gather to share their faith and eat lunch. He will be transferred to the Basil Luyet House of Prayer and Vocations in June of 2008.

Golf: This year we have arranged a special rate of \$35/per for 18 holes at Gold Creek Golf Course (on land just adjacent to the College). **The \$35 fee includes the cart!!!!**

We have 4- foursomes reserved (more, possible) for tee times beginning on Sunday at roughly 4 PM. The retreat starts on Saturday, single or double occupancy rooms are available for that night. We anticipate the Sunday retreat/lunch/Mass portion being finished about 2:30-3:00 PM, leaving an hour to get ready for golf.

Venerable Fr. McGivney —-First Step to Sainthood



New Haven, CT - March 16, 2008 - Pope Benedict XVI today approved a decree recognizing the heroic virtue of Father Michael J. McGivney, founder of the Knights of Columbus. The pope's declaration significantly advances the priest's process toward sainthood and gives the parish priest the distinction of "*Venerable Servant of God.*" If canonized, Fr. McGivney would be the first American-born priest to be so honored.

The cause, or process, for Father McGivney's sainthood, was opened by Hartford Archbishop Daniel A. Cronin, in December 1997. The cause was presented to the Vatican in 2000, where it has been under review by the Congregation for the Causes of Saints. With the pope's recent decree, and the authentication of a miracle at Father McGivney's intercession, the priest could be beatified. A second miracle would be required for canonization.

Passed and Pending Council Benevolence Actions

At the March meeting, Deputy Grand Knight Lou Hlad reported on two recommendations of the council **Charity Review Committee**. Motions were made and seconded that they be approved. In accordance with our by-laws, the motions had to be tabled, publicized in our newsletter, and voted on by the council members present at the April meeting. All committee recommendations are made after careful consideration of council involvement, gift impact, and available council funds.

Request 1: Brother Tom Burleigh requested a donation to I-Care, Inc. This charity is an interfaith agency that matches volunteer drivers with DeKalb senior citizens without transportation to medical appointments. Several of our brothers are drivers. The Committee recommended a gift of **\$1,500**.

Request 2: Brother Dave Moeller requested a donation to Birthright Atlanta. This Right-to-Life organization gives private counseling to pregnant women via hotline and appointment when there is danger of abortion choices. The Committee recommended a gift of **\$1,000**.

Request 3: Brother Joe Kane had submitted a large request for a donation to Our Lady of the Gulf Parish in Mississippi to aid with their hurricane recovery efforts. The Committee asked for more information regarding the recipients of the funds and the method of distribution. The request must be rewritten in more detail before consideration.

Special Request: All Saints Boy Scout Troop 434 Scoutmaster Jerry Travers, Jr. requested that we consider a gift to Life Scout Brian Weir to help him complete his Eagle Scout project for the Interfaith Outreach Home. He presented his case at our March officer meeting and the officers voted him a **\$300** stipend toward his goal. Since the amount was less than \$500, a full council hearing and vote was not necessary according to our by-laws. See the article below regarding his project.

Special Elections: The Grand Knight called for nominations from the floor to fill the open officer positions of Chancellor and Advocate. Mario Commito agreed to serve the unexpired term of the Chancellor (a position he had held previously). John Knight agreed to serve the unexpired term of Advocate, a new role for him. Both had held guard positions and had hereby relinquished them to serve in a higher capacity. We thank them both sincerely for their generous valued service.

All Saints Scout Brian Wier Receives Council Aid

It may not be well known to everyone, but the second floor of McGivney Hall (better known as the Scout Hut) is an incubation chamber for Eagles. Right above us, 38 young men have gone on to achieve the challenging rank of **Eagle Scout** under the watchful eye of Jerry Travers, Jr. He is the son of one of our founding members, Jerry Travers, Sr., who passed away nearly three years ago. Louie Hlad, the son of our Deputy Grand Knight, is Eagle Scout #13.

Eagle Scout #39 is slated to be current Life Scout, Brian Wier, who has been recommended to us by Jerry for financial help with his eagle project. Brian made a presentation outlining his project to the officers before the March meeting. We were delighted to learn that he will be renovating the toddler playground of the **Interfaith Outreach Home (IOH)**, one of our own selected charities.

The project encompasses these elements:

- Woodchip removal
- Resurfacing of play area with rubber mulch (800 sq. ft)
- Installation of a new play structure
- Installation of 2-3 benches in surrounding area

The costs include:

Seven New “Social Sins” Identified by Vatican

The **seven deadly sins**, also known as the **capital vices** or **cardinal sins**, are a classification of **vices** that were originally used in early **Christian** teachings to educate and instruct followers concerning (**immoral**) fallen man's tendency to sin. The **Roman Catholic Church** divided **sin** into two principal categories: “**venial**”, which are relatively minor, and could be forgiven through any **Sacramentals** or **Sacraments** of the Church, and the more severe “**capital**” or **mortal sin**.

Mortal sins destroyed the life of grace, and created the threat of eternal **damnation** unless either absolved through the sacrament of **confession**, or forgiven through perfect **contrition** on the part of the penitent. Beginning in the early 14th century, the popularity of the seven deadly sins as a theme among European artists of the time eventually helped to in-grain them in many areas of Christian culture and Christian consciousness in general throughout the world.

There is nowhere in the Christian **Bible** that a list of the Seven Deadly Sins is given, although lists of virtues contrasted with lists of sins are found in certain books of the **New Testament**, such as **Galatians**.

Listed in the same order used by both **Pope Gregory the Great** in the 6th Century AD, and later by **Dante Alighieri** in his epic poem *The Divine Comedy*, the seven deadly sins are as follows: **Luxuria** (extravagance, later **lust**), **Gula** (**gluttony**), **Avaritia** (**greed**), **Acedia** (**sloth**), **Ira** (**wrath**), **Invidia** (**envy**), and **Superbia** (**pride**). Each of the seven deadly sins has an opposite among the corresponding **seven holy virtues** (sometimes also referred to as the **contrary virtues**). In parallel opposition are the seven holy virtues of **chastity**, **abstinence**, **temperance**, **diligence**, **patience**, **kindness**, and **humility**.

On **March 9, 2008** the Vatican newspaper published an interview with Bishop Gianfranco Girotti (head of the Apostolic Penitentiary, the Vatican body which oversees confessions and plenary indulgences), in which he listed seven modern social sins. These “social” sins were given as follows:

Environmental pollution
Genetic manipulation
Accumulating excessive wealth
Inflicting poverty
Drug trafficking and consumption
Morally debatable experiments
Violation of fundamental rights of human nature

It is unclear to what extent these are intended to be new categories of deadly sin, and to what extent they are merely *examples* of sins. The American Catholic weekly **America** in its March 10, 2008 editorial blog has criticized the mass media's interpretation of the interview:

The Vatican's intent seemed to be less about adding to the traditional “deadly” sins (lust, anger, sloth, pride, avarice, gluttony, envy) than reminding the world that sin has a social dimension, and that participation in institutions that themselves sin is an important point upon which believers needed to reflect.

So consider the morality of the failure to recycle and the consequences of driving that gas-guzzling sport utility vehicle.

Nomination Committee for New Officers Forming

With our new fiscal 2008-2009 year (July through June) fast approaching, it is the obligation of the Grand Knight to appoint a **Nomination Committee** to solicit candidates who would agree to serve, and then (after deliberation) suggest a slate of new officers to the Council for a formal vote at the June Business Meeting. Any third-degree or fourth-degree brother is eligible to serve as an officer pending election to the post. During the actual **June 3rd election**, any eligible member may add his name to the official recommended slate of officers and be also considered for the post of his choice.

Thus far, these brothers have agreed to serve on the Committee: (alphabetically) **John Buchholz, Dennis Caniglia, Bob Fiscella, Don Myers, and Sam Portis**. More members could be added and a Chairman has yet to be chosen.

Any third or fourth degree brother who has an interest in serving as an officer should make his intentions known to one or more of these committee members. Their recommendations are due by April 30th. New officers are then inducted in a special church ceremony in late June and they begin their terms on July 1st.

These are the positions open to all eligible members: **Grand Knight, Deputy Grand Knight, Chancellor, Advocate, Treasurer, Recorder, Warden, Inside Guards (up to 4), Outside Guards (up to 4), and Trustee-3-Year-Term**. The offices of Financial Secretary and Lecturer are appointments by the Grand Knight. Two other Trustee positions are not yet expired.

Please consider becoming an officer of the Council and please attend the very important June 3rd meeting.




Another New Fish Fry Record—6159

This year we again smashed and obliterated the previous Lenten-meals-served record by an amazing 0.03%. Whoever bought the last two meals (we all suspect Greg Crnkovich) put us over the top versus last year's record sales. We needed to serve 951 meals on the final Friday and we served 952. This gave us a record 6159 meals served over this Lenten season compared to 6157 last year (whew!!)

Because we suspect we may have reached the limit of seating capacity in the Social Hall, Sir Knight Bob Mitchell (Georgia Tech Engineer) is planning a second deck of tables 3.275 meters over the originals. We will also install timers at each table.

We thank all the folks who worked so hard this year in making this a success, and especially Dennis Caniglia and Tom Simon who oversaw the entire event and made it run very smoothly.

We suspect that this complex might have been one of the few to withstand Hurricane Katrina without damage.


Brother Jack will also include very detailed instructions for reaching the unit.




During the April 1st NASCAR event at the Atlanta Motor Speedway, our Council has been asked to host the hospitality tent for the *Hello Kitty Race Team*.




