## Grand Knight's Report

My Brothers,

Having completed my first month as your Grand Knight, I have a new appreciation of the talent level in our Council and the hard work in planning required to make events successes.

The last event under the previous regime was an historic June 29th Wedding Vow Renewal of both brothers and other parishioners married over 50 years. I can promise you that the congregation at the 10:30 Mass was stunned when 33 couples stood up to renew vows. An Honor Guard, our acolyte team, and our Chaplain sure made it a memorable Knight extravaganza. Al Garofalo and Monsignor made the Mass and the reception after it memorable.

Our initial foray into the new Fraternal Year was a very nice march in the Dunwoody Fourth of July Parade with about 50 people participating. Our rolling stock included four classic convertibles and two golf carts, one with musical equipment. We would have had five cars, but one was totally destroyed by fire (before the parade). Then on July 12th, we had a record number of 11 brothers progress to the Second Degree at an exemplification in our own All Saints Social Hall. Their pictures and names are contained in this newsletter. We've never had so many sophomore members (20 total.)

Our new officers and chairmen have all been hard at work formulating a new 2008-2009 budget. That document is also in this newsletter for your examination and comment. It will be discussed at the next business meeting. There are some large capital expenditures contained,

such as a new towable barbeque cooker, some computer presentation equipment, a new fish fry cooker, and some ceiling-mounted storage cabinets for our back office.

Our attention has been focused on making the August 2/3 Retreat at Southern Catholic College a success. We have another good group scheduled to attend. We will be housed in the fine villas there. Helping get Southern Catholic jump-started is a long-term goal of the KofC Georgia State Council and we need to assist.

Plans also continue for the next First Degree ceremony on Thursday, August 7th. Frank Callan has already interviewed seven very interested candidates. Other councils are invited to bring new inductees along as well. We initiate any brothers we can.



Georgia became the fastest-growing state in the Order last year. There are now 98 Councils in Georgia. Our Father Watters Fourth Degree Assembly just subdivided into two Assemblies.

St. Brigid Council has asked for our assistance in making their first Knight-run fish fry this Fall a success. Other local councils are asking to participate in our

next Vidalia Onion sale. We're not sure how many more Councils we can accommodate.

Just so you don't get bored, we have an Elaine Clark Center work day on August 16th and an altar server outing on that same day. We'll be working the parish Hoedown on August 23rd. On August 26th we'll have a 2nd degree at All Saints. Father Bryan has asked us to host an Emory Catholic Center Cookout August 27th.

And that's how we get our double star awards!

# Passed and Pending Council Benevolence Actions

At the July Council Business Meeting, Deputy Grand Knight Dennis Caniglia re-introduced the June motion of Sir Knight Gene Gannon to award \$1,000 to the charity in which he is active called *Sentinels of Freedom*. It provides wounded service personnel help in re-entering civilian life. Training, housing, and other encouragements are provided. Along with the \$200 awarded last month for postage for 6,000 donated golf balls to the troops in Iraq, it reinvigorates the commitment of our Order to involve ourselves in Patriotic causes.

At the July meeting, another charity request for \$1,000 was received. After discussion by the Charity Review Committee, it will be announced at the August Council Meeting. This committee is headed by the Deputy Grand Knight, and it also includes the five program chairman and the three trustees. Charity Request Forms are available at McGivney Hall.

We received many kudos for our donation of \$500 to the All Saints Vacation Bible School as well.

# Proposed 2008-2009 Council Budget

Brothers,

Attached is this year's proposed budget for our upcoming fiscal year. Most of the entries are either that used in last year's budget or a slight adjustment based on experience from last year and previous years. Our Financial Secretary, Gert Kampfer, has been doing this for five years and this is his sixth budget. All the officers, trustees, and program chairmen participated in a meeting in which these line items were delivered.

Those of you who took accounting courses will notice that the amount taken in and the amount going out are not equal. This ignores a cardinal rule of accounting. We have done this intentionally. We actually desire to spend more than we take in this year to draw down cash positions.

We have increased the outlay for "capital expenditures" this year. This category includes potential costs for a new towable barbeque grill, some computer projection equipment, a new fryer for fish fries, storage cabinets for our back office, and a digital photo printer for "Desserts with Santa". We have learned that Polaroid film is no longer manufactured.

Also increased are unrestricted charity and support cost for another seminarian (3 total). Religious women and diaconate costs are also funded.

We have included another income event which may be a Las Vegas night or another event or events that raise some notable sum. One such alternate idea will be discussed at the August meeting.

# 50+ Year Wedding Vow Renewal Mass

On June 29th, Council 11402 under the efforts of our Religious Chairman, Al Garofalo, hosted a marriage vow renewal ceremony at the 10:30 AM Mass at All Saints Church. All the council couples and also all other parish couples who had been married for 50 or more years were invited to participate. Monsignor Kiernan presided over group renewal of marriage vows. He was an early supporter of the idea that was certainly an inspiration to the parishioners in attendance.

The congregation was stunned as 33 couples stood to renew their vows. Actually only 17 of our over 30 eligible council couples were able to attend. And it is unlikely that anywhere near all the eligible parish couples could attend. All Saints is certainly blessed to have so many lengthy marriages in our midst.

The ceremony was made even more special by the participation of six council brothers on the altar as acolytes and a large contingent of 4th Degree *Fr. Charles J. Watters Assembly* honor guards in their regalia. A reception for all these participants followed in the parish social hall. Each married couple was invited to introduce themselves and state the length of their marriage. The winning couple proudly announced that they had been married for 64 years.

This was a signature event for our Council and our thanks go out to Sir Knight Al Garofalo and Monsignor Kiernan for its conception and execution. Special thanks also to the acolytes and honor guard brothers and Sir Knight Deacon-in-Training Ed Krise who participated to make it special.
