## Grand Knight's Report

Worthy Brothers:

Twice each year, the Grand Knights, Financial Secretaries, and Program Directors of every Council in Georgia meet with the State Deputy and the State Officers to touch base, learn about state-wide programs, and to try to map out the fraternal year.

It's always interesting to learn about what other Councils are doing to spread the virtues of charity, fraternity, and unity. Many times we hear a Grand Knight sing the same old song....."We could do so much more, but my problem is that 20% of my council's membership does 80% of the work! I just don't know how to get the other guys involved!"

An Italian economist named Vilfredo Pareto is credited with formulating this principle with regard to the distribution of income in 19<sup>th</sup> Century Italy. It didn't take long for this so called 80/20 rule to be applied and misapplied in many fields of social endeavor.

I have to say that Council 11402 follows, to a great extent, this behavior. Fortunately, during the Lenten Fish Fry season, we tilt a little more toward the 40/60 rule!!! But in the main, we're pretty much like all the other Councils in Georgia.

As your Grand Knight, I'm deeply involved in developing and growing our Council both with regard to membership and in the scope and depth of our activities. Last month, I mentioned several things that our Council accomplished over the past year that I thought were significant. Looking back over that list, it's even more impressive when you consider the actual number of men and women that were involved in making it happen.

Every year, our Financial Secretary prepares a statement of Fraternal Activity for the Council. This breaks down both our financial contributions

as well as our volunteer service hours in the five program areas we organize around, plus our activities in support of our Brothers sick and in distress.

For calendar year 2007, we're reporting almost 8200 service hours. Given that we have just over 220 active members, that breaks down into 37 hours/member/year or 1 work-week per year per member. That's like saying that we give about 2% as much time to being a Knight as we do to working or to being retired! Of course, these numbers are skewed even more when we factor in that the majority of these hours are given by fewer than 1/4 of our Council's population, on average.

It was quite cozy for candidates awaiting the start in our conference room.



# Fifteen New Third Degree Council Members!!

Council 11402 was well-represented at the 3rd Degree Exemplification held at St. Brigid on January 5th. Fifteen of our members made up the contingent of 32 brothers that progressed from 2nd to 3rd degree levels. Several members of the conferring team and of the observers were from our council as well. This strong support level was not lost on the state officers, including State Deputy Dan Baker, who participated. Since this was the first-ever 3rd degree held without a 2nd degree preceding, there was some concern that a low turnout of 2nd degree candidates would ensure a low turnout of 3rd degree candidates a week later. The above solved that problem.

# Passed and Pending Council Benevolence Actions

At the January meeting, Deputy Grand Knight Lou Hlad requested a vote on the positive recommendations of the **Charity Review Committee** regarding two new requests that were submitted to the council during the December meeting.

**Request #1:** Brother Mike Will had submitted a request for up to **\$3,100** to finish the ceiling of the Sullivan Center off Peachtree Road. Sister Marie Sullivan OP, who runs the Center, requested our help in making the main room more habitable. It seems that the ceiling had never been closed and the electrical work is unfinished. The Center was unsightly and somewhat dangerous as a result. The amount requested would complete the unfinished installation. Our Habitat for Humanity expertise would be beneficial in managing it to proper completion. The request was approved by the Council with one dissenting vote. Our crew prepped the area and the ceiling was finished by outside contractors. (See article below.)

**Request #2:** Brother Mark Moots had requested funds to support the Parish Jamaica Trip scheduled in February. He had detailed a need for \$250 for excess baggage weight fees and \$400 for an airline ticket for a female parishioner without means. The total request for **\$650** was passed by the Council in January with one dissenting vote.

Two new requests were received in January and they will be reported out of committee at the February business meeting.

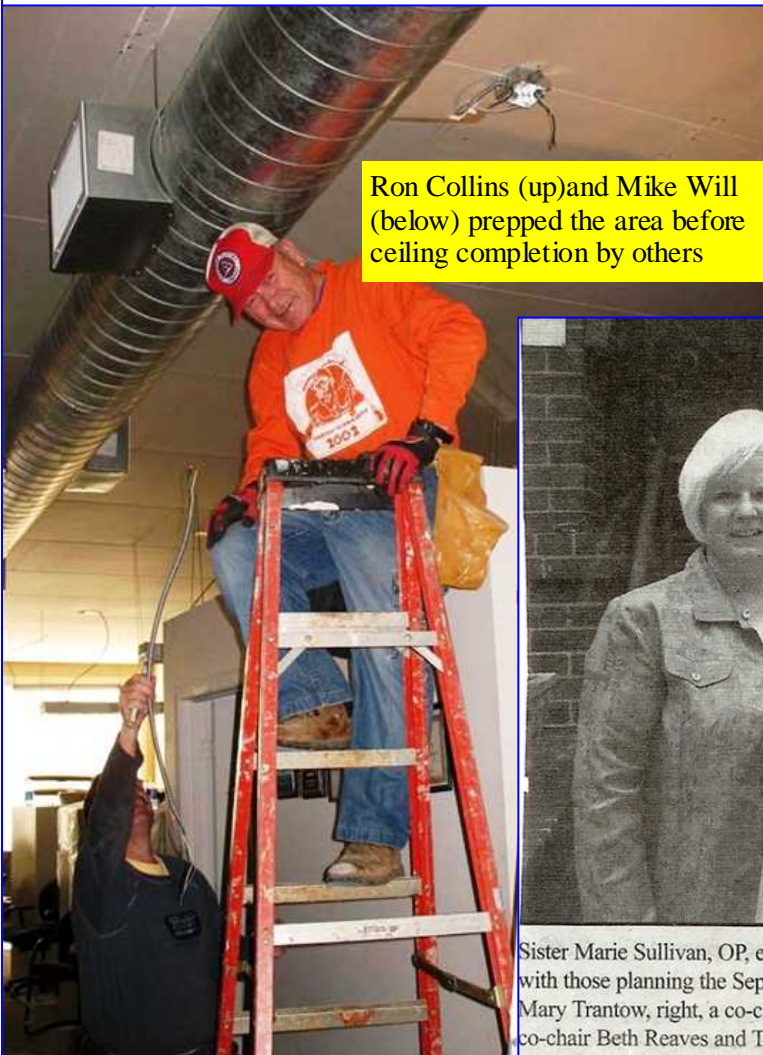
## Council Crew Oversees Sullivan Center Improvements

All Saints Parish is invaluable in helping Sister Marie Sullivan operate her impressive Sullivan Center ([www.thesullivancenter.org](http://www.thesullivancenter.org)).

The Sullivan Center, Inc. is a nonprofit organization whose Mission is to provide help with dignity to families and individuals in crisis. In addition to providing direct financial aid, they empower people to help themselves through financial planning, nutrition classes and employment counseling. Their primary Goal is to prevent individuals from becoming homeless by providing help with rent, mortgage or a utility bill. They are also advocates of hunger prevention. Dedicated volunteers operate their Food Pantry daily. MARTA assistance is provided for job seekers with confirmed interviews or recently-employed persons participating in their financial assistance program. Sister Sullivan has been working in the Atlanta community since 1983 to empower those in crisis to emerge with dignity.

The University of Georgia and All Saints Parish run a youth camp for the Center in partnership. Recently Dick Williams, *Dunwoody Crier* editor and member of the All Saints Choir, hosted a gala for the Center on September 22nd, 2007.

Now the All Saints Council has thrown its weight into repairs and other improvements at the Center by overseeing the preparations for finishing ceiling areas that had been requiring completion for years. Our Habitat work crew experience has certainly come in handy at the Sullivan Center.

## Upcoming 1st/2nd/3rd Degrees

February will give candidates and brothers a chance to join the Order or advance to higher degrees. There are 1st, 2nd, and 3rd degree exemplifications planned at various venues in the area.

The next 1st degree exemplification will be held at McGivney Hall on February 26th at 7:30 PM (6:30 candidates). We invariably induct brothers for other councils as well, because not all councils have certified degree teams yet.

The next 2nd degree will be held on Sunday, February 17th, in the All Saints Gym (candidates 2:30 PM, degree 3 PM.) This is a rare Sunday event that is being tried to test the popularity of an exemplification held on this day. There will be no charge.

The next 3rd degree exemplification will be held on February 23rd and hosted by St. Monica Council #12883 at Notre Dame Academy, which is just off Peachtree Industrial Blvd. at 4635 River Green Parkway, Duluth, GA 30096. Candidates must arrive by 9 AM with jacket, tie, rosary, and valid 2008 membership card. Candidates will pay \$10 for lunch and all observers will pay \$5.

The working title comes from St. Paul's letter to the Romans, in which he wrote: "For in hope we have been saved." The encyclical is said to explore the Christian understanding of hope, with reference to modern philosophy and the challenges of disbelief.

The pope worked on the encyclical this summer, when he had time to write during his sojourns in northern Italy and at his villa outside Rome. At the same time, he was already working on a third encyclical that deals with social themes, the Vatican officials said.

The pope published his first encyclical in late 2006. Titled "**Deus Caritas Est**" ("God Is Love"), it called for a deeper understanding of love as a gift from God to be shared in a self-sacrificial way.

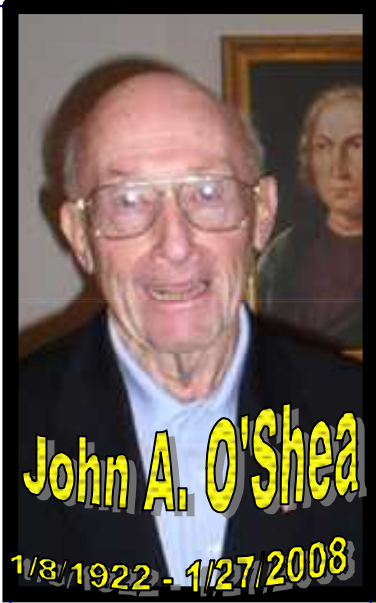

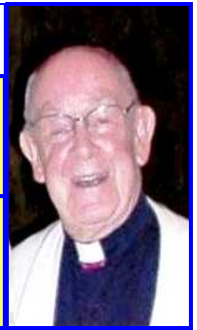
