Grand Knight's Report

Worthy Brothers:

The spiritual philosopher David Spangler writes this about the New Year:

"New Year's is that time when we look back in retrospection and evaluation of where we have been and forward in hope and anticipation of where we may be going. This two-fold vision is reflected in the name of the new month, January, for Janus was a two-faced god, the god of portals and thresholds, of coming in and going out, of past and future held simultaneously in a single, encompassing perspective.

At New Year's we celebrate the sense that we can ... touch a creative and visionary source within us, and shape the world afresh. ... It only takes a shift of perspective to realize that this moment, as the old saying goes, is the beginning of the rest of our lives."

If you've been watching, maybe you have gotten the sense that Council 11402 has set out on several new beginnings, and has headed off in several new directions. Sometimes these changes are wonderfully rewarding, sometimes they are extremely disruptive, but at all times they move us forward in a direction toward greater charity, fraternity, and unity.

It's only one man's opinion, but here are some of the events in 2007 that I am most proud of our Council for considering and doing.

Fish Fry 2007: At the same time, the best and the worst of our 11 fish fry events. We broke new records in attendance, we served exciting new entrees, we really grew the sense of

community within our parish and in the greater community that surrounds us. We also strained the bonds of fraternity on several occasions, a sad situation that cannot be allowed to happen again.

Free Throw Competition: We set new attendance records, and one of our champions made it through the District and won the State Finals in Macon!

Lenten Day of Reflection: Fr. James Behrens, OSCS from the Monastery of the Holy Spirit led us through a preparation for Easter. This was the 4th event in our rejuvenated spiritual development program. Our Summer weekend retreat also was a success, with Deacon Alfred Mitchell of the Archdiocese and Msgr. Joe Corbett in attendance. We still have a long way to go toward reaching our goal of 100 participants, but these initial steps are encouraging!

Hospitality: This year we instituted a "Hospitality Committee" under the leadership of Deacon Ray Egan to more consistently and diligently minister to our Brothers and their families who are "sick and in distress." We also placed a "Prayer Request" board in McGivney Hall to keep the names of our sick in our presence at our meetings.

Charity: We started out more slowly than expected, but by mid-year our Charitable Giving Program was in full swing. Several local charities (including some that were new to our Council) received support. These charities covered a wide-range of services, from pregnancy counseling, persons with intellectual disabilities assistance, the

Interfaith Outreach Home, and many others. I am especially gratified that several of our efforts involved more than just the giving of money—much of our contribution was in the form of labor and assistance that could not be arranged in any other way by these organizations. Our volunteers repaired and renewed the Elaine Clark Center and repainted the “People Making Progress” offices. Our notion of “Knights in Action” became a reality in a very meaningful way.

For the 1st time ever, Council 11402 entered the “*Salute to Dunwoody 4th of July Parade*.” It was a lot of fun, and our “Santa Maria” float won first prize in one category with a small cash award!!!

Our Church Director continues to develop monthly “Wear Your Badge” Sundays, and our quarterly Eucharistic Council Recognitions serve as a sign of Fraternity and Unity within our Council. More importantly, our visible presence as Knights are both reminders and welcomes to the men in our parish to come join us.

We hosted a recognition of all our Past Grand Knights (long overdue), and included Silver and Gold anniversary couples and Father Dan McCormick’s 50th priestly anniversary in the celebration last July.

We served many fine dinner/cookouts for several parish functions including the Pre-School, the Youth Group, the crèche lighting, the Emory Catholic Center, and Habitat for Humanity.

Our acolyte teams again served on the altar for all funeral Masses and special occasions around fifty times. Our 4th degree Sir Knights provided dozens of honor guards to lend special meaning to ceremonials.

After a few years absence, our Annual Tootsie Roll fund raiser was brought back with great success!! And we sold thousands of dollars of fudge, fruit cakes, and coffee to raise money for support of the Conyers monks.

Our Veteran’s Appreciation Day picnic set a new standard for excellence, one we’ll be hard-put to top for many years to come. We again teamed with All Saints Boy Scout Troop 434 for a flag retirement ceremony.

Our “*Keep Christ in Christmas*” campaign won first prize in the state among all participating councils.

We provided friends, companions, and mentors to homeless men in community shelters again last year.

Our Council reached out in the spirit of our motto “*In Service to One, In Service to All*” and raised sufficient funds to purchase a new vehicle equipped for handicapped accessibility for one of our Brother Knights.

Of course, there are many, many more events and acts of charity in which Council 11402 and its members participated in 2007. Our brothers are ushers, lectors, song leaders, choir members, blood donors, and community leaders. I’m hard pressed to remember all they do. But their acts all have one thing in common:

They were acts of generous Brothers who fulfilled the admonishment of *Matthew 25: 37-40*:

*“Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink?
When did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you?
When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you?”*

*And the king will say to them in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did
for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me.' “*

Passed and Pending Council Benevolence Actions

At the December meeting, Deputy Grand Knight Lou Hlad reported the recommendations of the **Charity Review Committee** regarding three new requests submitted to the council during the previous month.

Request #1: Brother Mike Will submitted a request for **\$3,100** to finish the ceiling of the Sullivan Center on Peachtree Road. Sister Sullivan, who runs the Center, requested our help in making the main room more habitable. It seems that the ceiling has never been closed and the insulation is exposed and falling. The Center is unsightly and somewhat dangerous as a result. The amount requested would complete the unfinished installation. Our Habitat for Humanity expertise would be beneficial in managing it to proper completion. The request was recommended for full Council January vote.

Request #2: Brother Mark Moots requested funds to support the Parish Jamaica Trip scheduled in February. He detailed a need for \$250 for excess baggage weight fees and \$400 for an airline ticket for a female parishioner without means. The total request for **\$650** was recommended for consideration by full Council January vote.

Request #3: Brother Bob Mitchell requested **\$4,000** for purchase of new sound system equipment for the All Saints Contemporary Ensemble. The equipment is approximately 8 years old and includes microphones, mixing consoles, cables, and stands. The Committee felt this was the responsibility of the Parish under their annual music budget and should be referred back to the Pastoral Board. Grand Knight Crnkovich did report this issue back to the Board. The request was not recommended for further Council consideration at this time.

“Wheels for Matt” Project: Crnkovich astounded the Council by relaying the fact that the project to raise \$40,000 from the community for a handicapped-equipped van for Brother Matt Dewhurst had reached its goal in less than three weeks. A presentation event for December 16th was scheduled with full Honor Guard ceremonials. Pictures below.

Brother Seggerson Regales December Men's Club

John Seggerson is a 3rd degree brother and fellow parishioner who spent 39 years as an employee and 5 years as a consultant with the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). He was not a doctor or a scientist, but a manager.

When John graduated from St. John's College in Rensselaer, Indiana, he was interviewed by the CDC for his excellent academics. He was the oldest of 9 siblings and grew up poor, so accepting this job seemed the best way to start making money.

He was assigned to start working on the South side of Chicago as part of a venereal disease (VD) task force. He worked nights going to bars to trace the spread of VD from prostitutes and clients. He interviewed people who had syphilis and tried to educate people on how to avoid sexual diseases.

He met with tough characters, vicious dogs, and mafia characters. He later became the Cook County VD Program Director. As he likes to say, "*he was responsible for all the VD in the Mid-Atlantic states.*"

John was later sent to Philadelphia to work on tuberculosis (TB). While there he was one of the CDC persons who worked on the infectious disease outbreak in 1976 that became known as

"Legionnaires Disease." The Bellevue Stratford Hotel, where the outbreak started, was exceptionally clean, but was forced to close because of bad publicity. The actual cause of the outbreak was never found.

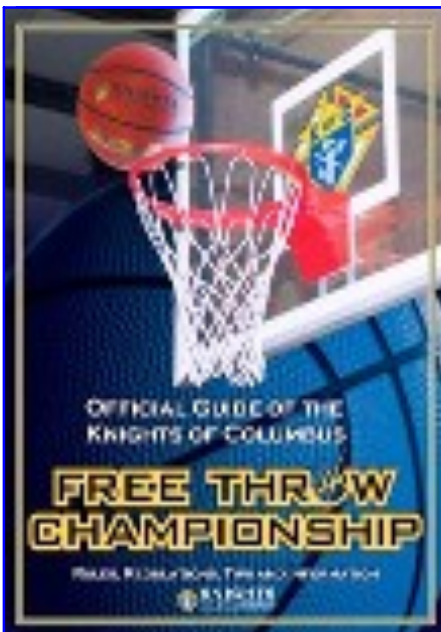
He eventually was sent to Atlanta to continue work on tuberculosis. In the early 80's, there was an increase in the incidence of TB in NYC and Florida. The people involved were intravenous drug users that also had a high incidence of AIDS. In Africa much of the population is infected with TB. The TB in Africa and Asia is related to AIDS. John remains an expert on TB, and happily the CDC has developed a new test for TB.

The CDC came to Atlanta during WWII to work on the eradication of Malaria for our troops and allies. There are now 8,000 dedicated employees on 9 different Atlanta campuses.
