Grand Knight's Report

My Brothers,

I am humbled by your confidence in choosing me as your ninth Grand Knight at the start of this, our fifteenth, Fraternal Year.

Having tried on Greg Crnkovich's 11 1/2 EEEE shoes, I found they were awfully big on me. I'm afraid it's going to take some time to grow into them. It certainly helps that you have chosen a powerful slate of officers to surround me. Many are familiar faces back for another fruitful term.

The picture I have chosen shows me in the social uniform of the Fourth Degree. I hope that this proud group grows in significant numbers and fulfills its destiny as the highly visible arm of the Catholic Church.

I have chosen these simple goals to guide my first term:

- To increase membership toward 300 brothers. Why? Because the very best councils are that large and I love even numbers. We stand at about 250 now.
- To grow our 4th Degree to 100 members with at least 30 Honor Guard participants. We stand at 76 members and 15 swordsmen.
- To increase our charitable contributions by 25%. Strangely enough, we seem to have a difficult time giving enough money away. With readily-available **Charity Request Forms** in the Hall, you need only ask and you will receive (if you write a half-convincing case).
- To greatly increase participation in our unique acolyte teams. *A Knight's place is on the altar.* We could use another twenty new faces there.

- To raise the profile of the Council even higher in the consciousness of influential people. I continue to send our newsletters to more and more heads of various parish ministries and outsiders. You can't have too much publicity.
- To increase support for two targeted charities of the Georgia State K of C organization — Southern Catholic College and the Wheelchair Foundation. We did well on the Intellectual Disabilities (alias Tootsie Roll) Drive and our vocations support for two seminarians. There is no limit on the number of seminarians a Council can support. Let's go for four this year.
- To support our own Father Charles J. Watters Assembly #2688 more strongly. This fine organization of 4th degree members from several local councils always needs more financial and moral support. It is a separate organization, but we are all Knights and 76 of our finest belong.
- To obtain a couple of big-ticket capital items like our own portable barbecue cooker with a trailer hitch and storage cabinetry for our back office room.
- To regularly continue our double-star council status. We stand again on the cusp of that prized recognition, thanks to the outgoing administration.
- To continue and even increase our support for the Monastery of Our Lady of the Holy Spirit in Conyers. We should adopt a convent or a community of nuns as well.
- To support our All Saints Scout Troop 434 more closely. They do share the same building.
- To double the number of Keep Christ in Christmas cards and ornaments we sell each year.
- And I want to lose 25 pounds. This is the most difficult goal of all with all our great cookouts and receptions and post-event pizza.

Meet our New Deputy Grand Knight



Dennis Caniglia was born in Council Bluffs, Iowa, and attended Omaha University (now the University of Nebraska-Omaha) where he played football prior to a career-ending knee injury. His father, Al F. Caniglia, was their legendary coach from 1964 until his death after a heart attack in 1974. The stadium is named after his father.

Dennis also worked for one year (1971-1972) as Communication Coordinator for U.S. Congressman John Y. McCollister, while still in Nebraska. He served in the U.S. Army and the Nebraska National Guard for 14 years, attaining the rank of Captain.

He went to work for St. Paul Insurance Company, following College in 1966 as a Claim Representative Trainee. He worked for St. Paul Companies for 33 years in various positions prior to retiring in 1999 as National Director of Major Litigation.

Dennis is now a mediator at *Henning Mediation & Arbitration Services*, and has his own consulting company, *Caniglia Litigation Consulting*. His primary focus is always resolving differences between parties rather than going through the litigation process.

He is the Mentor Project Coordinator between the Piedmont Hospital Transplant Service and the Georgia Transplant Foundation. He is also a Special Deputy Sheriff and advisor to DeKalb County Sheriff Thomas Brown.

In January of this year, he was named President of the **National Football Foundation/College Hall of Fame, Greater Atlanta Chapter**. This past year the Greater Atlanta Chapter gave out 47 scholarships to high school seniors in conjunction with the *Chick-Fil-A Bowl Game* held at the Georgia Dome.

Dennis became a member of All Saints Church in 2005 and then a Knight primarily because of his long time relationship with Monsignor Kiernan. He was married to Linda who passed away 4 years ago.

His hobby this year was coordinating the Fish Fry along with Tom Simon. He gives the Brothers the bulk of the credit.

Passed and Pending Council Benevolence Actions

At the June Council Business Meeting, Acting Deputy Grand Knight Frank Callan reported on two charity requests to the council. The first exceeded \$500 and had been reviewed by the **Charity Review Committee** which had then released it to the membership for consideration. A one-month consideration period must precede the vote.

Request 1: Sir Knight Gene Gannon has become involved with a new charity to this area called *Sentinels of Freedom* that provides wounded service personnel help in re-entering civilian life. Training, housing, and other encouragements are provided. Their web site is www.sentinelsoffreedom.com. The Committee recommended a gift of **\$1,000**. A final vote will be taken at the July meeting after discussion.

Request 2: Sir Knight Callan then announced the late reception of a request from the All Saints Vacation Bible School (VBS) from Director Hope Long via Andy and Peg Diaz for consideration of a three-day-rental of an inflatable jumping chamber for older children who have nothing to do while the younger children play. The request was for \$500 and an amount of this size could be voted from the floor at a meeting.

Discussion followed regarding responsibility for budgeting such items and quickly moved to injury liability and insurance protection. It was decided that insurance policies were in place for both the church and the knights, but any request granted would be granted to the VBS as a gift for no specific use designated. The motion carried in the amount of **\$500** with no nays and 7 abstentions.

Request 3: Sir Knight Bob Heald made an impassioned plea to support the troops in Iraq by underwriting the shipping of golf balls that have been donated and are very much in demand there. A donation of **\$200** was voted. See story next page.

Other Benevolence: Youth chairman, Mark Moots, coordinated a barbeque cookout for the parish high school graduates and their parents in the Social Hall. Many thanks to Guy Stryker for the donation of the barbeque.

Deacon Ray Egan led another team of volunteers Brothers and Diaconate candidates to the overgrown Catholic Cemetery in Sparta, Georgia for a second round of chopping brush and beautification. A third round will take place in the Fall.

March With the Saints

Your *All Saints Knights of Columbus* have reserved a position in the Dunwoody Fourth of July Parade again this year. This year's theme is "March with the Saints."

All parishioners 10-years-of-age and older are invited to march with our Knight Families behind the All Saints banner and the K of C banner in a display of patriotic unity. Rather than enduring the laborious tasks of building and then demolishing a float, we have opted to enlist an impressive array of All Saints parishioners to march with us in similar attire waving flags under Knight leadership.

We are working to provide music for the marchers, a pace car, and trailing golf carts with ice water. Candy will be handed out by the trailing vehicles, but not the marchers who need to keep at least some semblance of marching structure.

Shown here is an example of the dress code required to participate — a white shirt (T-shirt or button-up) and a pair of dark shorts (navy blue or black) to give our marchers a unified team look. A hat, sun glasses, some comfortable walking shoes, and sun screen are highly recommended as well.

The parade starts at 9:30 AM in the Mt. Vernon Shopping Center lot across from All Saints. It ends at Dunwoody Village and the distance is well over a mile. Arrive by 9 AM to help us line up our marchers by height and provide flags for waving. Cold water will be provided by the Knights as well. ***It will be the responsibility of marchers to provide transportation from the parade end point.***

Let's show the new City of Dunwoody how unified and patriotic their All Saints Church Community can be. (Note that those are two of the four Knight degree themes.)

Please pre-register all marchers with louhlad@bellsouth.net or 770-394-6327, so that we can plan for flags and water. Let us know the number of marchers and please confirm that they are about ten-years-old minimum and can walk the distance without a problem.

Religious Golfing Retreat—August 2/3!



Retreat Master: Fr. Martin (Marty) Kopchik, MSFS

Deacon Ray Egan has coordinated a contract with *Southern Catholic College* of Dawsonville, GA to hold a weekend retreat there on **Aug 2-3**, and then switch gears to play Sunday golf on adjacent Gold Creek Course. Rates are better rate than at Simpsonwood last year.

Our retreat master, Fr. Marty Kopchik, was appointed Associate Pastor of St. Jude in June of 2004. Ordained in May of 1986, he has served in the Archdiocese since 1987, serving in St. Patrick's (1988-1989, 1995-2001) and St. Lawrence (1989-1994) at various times. This constitutes 20 years of service. He is now the Chaplain of the *North Metro Serra Club*.

He was born on February 16, 1949 in Gary, Indiana and raised in a Byzantine Rite Catholic Church which sang the mass in chants of Old Slavonic. After attending Catholic grade school at his home parish and a Catholic High School run by the Basilians, Fr. Marty went to Indiana University and Purdue University.

Before religious life, Fr. Marty was a computer programmer for Simmons Corporation in Munster, Indiana. He was transferred to Atlanta where they centralized their Data Processing System in the Central Office in 1975. Having no family or friends in Atlanta, Fr. Marty soon got involved in his extended family, St. Patrick Catholic Church in Norcross, Georgia. There were no Byzantine Catholic Churches at the time in Atlanta. St. Patrick was staffed at the time by the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales (MSFS) who encouraged him to become a priest in their order.

Fr. Marty was sent to Washington, DC, where he received a BA in Philosophy from Oblate College in 1982 and an MA in Theology at Catholic University of America 1985. He received a License in Sacred Scripture at Catholic University of America in 1987. He spent a year in Spain studying the Spanish Mystics (2002) and on vacation in Spain walked the famous 80-mile Camino of Sandiago de Compostela Trail. Fr. Marty was the Vocation Director for the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales for a year (2003) before he was assigned as Associate Pastor of St. Jude (2004-present).

Pricing: The cost of single room is \$115 and double occupancy is \$80. Because there is no room service staff during the summer, participants must bring their own pillow, towels, and bed sheets.

Golf: This year we have arranged a special rate of \$35/per for 18 holes at Gold Creek Golf Course (on land just adjacent to the College). **The \$35 fee includes the cart!!!!** We have 4-foursomes reserved (more, possible) for tee times beginning on Sunday at roughly 4 PM. The retreat starts on Saturday, single or double occupancy rooms are available for that night. We anticipate the Sunday retreat/lunch/Mass portion being finished about 2:30-3:00 PM, leaving an hour to get ready for golf.

Acolytes – Never Too Old to be Altar Boys



If you thought the average age of an altar server was about nine years old, any time you attend a funeral at All Saints Church your estimate could easily be fifty years too low. All funerals in our parish are served by *Knights of Columbus* acolyte teams, per the strong preference of our pastor and Council Chaplain, Monsignor Kiernan. Other pastors look on in extreme admiration at this large pool of men that All Saints utilizes who are devoted to this very unique ministry.

As *Acolyte Program Director*, Sir Knight David Moeller serves as “minister” of the acolytes. He advises, cajoles, outfits, recruits, and schedules 50 other volunteer Brothers to serve funeral masses (which, of course, can not be planned far in advance). Usually, a full complement of five or six available Knight acolytes must be assembled for each funeral in a couple of days.

Working with Moeller are four team captains — Brothers Norbert Braza, Guy Stryker, Alfred Garofalo, and Gert Kampfer. Each has a group of prospective acolyte volunteers that form his “team.” A fifth standby group of Saturday or part-time alternates is available. Church staffers contact Moeller when a funeral is scheduled. He keeps a log of all funerals and calls the next captain in rotation, who in turn calls his own team members. Captains have the complete acolyte roster in case they have to substitute using someone from another team.

Acolytes have a special “uniform” that consists of medium grey slacks, a white shirt, a blue blazer, and that special blue Knights of Columbus logo tie. It is this stately appearance of a squad of mature men on the altar that gives All Saints’ funerals such a unique and noble stamp. Acolyte volunteers tend to be older because most funerals are held during working hours, and being retired enhances general availability. Some special training is required, especially for altar setup, processional etiquette, incense ceremony, and general synchronization of team movement.

Since many of the people who attend our funerals are non-Catholics or members of other parishes, the Knights leave an indelible impression on all who witness their reverent ceremonials. If the deceased happened to be a Knight or one of his direct family members, it is common for a Knight Honor Guard to also participate along with their Brother acolytes.

Any Knight may participate in this wonderful All Saints acolyte ministry. The pay is modest— a handsome blue silk tie with the repeating K of C logo pattern. It is a very special privilege and a sacred honor that our Brotherhood has been singularly requested by their clergy to serve Church and community “*ad altare Dei*” — “*from the altar of God.*”

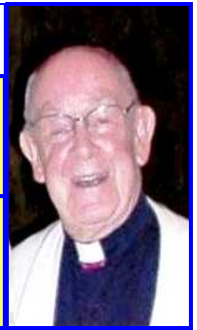
