## Grand Knight's Report

Worthy brothers,

And, into the home stretch they come.....

We'll soon be entering the final quarter of the fraternal year. We are very fortunate that our major council effort, the Lenten Fish Fry program, usually wraps up at the end of the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter and signals the time for preparing for the next year's activities.

This final quarter is one last opportunity to meet the goals and objectives we set for ourselves as a Council in the beginning of the fraternal year, and it's also the time to prepare for the orderly transition of Officers for the next fraternal year. I'd like to outline four items that are on my "to do" list as Grand Knight in addition to the normal activities of the Council.

My first responsibility is to select a nominating committee to develop a slate of candidates for next year's Officers and Trustees. The nominating committee can play a significant role in the direction that our Council takes next fraternal year through their selection and recommendation of candidates. I'll be making committee selections over the next few weeks, since the committee must begin meeting after the fish fry and their assignment completed by May 1.

There are two fundraising activities that I would certainly like our Council to undertake and execute in the remaining few months of this year. The first is a fund-raiser in support of *Southern Catholic College*. The second is a fund raiser to support the *Knights Wheelchair Program*.

You may be aware that the Knights of Columbus in Georgia are trying to endow a scholarship fund to Southern Catholic. To this end, the State Council has asked that every Council donate \$2 per member to this cause. In addition, the State Council asks local Councils to run separate fund-raising events on behalf of Southern Catholic.

Our own Council was among the first in the State to respond to the \$2/member pledge request. I'm hopeful that All Saints Council will come up with an interesting and profitable event to support this worthy cause.

For some time, we've been looking for a way to support the Wheelchair Foundation in their efforts to provide free wheelchairs for people who are in desperate need. The Supreme Council of the K of C is offering a \$1 for \$1 match for funds to any Council who raises money for this cause. In addition, the State Council has set a target of raising \$48,000 (the cost of one freight-car shipment of chairs) from all the Councils in Georgia.

We also want to continue the tradition of an entry in the Dunwoody Salutes America 4<sup>th</sup> of July parade. We'll be looking for ideas and a work committee shortly after the 1<sup>st</sup> of May. Only a few Brothers participated last year, and the rest of you missed out on a good deal of fun. I know you'll want to join in this year!

I'm hopeful that our Council will respond, as it usually does, with a great deal of enthusiasm and support to these activities. It's been a memorable year, and we still have the opportunity to make it an exceptional one.

## Calvary

Jesus Christ, 33, of Nazareth, died Friday on Mount Calvary, also known as Goigotha, the place of the skull. Betrayed by the apostle Judas, Jesus was crucified by the Romans, by order of the Ruler Pontius Pilate. The causes of death were crucifixion, extreme exhaustion, severe torture, and loss of blood.



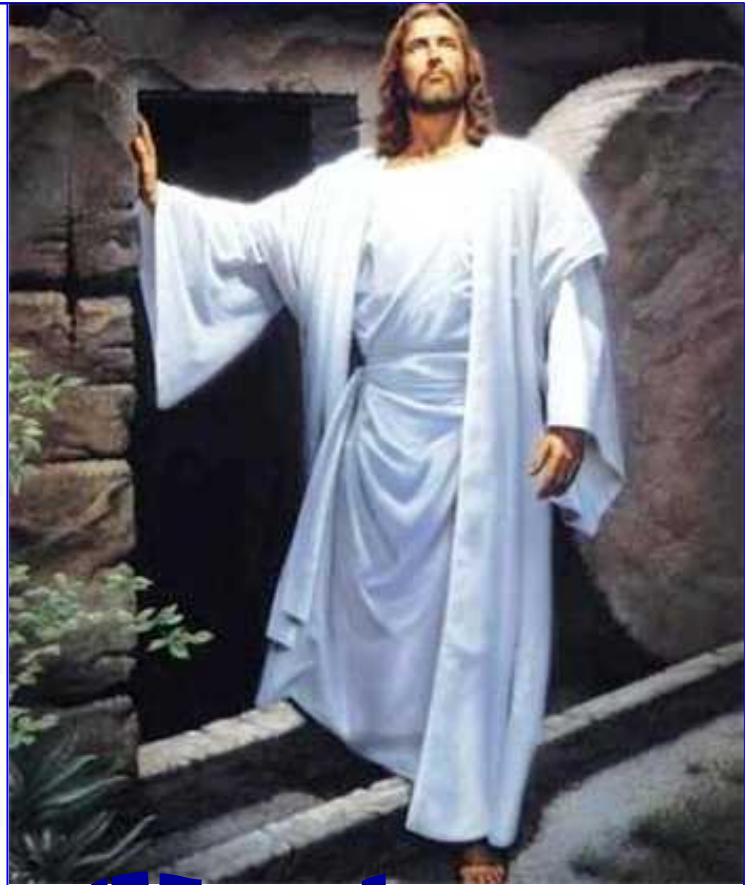
Jesus Christ, a descendant of Abraham, was a member of the house of David. He was the Son of the late Joseph, a carpenter of Nazareth, and Mary, His devoted Mother. Jesus was born in a stable in the city of Bethlehem, Judea. He is survived by His mother Mary, His faithful Apostles, numerous disciples, and many other followers.

Jesus was self educated and spent most of his adult life working as a Teacher. Jesus also occasionally worked as a Medical Doctor and it is reported that he healed many patients. Up until the time of His death, Jesus was teaching and sharing the Good News, healing the sick, touching the lonely, feeding the hungry, and helping the poor.

Jesus was most noted for telling parables about His Father's Kingdom and performing miracles, such as feeding over 5,000 people with only five loaves of bread and two fish, and healing a man who was born blind. On the day before His death, He held a Last Supper celebrating the Passover Feast, at which He foretold His death.

The body was quickly buried in a stone grave, which was donated by Joseph of Arimathea, a loyal friend of the family. By order of Pontius Pilate, a boulder was rolled in front of the tomb. Roman soldiers were put on guard.

In lieu of flowers, the family has requested that everyone try to live as Jesus did. Donations may be sent to anyone in need.

What does "Vivat Jesus!" mean?

You have seen these two words many times at the end of correspondence written by Brother Knights. Like what often happens with prayers, we tend to say or use words without thinking of their meaning or without understanding their meaning.

# Passed and Pending Council Benevolence Actions

At the February meeting, Deputy Grand Knight Lou Hlad requested continuance on the deliberation regarding three new donation recommendations to the **Charity Review Committee**. The combined amounts were large enough to require more thoughtful deliberation. These new requests were received in January and they will be reported out of committee at the March business meeting.

**Past Request:** Brother Mike Will had submitted a request for up to **\$3,100** to finish the ceilings of the Sullivan Center off Peachtree Road. Sister Marie Sullivan OP, who runs the Center, requested our help in making the main room more safe and attractive. Our Habitat crew prepped the ceiling and completed some electrical work. We paid for professionals to finish closing the high ceilings. It turned out that the project cost the Council only **\$1,650** rather than \$3,100.

**Equipment Request:** Urgent need for a new \$500 pot warming stove in the Activities Building kitchen was reported for use during the fish fries. The issue was moved, seconded, and unanimously approved by the Council during the meeting. Because the amount was only \$500, it could be acted upon immediately after approval. The stove is already in use and the final cost was just under \$500. We also voted up to \$500 for social hall electrical improvements and these were approved.

## Wanted: Additional Acolytes for Funerals and Events



You may not be aware that every funeral Mass and several other special occasion Masses at All Saints are served by our six-man acolyte teams rather than normal altar servers. It is Monsignor Kiernan's wish that these extraordinary occasions be given a special reverence that mature men in matching dress suits can lend.

We are looking to expand our three teams of ten men to include new faces that can serve in this wonderful ministry. Many of the funerals occur during normal working hours, and that means that retired members are the most common acolytes. However, there are Saturday funerals, special Sunday events, and also evening services that enable working brothers to take their places on the altar of God as well.

All you need to participate is a dark blue blazer, medium grey dress slacks, a white shirt and black shoes. The Council supplies a special \$25 KofC tie that completes the outfit. Your name will be entered into the pool of men that can be drawn upon for events as they occur. Your limited availability to weekends and evenings will be noted if you still work.

## Wanted: Music Men and Degree Team Members

First, second, and third degree exemplifications require a dedicated team of individuals to create the dignified ceremonials that enroll, educate, and inspire brothers on their journeys to full and meaningful knighthood. Each degree has a specific program that changes only occasionally over the years and is re-enacted each time the same way in every country where there are Knights of Columbus. Each role in the program has a script which must be memorized and recited verbatim.

These teams are in some ways like traveling troupes of actors that venture from place to place like vagabond performers—except there is no pay and it is done for the love of the Order. In short, it is a **ministry** of the highest kind.

Because Council 11402 has always furnished a strong core of 1st, 2nd, and 3rd degree team members, we are asking for an additional group of brothers to become permanent or semi-permanent members of these teams. We are in need of music men and role players for these ceremonials. If you have a theatrical avocation, please let us know. It is a lot of fun.

**Music Man**—operates the music player and delivers the proper CD track at the prescribed time in the program. Operates one or more light switches to ensure the proper mood. Performs at McGivney Hall or any other venue holding ceremony. Brings props in his vehicle like music equipment, a large cross, banners, cables, and handouts. Must have capable vehicle.

**Degree Team Member**—an actor who is capable of memorizing verbiage for his role—some large and some small—for one or more ceremonials. Travel to various venues on weekends and evenings also required. Contact any Council officer.

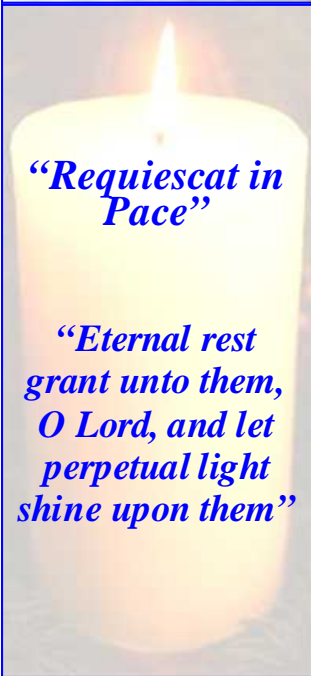
