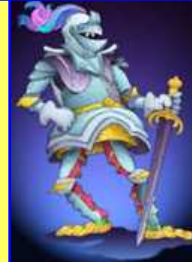

## Our Golf Tournament to Get TV Exposure

Brothers, look for your Council 11402 to receive prominent time on the Fox TV Channel WAGA during the month of October when WAGA runs a public service announcement (PSA) featuring our Council's efforts to raise money for the Georgia Charities Group.

Through the efforts of Brother Matt Filla, WAGA has agreed to run 10-second and 30-second PSAs highlighting the golf tournament for the benefit of the Elaine Clark Center, the St. Joseph Cancer Survivor's Network, Habitat for Humanity, and ICare — all charities that our Council heartily supports.

What's more, two of our Brother Knights, John Jedlicka and Bob Fiscella, will appear on the WAGA Sunday morning news show talking about the tournament. The time and the date of the show will be announced as known.

This is an all-Knight production featuring brothers Matt Filla as executive producer, John Jedlicka and Bob Fiscella as writers and as televised spokesmen, Mary Jedlicka (John's daughter) appearing in one of the PSAs, and Andrew Jedlicka (John's son and Brother Knight) as production editor.

As far as we can tell, this is the first time an individual council has received such media exposure in a top-ten, major television market.

# Sparta Cemetery Work Day—November 8th

In May and July of this year, members of All Saints Council 11402 joined with other Knights and the Deaconate Class of the Archdiocese to begin the reclamation of the long-forgotten Catholic cemetery in Sparta, GA. We postponed working until the Fall because the excessive heat took more out of the crew than we expected. We're happy to say that we're getting ready to go back and to keep working on this project on Saturday, November 8th

You may remember that "*Honoring and Praying for the Dead*" is one of both the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. The Sparta cemetery has been all but abandoned for the last 100 years, and it is our goal to clear the brush, locate what grave markers we can, and leave the cemetery in a condition that routine maintenance can be provided to keep the grounds clear and attractive. We need your help!!!

We are working to obtain the use of a Bobcat and brush hog to do a significant amount of the scrub and kudzu removal, which proved to be so daunting our last time out. We still have several mimosa trees that need to be removed and cut into sections for mulching. We will have a commercial chipper there on site to handle the trees and brush removed from the site.

## Passed and Pending Benevolence Motions

At the October Council Business Meeting, Deputy Grand Knight Dennis Caniglia reported that the Charity Review Committee had approved three requests for further deliberation by the Council at the next business meeting. This committee is headed by the Deputy Grand Knight, and it also includes the five program chairman and the three trustees. Charity Request Forms are available to any brother at the McGivney Hall entry sign-up table.

**Request #1:** Brother Jim Mammoser requested a donation of \$1,000 to the *Dominican Sisters of St. Cecelia*, in Nashville, TN. This group has been featured in our Columbia Magazine as a vibrant community worthy of donations. We have a line item in our current budget for female vocations and this would serve that purpose. It still must be approved by the entire council, since it is over \$500.

**Request #2:** Brother Mario Commito has requested a \$1,000 donation to the charity *People Making Progress* in Tucker. This group serves youths with intellectual disabilities at ages older than the Elaine Clark Center does. Mario's daughter has been a beneficiary of this center and he is close to it. Two years ago we painted their offices. It likewise must be approved by the Council, since it is over \$500.

**Request #3:** Grand Knight Lou Hlad forwarded a request we received from a Peter Tooher, a parishioner who will be acting as a missionary volunteer at the *Farm of the Child* in Trujillo, Colon, Honduras. (see [www.farmofthechild.org](http://www.farmofthechild.org)). We approved a donation of \$250.

**Seminarian Support:** We also approved \$600 stipends for these two seminarians:

1. Mr. Brian H. Baker Mount St. Mary's Seminary Emmitsburg, MD 21727
2. Mr. Adam Blatt St. Joseph Seminary College 6551 North Sheridan Road Chicago, IL 60626
3. We approved a stipend for a third seminarian to be named by Deacon Ray Egan.

**Sullivan Center Food Pantry:** We collected and delivered a large van full of food items for the *Sullivan Center* after an urgent plea by Sister Marie Sullivan. The All Saints Women's Guild alerted us to the problem and also contributed greatly.

## Filla and Williams Become Sir Knights

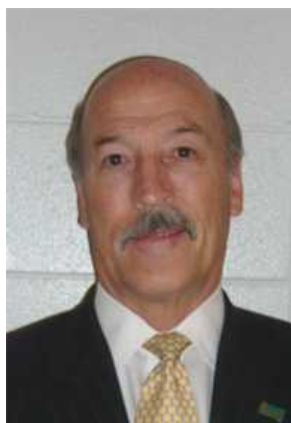
