Grand Knight's Report

My Brothers,
McGivney Hall was a busy place this month, as it was the host site for a 1st Degree, then a 2nd Degree, a Council meeting, Watters Assembly meeting, a Return to School Youth Cookout, a card social, some Golf Tournament planning meetings, and a Hoedown reception area.

The Hoedown resulted in two new transfers and prospective member signings. Every brother that visits from another council, just drools when they first see our McGivney Hall.

By now you have certainly heard that All Saints 11402 has again achieved the very prestigious *Double Star Award* presented to only 500 of 14,000 Councils (3.5%). Thank you all for making this possible.

On Saturday, September 6th, our council will be under the microscope with a huge 3rd degree exemplification held in our own Social Hall. It could possibly break an all-time record for the number of candidates participating. State dignitaries, visiting council officers, and their grand knights will be everywhere. We hope all of our 30 2nd-degreers come. Observers are needed.

September will be a relatively peaceful month with a Tootsie Roll drive on the 27th and 28th as the big council event.

Then October explodes with an Oktoberfest, a 1st degree, Keep Christ in Christmas card sales, a Memorial Mass for our deceased knights, a 4th Degree event, and planning for an Elaine Clark silent auction and a Golf Tournament we will be hosting (see article inside). This is a huge undertaking requiring solid support.

Please keep Monday, November 3rd, open on your calendars for participation in this golf tournament. If you work, think about taking this day as vacation. If you are retired, think about golfing or volunteering to help put it on. Four needy charities stand to make thousands of dollars from this event. The Council is doing this *pro bono* — that's Latin for "we don't make any money, we just work hard."

It's not too early for our 3rd Degree brothers to start preparing for the 4th Degree ceremony on Saturday, October 14th, at the Atlanta Airport Westin Hotel. We have 103 eligible members and it would not be overly optimistic to hope for 10 to 20 new Sir Knights.



These brothers will soon be getting the detailed cost schedules and dress code information prepared by the Master of the Fourth Degree. This event always includes the participation of spouses and family friends that participate in the Mass and formal banquet following it. You can start by ensuring you have the black tuxedo required by the protocol.

If you have children at home, make sure that you plan to attend Sunday evening talk by J. Tom Morgan on September 28th. It focuses on responsibilities of parents to kids and kids to parents.

The speaker is the former District Attorney of DeKalb County and has been asked by our Monsignor Kiernan to address topics that are increasingly relevant to family life in these challenging times. Monsignor would like the Knights to facilitate the evening program and assist the Mr. Morgan as needed. We shall.

Through the efforts of Brother Matt Filla, WAGA has agreed to run 10-second and 30-second PSAs highlighting the golf tournament for the benefit of the Elaine Clark Center, The St. Joseph Cancer Survivor's Network, Habitat for Humanity, and ICare — all charities that our Council heartily supports.

Proposed 2008-2009 Council Budget

Brothers,

Attached is this year's proposed budget for our upcoming fiscal year. Most of the entries are either those used in last year's budget or a slight adjustment based on experience from last year and previous years. Our Financial Secretary, Gert Kampfer, has been doing this for five years and this is his sixth budget. All the officers, trustees, and program chairmen participated in a meeting in which these line items were delivered.

Those of you who took accounting courses will notice that the amount taken in and the amount going out are not equal. This ignores a cardinal rule of accounting. We have done this intentionally. We actually desire to spend more than we take in this year to draw down cash positions.

We have increased the outlay for "capital expenditures" this year. This category includes potential costs for the items that are itemized in the central yellow block. All the items marked in yellow must be voted on and approved at the September business meeting.

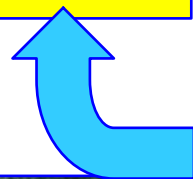
Also increased are unrestricted charity by \$1000 and \$600 support cost for a third seminarian (3 total). Religious women and diaconate costs are also funded. These have appeared on previous budgets.
