Shortal Elected Dunwoody Mayor

As newly elected Dunwoody mayor Denis Shortal looks ahead toward his time in office, he said he is ready to restore open and positive leadership to all residents of the city.

"I want to bring in an attitude that brings mutual respect amongst our leadership and all citizens," Shortal said. "Respect is a two-way street, from the top-down and the bottom up."

The former Dunwoody city councilman and mayor pro-tem won the mayoral election on Nov. 3 with more than 62 percent of the 5,487 total votes cast.

"We knocked on more than 3,500 doors while campaigning," Shortal said. "You get a lot of input when you are going door-to-door."

He said one of the biggest issues that arose from these conversations was paving. Now, one of his first priorities will be to expedite the paving plan using surplus and reallocated funds.

Other items on Shortal's list include protecting residential neighborhoods from big businesses encroaching on them, enhancing parks for use by citizens of all ages, and working toward gaining local control of schools.

For these areas of focus and others, he said it is important that projects be designed to achieve their end result at a reasonable cost

"We have a lot of things on the infrastructure spectrum that need to be done," Shortal said. "If we are going to spend a large amount on one project, other projects will have to wait for their turn."

Shortal said as of now, the city has a four-month operational reserve fund, and said he believes that is important to act as a buffer for the rainy days he feels will inevitably come.

"I am somewhat known for being financially prudent, and we must continue to do that with our taxpayers' dollars to secure the financial stability of our city," Shortal said. "We need a rainy day fund to weather those bad times."

District One City Council member Terry Nall said his hope for Mayor-Elect Shortal is that he continues to build strong ties and relationships which make the city's many projects possible.

"Mayor Davis was very strong in this regard and I hope these efforts continue, if not grow, under Mayor Shortal," Nall said.

Shortal, who often goes by "Denny," has called Dunwoody home for nearly 30 years. He said he and wife Meredy settled here for their three sons to attend school and stayed for the quality of life.

Shortal is a retired Marine Brigadier General with 32 years of service. Today, he is president of the Marine Corps Coordinating Council of Georgia and assists in the effort to help marines and their families in need of assistance.

In his personal time, Shortal is a sports enthusiast who golfs and has both played and coached baseball. He grew up on a farm and still owns one in Missouri, which he enjoys visiting and maintaining.

Know Your Catholic Iconic Abbreviations



Because there is no letter "J" in the Latin alphabet, the name "Jesus" is spelled "Iesus". By the same substitution, the Latin word for the "Jewish Nation" is "Iudaeorum".

Because the Bible states that Pilate had the inscription "Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews" placed above his head, most crucifix depictions show the letters INRI, rather than an equally possible formal Roman document scroll.

In Latin, this is short for: Iesus Nazarenus Rex Iudaeorum Again, remembering that there is no letter "J" in the Latin alphabet, the name of "Jesus" is again spelled "Iesus".

The letter "H" stands for "Hominum" or "mankind". The letter "S" stands for "Salvator" or "savior".

In English, the IHS shown on all manner of Catholic vestments and items, stands for:

Jesus, Savior of Mankind Iesus Hominum Salvator



Is This the True Face of Jesus?



This is a computer-generated image of the "real" Jesus Christ. A forensic expert has recreated the face of Jesus Christ using state-of-the-art science. The resulting face is a far cry from the tall, Caucasian man with light blonde hair that is usually shown in bibles and stained glass windows throughout the world. The features of the "real" Jesus are typical of Middle Eastern Jews in the Galilee area of northern Israel. The striking image was created by Richard Neave, a retired medical artist from the University of Manchester, who used forensic anthropology usually used to solve crimes to build the portrait. As the co-author of <u>Making Faces: Using Forensic and Archaelogical Evidence</u>, Neave has reconstructed dozens of famous faces, including Phillip II of Macedonia, who was the father of Alexander the Great, and King Midas of Phrygia.

He used the fact that before the Crucifixion, Judas Iscariot had to tell the Roman soldiers who Jesus was because they could not tell him apart from his disciples. Neave and his research team were provided with Semite skulls from Israeli archaeologists. They created x-ray "slices" of the skulls and used computers to establish the muscles and skin on a typical Semite skull, reports Esquire. The team also said Jesus would be bearded and have short hair—likely with tight curls—in keeping with Jewish tradition. Using the average build of a Semite male at the time, they theorized Jesus would likely have been just over 5 feet, and since he worked outdoors as a carpenter until he was about 30, they reasoned he would be stronger and more weather-beaten than usually depicted.
