


Fraternal Year Elections Looming in June

Ryan and Susan Malone then presented the custom monogrammed apron used by Doc Malone during our fish frys to the council.


It is hoped that Brother Ryan will make use of it in the future in honor of his father.

April Parish **Bingo**—Another Fabulous Night!!



Our Parish Bingo Accountant, Brother Ralph O'Connor, reported that the April 28th Bingo event had a much larger crowd of 127 players including 3 council widows who play free with the council paying their fee. Join Our Unique Council Acolyte Ministry



For twenty years, our All Saints Council has been providing altar servers for every parish funeral and some special Mass events. Instituted by former pastor Monsignor Kiernan in the late 1990's, he asked the Knights if they could serve funeral Masses in lieu of youngsters who were hard to schedule on school days, weekends, and on short notice for funerals. Our acolyte program with up to seventy participants was the eager response. We haven't missed a funeral since. There are about 50 deaths per year at All Saints. We know of no other council in the world with such a ministry.

Organized into five acolyte teams under five team leaders, we rotate funerals as they occur among the five teams under Acolyte Director, Brother Norb Braza. Each member provides a navy blue blazer, medium grey slacks, white shirt, and black shoes. The council provides a KofC tie to finish the attractive "uniform".

Because some of our acolyte team members have passed or moved away, we would like to add about a dozen new members across the five teams. Training is provided and you should only have to serve about one funeral per month. Being on God's altar is a privilege rather than an obligation. If you were once a young altar server you can appreciate this. If you were never an altar server, you can begin to appreciate the pride of ceremonial participation. Burying the dead is a work of mercy.

A full funeral acolyte team can consist of a cross bearer, two candle bearers, a water and a wine bearer, and an incense bearer. When six knights are not available, a team of four knights is sufficient. People who attend funerals at All Saints are always impressed by the mature solemnity of the men on the altar. Our brother, Bernie Sotola, provides the vocals at these funerals and is yet another participant in a matching uniform.

Fish Fry Volunteer Appreciation Party




As we do every year, the council will hold an appreciation Party for everyone who worked at any of our fish fry events openly or in support of same.

Shown above is the new electronic payment page on our council <u>kc11402.org</u> web site. You go to that web site, choose "Members Enter Here", log in with your last name and membership number (on your member card), choose "2016 Dues Payment", and then get to above screen.

You may then pay your dues (\$41.50 which includes a small electronic processing fee) by using a credit card <u>or</u> your PayPal account which takes that amount directly out of your checking account like a debit card. Your personal PayPal account must be set up independently. A new second web page choice allows you to set up automatic \$41.50 PayPal payments for 5 years.

Of course, you may still pay your <u>unchanged 2016 annual dues</u> of \$40 directly at a meeting or send a \$40 check made out to "KofC Council 11402" to our worthy Treasurer, Dave Riedinger. We could not make it easier to pay your dues. Dues were due January 1st. Happy New Year.

May Tip — Goodbye From Field Agent John Knight

I will be retiring on June 1st. So this is the my last article for the newsletter. I began on the first of April, in 2009. It was exciting to finally work for the Knights, full time. My territory stretched from Roswell to Decatur. In the car on most evenings, I went from one kitchen table to the next, sharing the vision of Fr. McGivney.

Michael McGivney founded this order on two fundamental concepts: To be the strong right arm of the church, and a safety net for Catholic families. In 1882, the Knights rescued families from the ravages of early mortality in the rough neighborhoods of New Haven. For Fr. McGivney it wasn't about Fish Fries and Onion Sales...it was saving widows and orphans from starvation. It was about the future of the faith, in the eyes of the children who would otherwise have become lifetime Protestants in the orphanages established under the Connecticut Anti-Catholic Laws.

The last seven years have been a blessing for me and my family. I have seen Fr. McGivney's hand in certain events. Last year alone, our families purchased over \$21 million in new life coverage within my councils. That's a lot of promises.

Moreover, these last seven years climaxed in sixteen Star Councils – the perfect fusion of fraternal and insurance activity. Along the way, six Agent of the Month awards and two years as the top producer in Georgia. Wow, what a ride!

My thanks to all of you and your families, for supporting our order in the best possible way. You protected yourselves, but how many thousands in charity have your policies also funded?

Kathleen Elizabeth Wolcott Bashor, 59, formerly of Rut-land, Vermont, died unexpect-edly of natural causes in Portland, Oregon, on April 8, 2016, while visiting her grandchil-dren and daughter-in-law. Katie was born on December 4, 1956, in Colorado Springs, Colo-rado, the daughter of George and Elizabeth Wolcott. After graduating from the University



of Vermont in 1978, Katie moved to Atlanta, Georgia, where she met Mark Bashor. The two were married in August of 1983. Mark and Katie had two children: Ryan Bashor, born in October 1984, and Jessie Bashor, born in January 1987.

Katie worked for 18 years as a health and physical education paraprofessional at Fernbank Elementary School in Decatur, Georgia, where she was fondly known as "Coach Bashor." Her enthusiasm and love for education and children were evident in all she did, and her optimistic nurturing demeanor made a positive mark on many children who will benefit greatly from having loved and been loved by Coach Bashor.

Most of all, Katie Bashor will be remembered for her love, devotion and commitment to family, friends and community. She lived her life by example, pouring her heart, soul and family into service for the homeless. With her husband, Mark, together they gave 34 years of service to Central Night Shelter, ending in a 16-year tenure as executive director. Her passion and advocacy to social justice and mercy has inspired and motivated others through works with allied organizations. The gifts and actions of both Katie and Mark have been recognized through countless awards, inspiring others toward work with the homeless.

Survivors include her husband, Mark Bashor, daughter, Jessie Bashor, son-in-law, Cathal Doyle, grandson Liam Doyle, of At-lanta Georgia; daughter-in law, Rachael Bashor, granddaughter, Jocie Bashor, grandson Owen Bashor of Portland, Oregon; her mother, Elizabeth Wolcott of Moscow, Idaho; three sisters, Marnie Wolcott Davis of Shelburne, Vermont, Becky Wolcott Ankeny of Deephaven, Minnesota, Debby (Scott) Wolcott Wetterhall of Atlanta, Georgia; a brother, Michael (Lisa) Wol-cott of Moscow, Idaho; and 8 nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her father, George Wolcott, and her son, Ryan Bashor.

A memorial service celebrating the love Katie shared for her family and friends will be held at the Catholic Shrine of the Immaculate Conception on Saturday, April 23 at 11 a.m. A reception will follow immediately after the service at Central Presbyterian Church, which is adjacent to the Shrine.
