With this being my last Grand Knight's Report, I have been reviewing our activities and accomplishments over the last two years. Looking back, it is amazing to see all that we have accomplished as a council. I owe a huge debt of gratitude to the council as a whole and the Knights who helped to make it all happen.

Our council was able to achieve recognition for its service on several fronts. We continued our lengthy tradition of achieving the prestigious *Star Council Award* annually; marking 11 straight years. In addition, we received the *Champions Award* for achieving the highest increase over our membership quota in the State. We are now over 520 strong.

Lastly, I am extremely proud of our council being awarded the *Community Service Award* in recognition for our Onion Sale expertise. This not only wins our council the State Award of which there is only one, but now we are being judged for the International Community Award by Supreme Council. We continued our tradition of fund raising through our many traditional activities and events.

The Annual Fish Fry continues to grow year over year in sales and profit, as we set new highs in both categories.

As previously mentioned, The Onion Sale was once again a complete success this year. We picked up new councils and will be adding more next year to distribute onions.

We have witnessed the growth and stability of our Bingo Night, as it has become a mainstay event for our fund raising efforts.

The Annual Pumpkin Sale saw a flattening of sales this past year; however, it continues to produce considerable charitable income.

The Annual Fudge Sale continues its success by contributing 100% of the funds raised back to

the Monastery of the Holy Spirit in Conyers.

The annual Tootsie Roll Sale also experienced continued success and growth in 2016.

Our support of youth activities continued high among cub and boy scouts and pre-schoolers.

Since I cannot name and thank all who have gone above and beyond the call of duty to make each and every fundraising event a success, please know that your hard work and tireless efforts are deeply appreciated not only by me, but by the many lives that you have touched.

I now feel comfortable with our Council's ability to carry on its many traditions. While our mission is to attract new members of all ages to keep our Council vibrant and growing, I leave behind several initiatives that should aid in that endeavor.

Through Mugs for Membership, The Concert Series, and the Fast Track to the 3rd Degree Program, I can see our council becoming more attractive and successful in the years to come.

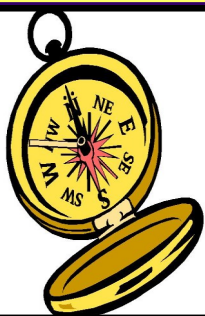

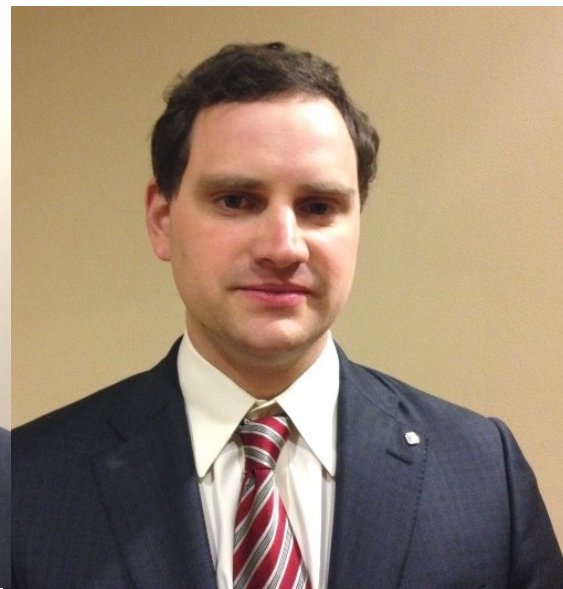

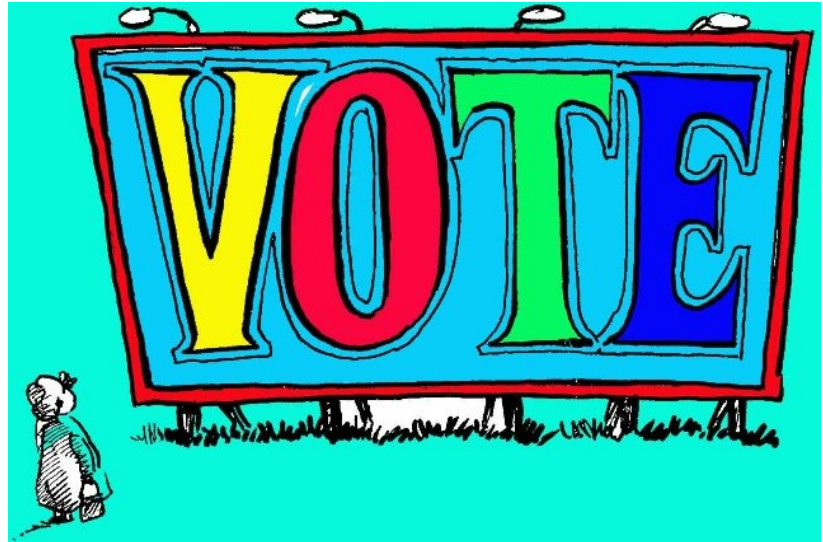

May Parish Bingo—Another Good Night!!



Our Parish Bingo Accountant, Brother Ralph O'Connor, reported that the May 26th Bingo event had a nice crowd of 107 players including 2 council widows who play free with the council paying their fee. Dunwoody Crier coupons brought in 23 players. Bingo sales were \$1,644 with prizes awarded of \$945 yielding gross \$699 (before payments of 7% sales tax and Bingo supplies cost). Profit of 50/50 raffle added \$140. Food donations were \$243 and drink income was \$233 (before the cost of food and drink). The beat goes on.

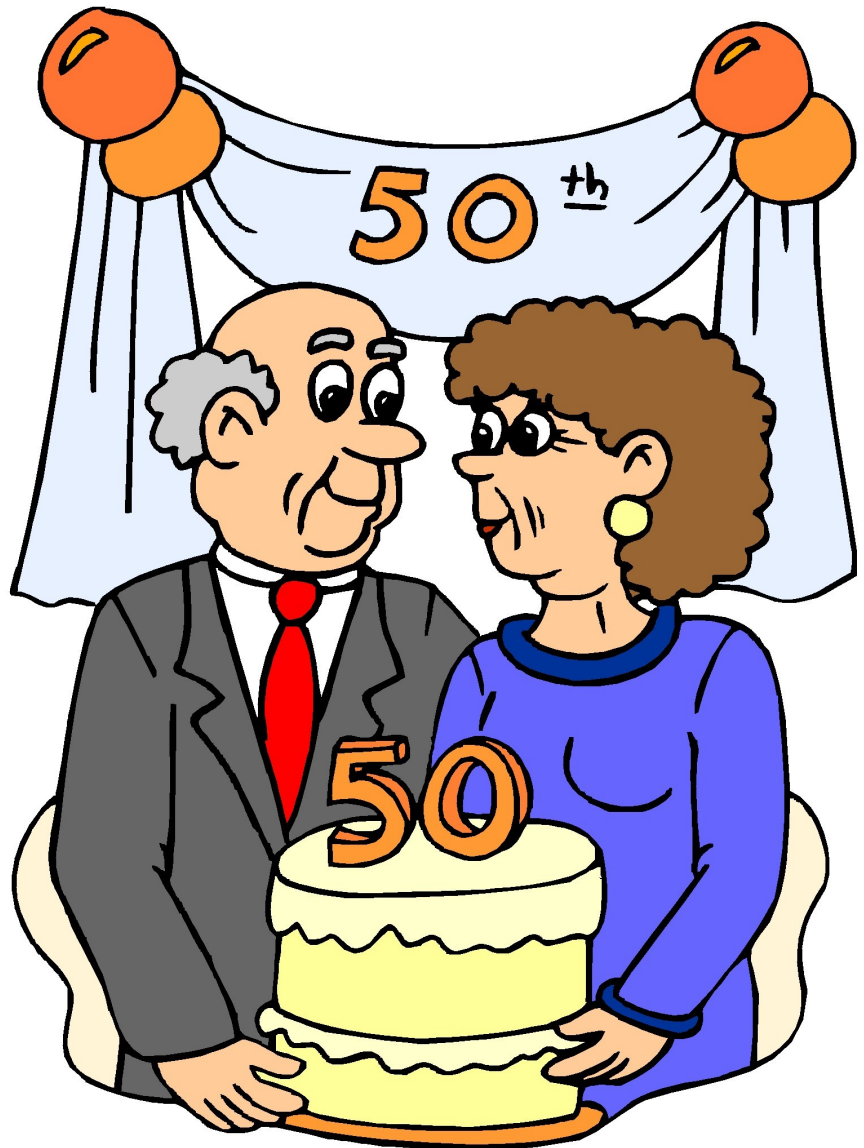

Shown above is the new electronic payment page on our council kc11402.org web site. You go to that web site, choose "Members Enter Here", log in with your last name and membership number (on your member card), choose "2016 Dues Payment", and then get to above screen.

You may then pay your dues (\$41.50 which includes a small electronic processing fee) by using a credit card or your PayPal account which takes that amount directly out of your checking account like a debit card. Your personal PayPal account must be set up independently. A new second web page choice allows you to set up automatic \$41.50 PayPal payments for 5 years.

Of course, you may still pay your unchanged 2016 annual dues of \$40 directly at a meeting or send a \$40 check made out to "[KofC Council 11402](#)" to our worthy Treasurer, Dave Riedinger. We could not make it easier to pay your dues. Dues were due January 1st. Happy New Year.

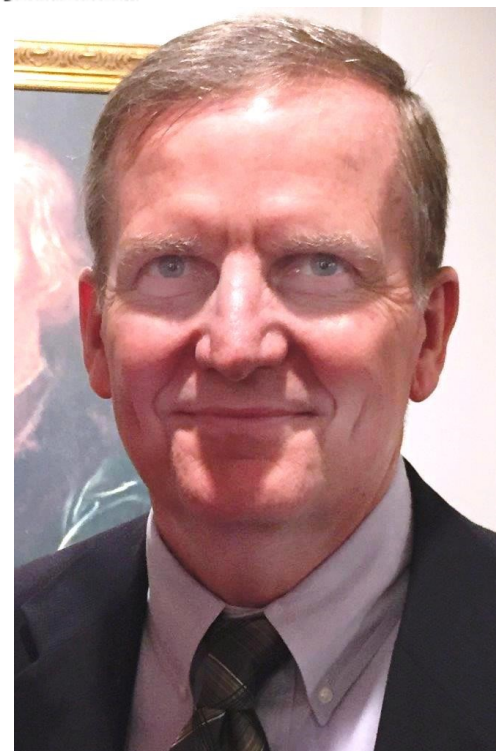

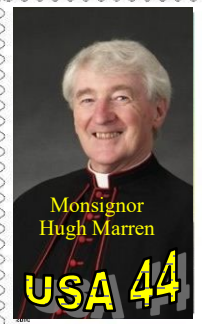
