Grand Knight's Report

My Brothers,

This month, I attended the North Georgia Council Officers meeting at Holy Family parish in Marietta. I was pleased to see and meet so many brothers who support Father McGivney's vision of Catholic men supporting each other, their families, and their faith.

August seems to be a particularly good month to reflect on our humble beginnings because this month marks the birth and death of our founder, **Father Michael McGivney**. Forming the first council in 1882 with 24 men, he started a movement that originally embraced the principles of "charity" and "unity". Originally called the "Sons of Columbus", Father McGivney strove to strengthen religious faith and to provide for the financial needs of families upon the death of the breadwinner.

Today, our Order is 1.9 million brothers strong, with 14,000 councils active in 13 countries. We are an integral part of this Catholic fraternal movement by focusing on activities and events that serve to strengthen our faith, our parish, and each other through the principles of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity.

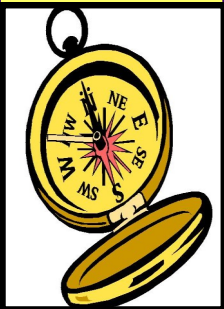

Officers who were not able to attend had stand-ins to receive the proper medallion of office. Most wives attended as well.

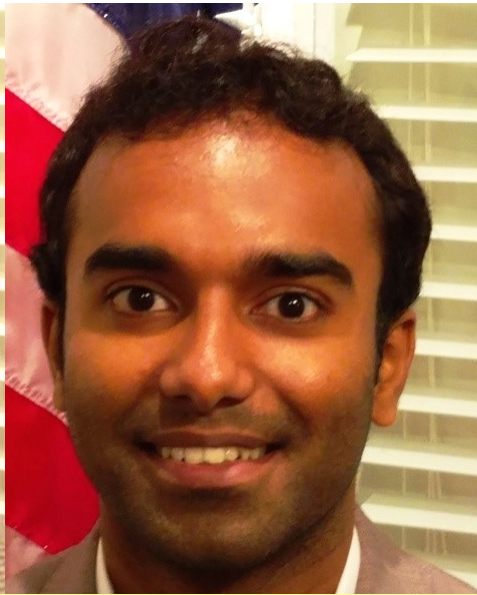
This is a very formal and beautiful ceremony of the Order and every brother should observe it.

July Parish Bingo—Breaks Record Again !!



We recorded an all-time record of 186 players on July 28th including 3 knight widows. Our Bingo sales were \$1,814, our Bingo prizes were \$915, yielding Bingo gross proceeds of \$899. We also received \$268 from food donations, \$217 from drink donations, and \$195 from the 50/50 raffle sale. Cost of food and drink, 7% sales tax, and cost of supplies are still to be deducted. There were 26 people who brought the Dunwoody Crier ads in for free added playing sheets.

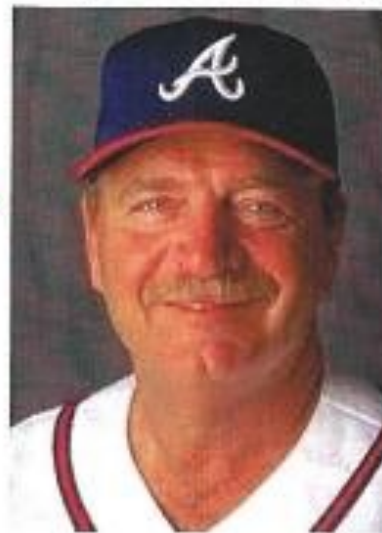

Shown above is the new electronic payment page on our council kc11402.org web site. You go to that web site, choose "Members Enter Here", log in with your last name and membership number (on your member card), choose "2016 Dues Payment", and then get to above screen.

You may then pay your dues (\$41.50 which includes a small electronic processing fee) by using a credit card **or** your PayPal account which takes that amount directly out of your checking account like a debit card. Your personal PayPal account must be set up independently. A new second web page choice allows you to set up automatic \$41.50 PayPal payments for 5 years.

Of course, you may still pay your unchanged 2016 annual dues of \$40 directly at a meeting or send a \$40 check made out to "**KofC Council 11402**" to our new Treasurer, Dominic Palermo. We could not make it easier to pay your dues. Dues were due last January 1st.

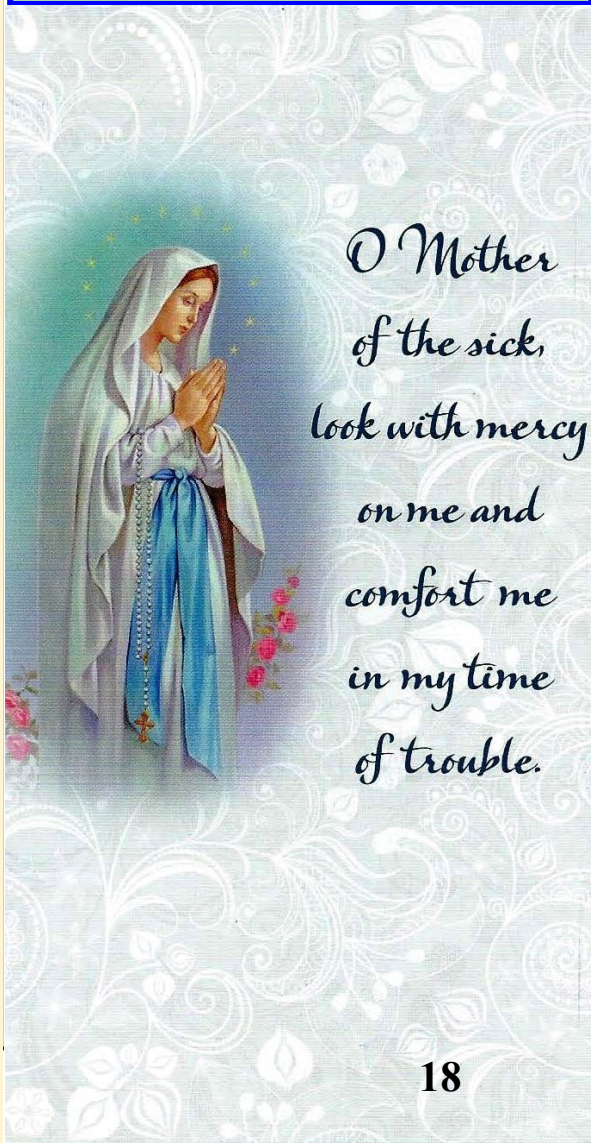

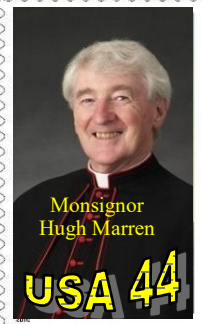
