A smaller offload of pumpkins sometime this month. Date unknown.





Supreme Knight Comments on Fall Election

At the recent 134th International Convention of the KofC, August 2-4 in Toronto, our Supreme Knight, Carl Anderson, minced no words on our moral obligation to support candidates that are pro-life. Here are some of his comments.

WASHINGTON (CNS) — Protecting "the innocent is a matter of justice that imposes an obligation on all members of society," said Supreme Knight Carl Anderson, adding that abortion is not just another U.S. political issue.

"It is time to stop creating excuses for voting for pro-abortion politicians," he said.

"I do not see how it is possible to find another issue that can 'balance' the devastation of 50 million human beings killed by abortion," he told Catholic News Service in an email Aug. 10. "There simply is no other moral issue of that magnitude confronting us today. ... Catholics should draw a bright line between themselves and abortion by refusing to vote for any candidate who supports abortion rights."

He added, "We will never build a culture of life by voting for politicians who support a culture of death. It is time we make the right to life non-negotiable."

New Council Web Master Needed

Our council's once award-winning web site at <u>kc11402.org</u> is in dire need of a thorough upgrade and technical rewrite. It was originally created and still runs under the ancient Windows 98 operating system which is no longer supported by Microsoft. Even worse, the software used is MS FrontPage which is long outdated and non-supported. It needs to be moved to the latest Windows 10 platform under modern web application software. MS Expression software was a successor to FrontPage, but is also discontinued but free of charge.

The best package going forward may be Adobe Dreamweaver, but there is no conversion path from FrontPage. A complete rewrite is necessary and may require HTML and C++ as well.

Our webmaster, Gert Kampfer, has for a dozen years dutifully and single-handedly operated this web site which is still among the very best in the state (many councils do not even have one). Gert would like to retire from this task and move it to one or more of our younger technical gurus.

The ongoing job requires maintaining a member database including each member photo, birth date, wedding anniversary date, membership number, phone number, degree attained, wife name, and email address. These personal items can only be accessed through a member sign-in process that uses the member last name and his KofC membership number as ID and password. This sign-in database must also be maintained as members come and go.

Links to recent monthly newsletters and council meeting minutes are also supported., as are reports. The webmaster supports the current web hosting supplier "Z Connect" interface as well. The council pays any costs. We are not married to the existing web structure. Innovation is key. We want the web site to be attractive, popular, and useful.

With the tremendous advances in web site software technology and even cloud computing, we would envision one person moving the databases and rewriting the application to a new platform. Another person could possibly become the new webmaster using detailed documentation provided by the first person. Web maintenance is constant, but should not be time-consuming. Many of the select tabs below are seldom changed or are only updated once per year.

To someone who creates and supports modern web sites, such a conversion is probably not too daunting, but to most computer users, it is well beyond their pay grade.

This council web site is very important, since it serves as an information pool among members and a good recruiting tool for the council. Please let us know if you can help with this project or know a good resource for the council.

Communication from Former DD, Kyle Simonis

We received this kind letter from our Former District Deputy, Kyle Simonis, regarding his trip to Poland to attend World Youth Day. You will recall that our council (among others) donated \$500 to help him with expenses. He is entering the seminary and will be a yearly recipient of \$600 from the Order under our RSVP program supporting seminarians. He is a member of the Georgia Tech Council.

Dear Knights of Columbus Georgia State Council,



Thank you for your donation to help pay for my trip to World Youth Day this past summer. It was an incredible experience not only for the privilege of spending time in Poland with Pope Francis and two million young Catholics from around the world, but also for what I learned and brought back with me at the end of the pilgrimage, which I will continue to flesh out during my time in seminary. As a token of my appreciation, I'd like to spend some time sharing with you in detail about my trip.

The first day was filled with both excitement and exhaustion. Thirty of us college Knights, along with a couple of Supreme representatives and a handful of Dominican priests, landed in Krakow the morning of Thursday, July 21st, and immediately boarded a bus and rode to Wadowice, Pope St. John Paul II's (JPII's) hometown. We had lunch in the public square, then walked over to the apartment JPII lived in with his father. The complex had been reconstructed into a JPII museum, and we spent a couple of hours walking through it, experiencing JPII's life through various writings and speeches he gave as a priest, bishop, cardinal, and pope. I began to really understand who Karol Wojtyla was: a man authentically moving himself and others towards God, even throughout the terrible times in Poland. After touring the complex, we stopped at the Basilica of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary to pray, which, interestingly enough, is right next door. Afterwards we loaded back onto the bus in the late afternoon and travelled to Auschwitz.

Before heading inside the infamous WWII concentration camp, we met with the Sisters of Life, a group of religious sisters who would be joining us for the rest of our pilgrimage and helping out with the second week of our trip, staffing the Knights of Columbus Mercy Center. I was able to reconnect with a Georgia Tech alumna, Sister Gemma Grace, who graduated around the time I started at Tech (2010) and had just entered novitiate for the order. With these sisters, we walked around the sobering sight of Auschwitz. We stopped and prayed outside of the building where St. Maximillian Kolbe was killed, as well as by the original gas chambers and ovens. It was an intense experience; afterwards everyone boarded the bus silently reflecting. That night, we stayed at the Center of Dialogue, a retreat center across from Auschwitz, and listened to a talk given by its director.

The next two days we explored Zakopane's Tatra Mountains, some of the most beautiful mountains I have ever seen. On the way over there, we stopped at a church in Ludzmierz, where we learned about the famous prophecy concerning Mary's scepter: when JPII was Bishop Wojtyla, he was helping with the procession of Mary in Ludzmierz when suddenly the scepter Mary was holding fell to the ground. Bishop Karol leapt over and caught it before it could break; later it was said that this prophesied he would later be leader of and have great influence over a large group of people.
