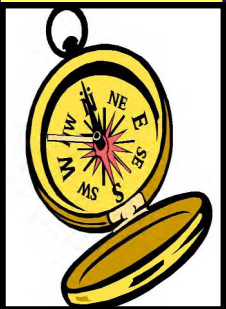

God bless everyone who helped with this wonderful charity and social event.

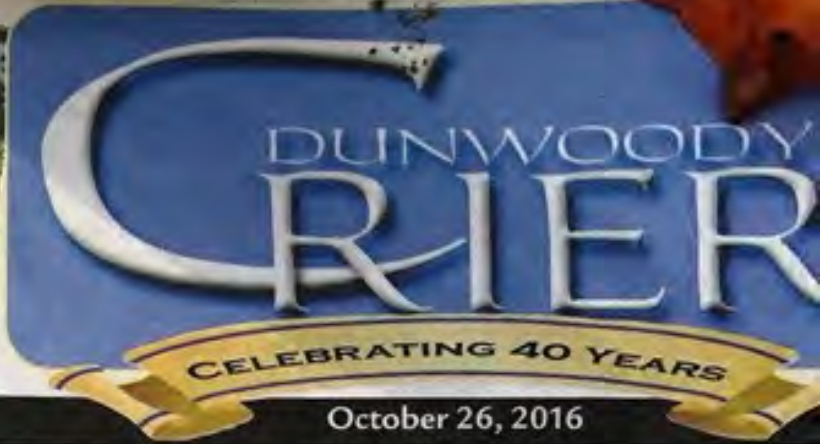

# Brother Chris Carr is Georgia Attorney General

On Wednesday, Deal named Carr as attorney general. Carr will move into the new position Nov. 1, replacing Sam Olens, who was named Wednesday as the new president at Kennesaw State University. KENT D. Gov. Nathan Deal on Wednesday tapped one of his top deputies, Chris Carr, to become the state's next attorney general.

A list of powerful figures quickly lined up to support Carr, sending a blunt message that he will have big business and political backing when he asks voters for a full term in 2018.

Carr, the state's economic development commissioner, will take office on Nov. 1 as head of the Department of Law, administering a staff of more than 300 tasked with enforcing state laws and investigating public corruption. He is Deal's highest-profile appointment since the governor took office in 2011.

Carr, 44, will become only the sixth person to hold the state's top law position since 1945. Attorney General Sam Olens, who was elected in 2010 and won another four-year term in 2014, announced his resignation Wednesday after the Board of Regents named him Kennesaw State University's president.

# Our Chinese Community Relocates to Norcross

Renovations and repairs will be made to the existing building, which was formerly the Northeast Community Church.*

**NORCROSS**—The Chinese Catholic community has its own church home and hopes to begin celebrating Mass there in October.

The new Holy Name of Jesus Chinese Catholic Mission recently purchased a former Baptist church in Norcross for what will be the hub of this small but growing faith community, which has gathered for years at All Saints Church, Dunwoody, for Mass and other celebrations.

Father Bill Hao, the first archdiocesan priest of Chinese descent, is the spiritual leader of the community and administrator of the mission. Speaking five languages, including two Chinese dialects, he has been involved with the community for several years.

The new building was identified after visits to dozens of properties, he said.

"The location, the financials, the acreage and size of the buildings all made sense for our small community and its mission to bring the Good News of Jesus Christ to all people, especially to the Chinese people in metropolitan Atlanta," he said in an email. "We thank God for this great blessing and we thank all of our donors for their generous support."

The property at 5395 Light Circle, Norcross, includes three buildings on about six acres of land. It was purchased for about \$1.4 million, according to Catholic Construction Services. The largest building can be divided for worship and social gatherings. It is about 10,000 square feet. There are two other buildings on the site able to be used for offices and a two-story classroom building.

Father Hao said the move would take place as soon as possible after the necessary renovation and repair is completed.

Shown above is the new electronic payment page on our council [kc11402.org](http://kc11402.org) web site. You go to that web site, choose “Members Enter Here”, log in with your last name and membership number (on your member card), choose “2017 Dues Payment”, and then get to above screen.

You may then pay your dues (\$41.50 which includes a small electronic processing fee) by using a credit card **or** your PayPal account which takes that amount directly out of your checking account like a debit card. Your personal PayPal account must be set up independently. A new second web page choice allows you to set up automatic \$41.50 PayPal payments for 5 years.

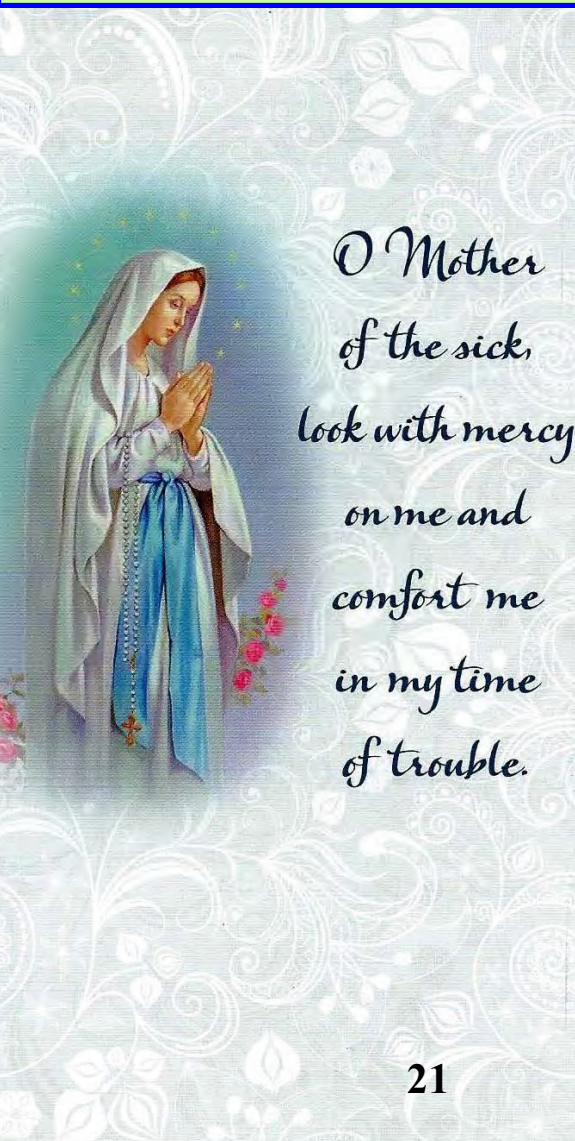

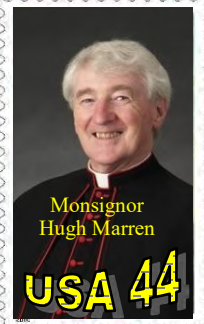
