




- Nicholas Le is studying at Mundelein Seminary in Mundelein, II.

DULUTH—A merger between Sophia Academy in Atlanta and Notre Dame Academy in Duluth was announced Jan. 4 by the boards of trustees of both Marist schools. It will take place in August. The Atlanta school will move to the Notre Dame campus and become a new division of that academy.

In announcing the merger, leaders said the outcome will be unique in the metro Atlanta area as the only independent Catholic school with a dedicated program for children, in preschool through high school, with a wide range of learning abilities.

"One of the biggest positives is that families can stay together," said Debra Orr, head of school of Notre Dame Academy.

Orr said she knows of a family with four children, each attending different schools to best meet educational needs.

Founded in 1999, Sophia Academy is a Marist school for children with learning differences. Sophia Academy serves students in kindergarten through 12th grade.

Our Bingo money contributions to Sophia Academy have helped stabilize them and allowed them to merge into Notre Dame Academy with their Marist brethren. They become a new division of that school.

<u>I Care</u> Needs Volunteer Drivers


Our Council has provided \$\$\$ support for I Care, Inc. for the past 10 years.



Shown above is the new electronic payment page on our council <u>kc11402.org</u> web site. You go to that web site, choose "Members Enter Here", log in with your last name and membership number (on your member card), choose "2017 Dues Payment", and then get to above screen.

You may then pay your dues online for \$41.50 (which includes a \$1.50 electronic processing fee) by using a credit card or your PayPal account which takes that amount directly out of your checking account like a debit card. Your personal PayPal account must be set up independently. A new second web page choice allows you to set up automatic \$41.50 PayPal payments for <u>5</u> years.

Of course, you may still pay your normal <u>2017 annual dues</u> of \$40 directly at a meeting or send a \$40 check made out to "KofC Council 11402" to our Financial Secretary, Ralph O'Connor, at 390 17th St., NW, Unit 5069, Atlanta, GA 30363. His email is <u>ralph390@comcast.net.</u>


If a member is less than 26 years old on December 31, 2016, annual dues are only \$20. If you are a designated "Honorary" member (65 years old and a Knight for 25 consecutive years), your dues are only \$10. Priests, deacons, or members of a religious order pay no dues. Anyone who has been a Knight for 50 unbroken years likewise pays no dues.

These above rules are for Council 11402 dues only. <u>Assembly dues are separate.</u> We could not make it easier to pay your dues. Dues are assessed each January 1st.


