

First Seven Fish Fry Events Soar!!







Fish Tacos Tried at Fish Fry



New Worthy Inside Guard-Gene Gannon





KofC Places 760 Ultrasound Machines



A week prior to the feast of the Annunciation, Supreme Knight Carl Anderson attended the blessing of a mobile ultrasound unit donated to A Woman's Haven, a pro-life pregnancy center in San Antonio. Archbishop Gustavo García-Siller of San Antonio blessed the mobile ultrasound unit. Attending the ceremony with Supreme Knight Anderson were Supreme Director Javier Martinez, Texas State Deputy Douglas Oldmixon, General Agent Steve Michlik of the Michlik Agency and San Antonio Diocesan Deputy Derek Rabey.

The donation was arranged by St. Mark the Evangelist Council 7613 in San Antonio, alongside the fundraising efforts of Poth Council 2618, New Braunfels Council 4183, St. Joseph's at Honey Creek Council 8521 and St. Rose of Lima Council 11599. Meanwhile, encouraged by this program, A Woman's Haven raised the money to purchase a Save the Storks mobile ultrasound van.

Eddie Perez, president of A Woman's Haven and member of Council 8521 in Bulverde, said, "Because of this mobile pregnancy center, we anticipate that the number of women we serve will grow to approximately 2,000 ... on a yearly basis."

Darlene Balenger, a nurse practitioner at A Woman's Haven, told Mr. Anderson that the new machine has already saved a life.

"She told me that the first pregnant woman to use the machine had said her mind was made up — she was going to have an abortion," Supreme Knight Anderson related. "But then she had the ultrasound, and as she watched the screen, she looked up at the nurse and said, 'I'm going to keep my baby."

Since 2009, state and local councils have teamed up with the Supreme Council for the Order's Ultrasound Initiative, funding more than 760 ultrasound machines for pro-life pregnancy care centers throughout all 50 states, Canada, Guatemala, Jamaica and Peru. Recently, the Supreme Council also began offering funding for ultrasound machines used in mobile medical units.

The supreme knight expressed hope that the ultrasound machines will help pregnant women decide to keep their babies. "We conservatively estimate that these machines will save the lives of at least 100,000 unborn children this year alone. And these machines will go on saving lives for years to come," he said.

A Woman's Haven has been serving women experiencing crisis pregnancies since 2007. The agency is a 501c non-profit organization that will serve anyone regardless of their age, race, citizenship status or religion. To learn more about A Woman's Haven, please visit **AWomansHaven.org**

World War I KofC Carving in a Bunker

We thank Deputy Grand Knight Jim Gonzales for forwarding this interesting article to us.

"I was watching a documentary this evening on World War One bunker art. Take a look at this picture I took off my TV screen.

You can only imagine the spiritual comfort that the doughboys drew from membership in the Knights of Columbus. It was so important and meaningful that someone took the time to carve this in a cave bunker.

I think the brothers might be interested in seeing this."





Drawn from memory and maybe a bit crude, this carving of the Knights of Columbus logo on a bunker wall in Europe brought comfort to an American soldier in World War I who was in the midst of a battle for his life. The Order was still very young at that time.

Brother Chris Carr — GA Attorney General

Georgia Attorney General Chris Carr is making sure his new office leverages relationships within local communities to help combat problems in DeKalb and across the state, such as fraud, human trafficking and opioid abuse.

Carr, who began his role as 54th attorney general for Georgia last November, delivered the keynote address at the Dunwoody Perimeter Chamber's annual meeting, held at the newly-opened Fogo de Chao off Ashford Dunwoody Rd.

It was not by chance Carr was in Dunwoody for the day, as he has called the city home on-and-off since he was a child. He moved back permanently in 2008. "I am proud to be from here," he said.

One of his current priorities is to ensure neither individuals nor businesses are being defrauded or defrauding others.

"It is part of our DNA to listen to the public and private sector, like local chambers of commerce, to make sure people are not being defrauded" he said. "We want to make sure people know Georgia is a great place to do business."

He said they are hoping to send a loud-and-clear message that anyone wanting to come to the state to steal people's money are not welcome.

He cited a recent example of a payday lender, Western Sky Financial, that sold more than 18,000 loans to Georgians at 340 percent interest — a rate capped at 10 percent. Carr said the state won a \$40 million settlement recently in that case.

Carr said he and his team cannot combat the issue alone and said they are leveraging their private sector relationships and the power of social and traditional media to help get the word out on cases of fraud as well as other issues.

Elder abuse and human trafficking are two other high priority items for Carr's office moving forward, he said.

"We owe it to protect the most vulnerable and at risk," he said.

His office is taking a zero tolerance approach to trafficking with a focus on educating and making communities more aware, he said.



Carr recently applauded the passage of House Bill 341 this legislative session, which, among other things, toughens penalties for those paying for sexual services from victims of trafficking.

Opioid abuse is another important issue Carr said they plan to focus on. He said in the past six years throughout parts of metro Atlanta — DeKalb included — opioid use has risen almost 4,000 percent.

"It is happening here because there is money here," he said.

One way his office is helping to combat the issue is through the "We're not gonna take it" video contest, which challenges students across the state to produce a 30-second video encouraging their peers to live a healthy lifestyle and reject prescription drug use.

The most recent winning video was produced by Dunwoody High School student Peter Vuong.

Carr was previously the commissioner of the Georgia Department of Economic Development for three years, helping the state create jobs and investment through business recruitment, expansion, trade and tourism.

During his time in that position, the department helped facilitate more than 1,000 projects across the state, representing around \$14.4 billion in investment and the creation of more than 84,000 jobs.

Vietnam Moving Wall Arrived





Our Fr. Charles J. Watters 4th Degree Assembly 2688 has now erected a "Battlecross" Monument in the Johns Creek Newtown Park to commemorate our fallen warriors. The base of the battlecross monument has a plaque previously prepared by the Assembly.

Our cross is placed at the entrance of the park at 3150 Old Alabama Road, Johns Creek, GA 30022. The official dedication is May 13th at 3 PM. Many local dignitaries, newspeople, and KofC state officers will attend.

This military park is the fourth largest in the country and is well worth a visit. The Assembly has already installed a bench in honor of Fr. Charles J. Watters who is a fallen Congressional Medal of Honor Winner from the Vietnam War. Our council has an amazing 157 Sir Knights.

Our Sir Knight Bill Camden is the Faithful Navigator of the Assembly and coordinated the installation of the battlecross monument. The Assembly raised the funds.

Shown above is the new electronic payment page on our council <u>kc11402.org</u> web site. You go to that web site, choose "Members Enter Here", log in with your last name and membership number (on your member card), choose "2017 Dues Payment", and then get to above screen.

You may then pay your dues online for \$41.50 (which includes a \$1.50 electronic processing fee) by using a credit card or your PayPal account which takes that amount directly out of your checking account like a debit card. Your personal PayPal account must be set up independently. A new second web page choice allows you to set up automatic \$41.50 PayPal payments for 5 years.

Of course, you may still pay your normal <u>2017 annual dues</u> of \$40 directly at a meeting or send a \$40 check made out to "KofC Council 11402" to our Financial Secretary, Ralph O'Connor, at 390 17th St., NW, Unit 5069, Atlanta, GA 30363. His email is <u>ralph390@comcast.net</u>.

If a member is less than 26 years old on December 31, 2016, annual dues are only \$20. If you are a designated "Honorary" member (65 years old and a Knight for 25 consecutive years), your dues are only \$10. Priests, deacons, or members of a religious order pay no dues. Anyone who has been a Knight for 50 unbroken years likewise pays no dues.
