All Saints Wins First Place State Award



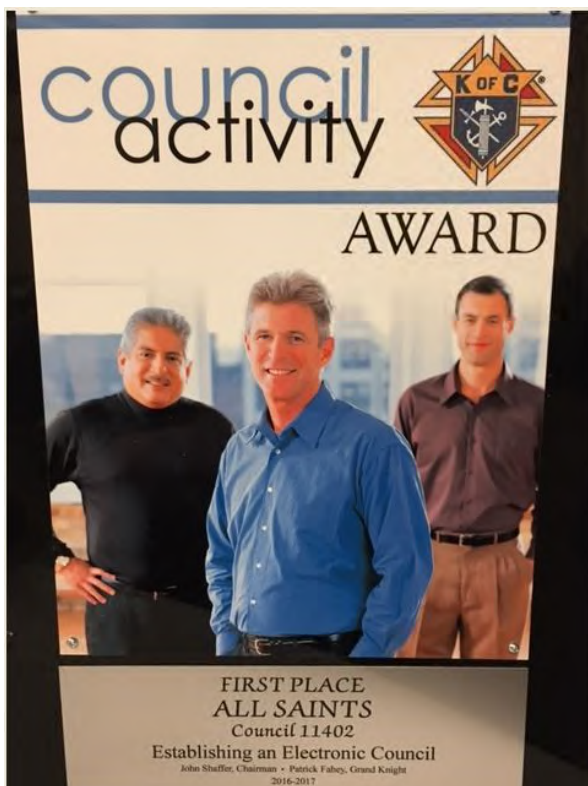
At the Annual KofC Georgia State Convention Awards Banquet in Savannah on May 20th, All Saints won first place for our Council Activity submission.

Just think of this document (page one shown below) as another 39 page council newsletter with an unusual amount of pictures. We are proud of our technology successes at 11402.

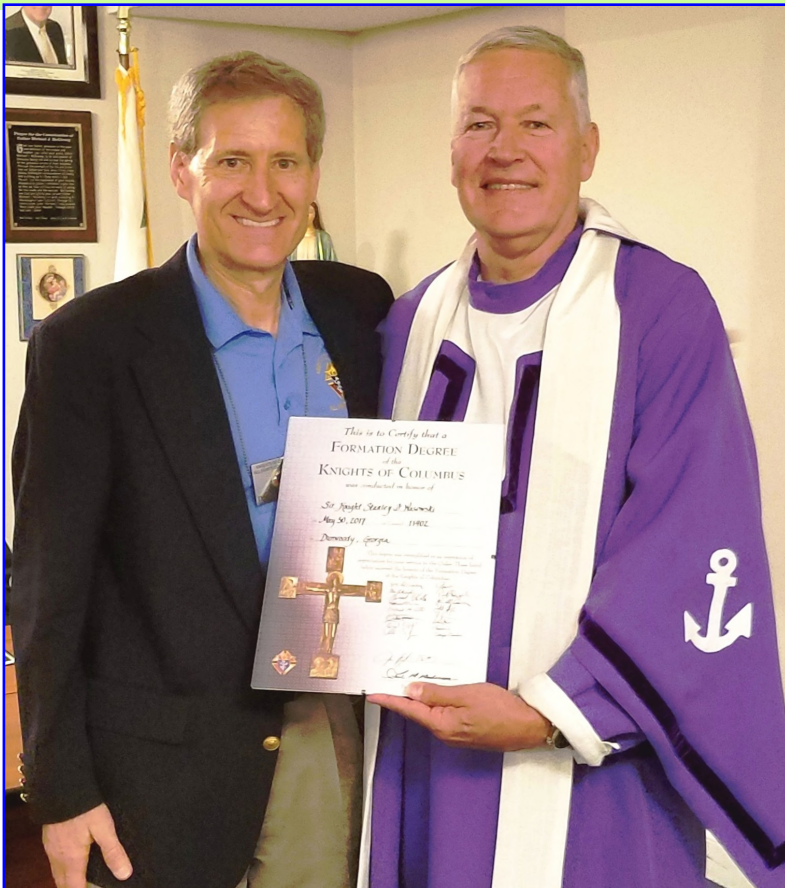

“Knights Helping Widows” Program Starts



“Knights Helping Widows” is intended to be a “Handy-Man Similar” resource for those widows who have no one to help them with minor household problems that might present a hazard to health and safety.

A short list of some of these problems include: light switches and receptacles that don't work, plumbing leaks, toilet repair, hinges, locks, door bells, carpet bunching, smoke alarms, out of reach, light bulb replacement, installation of safety bars, weatherproofing windows and doors, nonslip surface preparation, and more. We will provide the labor with you providing the material needed for the repair.

What does a widow needing help do?

Call or email our Program Coordinator, John Shaffer at 770-349-5278 or k9shaffer@aol.com. John will forward your request to a Knight who will contact you to set up an appointment. When he meets with you, he will have Knights of Columbus Identification and appropriate release forms.

After evaluating your needs, he will make recommendations and setup a repair schedule. In some instances, it may be necessary to make alternative recommendations if you live outside our service area or your issues require

greater expertise than we can offer. In such an event, we are prepared to have someone available to help you ask the right questions when you are negotiating with a contractor or other service provider. When repairs are completed, we will follow-up to assure that the work has been done to your satisfaction.

We, the members of All Saints Knights of Columbus, pray that you find a small bit of peace and comfort in knowing that your husband's spirit lives on through the spirit of our Council.

If you are willing to become a handyman for minor fixes at the homes of our council widows, please contact John Shaffer at his contact info shown above. Our Widows Committee is becoming more active in maintaining communications with all our widows. Recently we sent Easter cards to all widows whose addresses we have. We already invite our widows to play monthly BINGO at Council expense.

Soap Box Derby Time Again

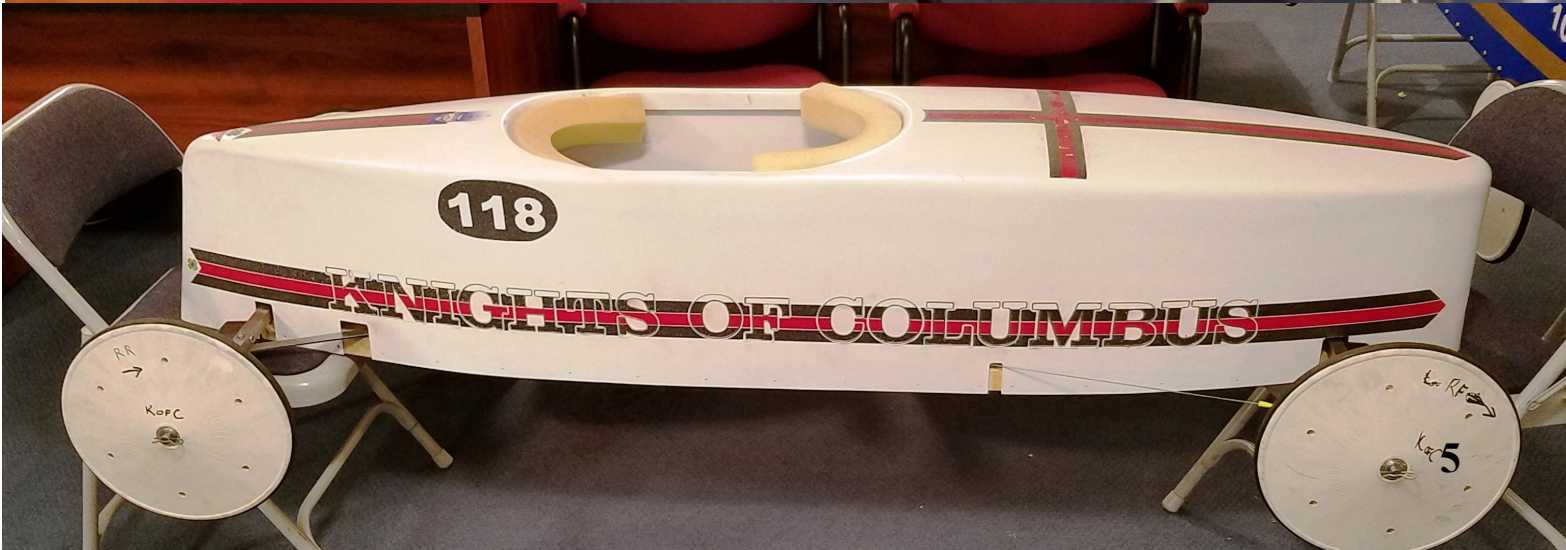

Kiernan is Priest for 68 Years

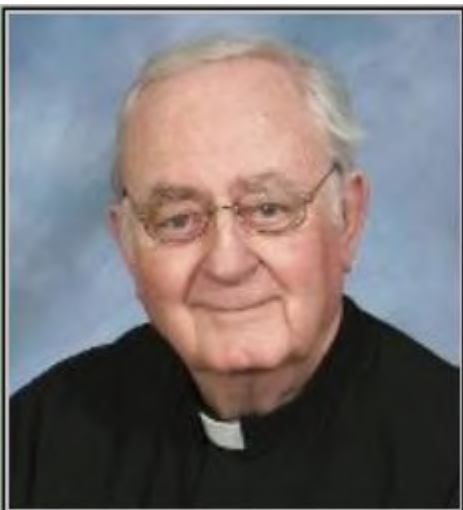

May Parish Bingo— Player upswing !!



We recorded 118 players on May 25th including 2 knight widows. This was an increase of 20 players over April. Our Bingo sales were \$2,063 our Bingo prizes were \$940, yielding Bingo gross proceeds of \$1,123. We also received \$184 from food donations, \$174 from drink donations, and \$195 from the 50/50 raffle sale. Cost of food and drink, 7% sales tax, state license fee, and cost of supplies are still to be deducted. Battlecross Dedicated on May 13th



Our Fr. Charles J. Watters 4th Degree Assembly 2688 has now erected a “Battlecross” Monument in the Johns Creek Newtown Park to commemorate our fallen warriors. The base of the battlecross monument has a plaque previously prepared by the Assembly. It was formally dedicated on May 13th.

Our cross is placed at the entrance of the park at 3150 Old Alabama Road, Johns Creek, GA 30022. Many local dignitaries, news people, and KofC state officers attended. A Watters Assembly honor guard was provided as well. Following are photos of this solemn event.

This military park is the fourth largest in the country and is well worth a visit. The Assembly had already installed a bench in honor of Fr. Charles J. Watters who is a fallen Congressional Medal of Honor Winner from the Vietnam War. Our council has an amazing 157 Sir Knights.

Shown above is the new electronic payment page on our council kc11402.org web site. You go to that web site, choose “Members Enter Here”, log in with your last name and membership number (on your member card), choose “2017 Dues Payment”, and then get to above screen.

You may then pay your dues online for \$41.50 (which includes a \$1.50 electronic processing fee) by using a credit card **or** your PayPal account which takes that amount directly out of your checking account like a debit card. Your personal PayPal account must be set up independently. A new second web page choice allows you to set up automatic \$41.50 PayPal payments for 5 years.

Of course, you may still pay your normal 2017 annual dues of \$40 directly at a meeting or send a \$40 check made out to “**KofC Council 11402**” to our Financial Secretary, Ralph O’Connor, at 390 17th St., NW, Unit 5069, Atlanta, GA 30363. His email is ralph390@comcast.net.

If a member is less than 26 years old on December 31, 2016, annual dues are only \$20. If you are a designated “Honorary” member (65 years old and a Knight for 25 consecutive years), your dues are only \$10. Priests, deacons, or members of a religious order pay no dues. Anyone who has been a Knight for 50 unbroken years likewise pays no dues.

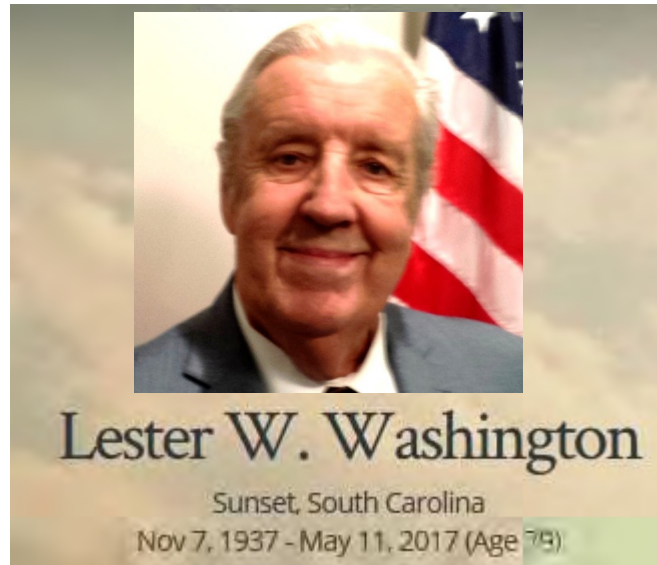

Because he had spent the bulk of his Atlanta years at the Dunwoody Methodist Church, his wife who did not convert, preferred to have the memorial there with his many old friends.

The 7UPS prayer group which he headed featured several of our brother Knights joining him in prayer on mornings at 7 AM at the Dunwoody Country Club. Les was a very devoted Christian and Brother Knight.

Past Grand Knight George Novac Passes



Deacon Ed Krise has just learned from the Novac family that Sir Knight George P. Novac passed May 31st in the Orlando area. He is the 66th deceased member of All Saints Council 11402. He had suffered a brain tumor some weeks ago.

Novac was the second Grand Knight of the All Saints Council and a charter member in 1994. He was also the first Faithful Navigator of our Fr. Charles J. Watters Assembly when it split off from the Elizabeth Ann Seton Assembly in 2001.

Because he relocated to Florida some years ago, he is relatively unknown to our younger members, but he was a crucial part of the growth of the KofC in this area. He was very instrumental in the introduction of our Lenten Fish Frys and the construction of the Our Lady of the Knights Chapel in All Saints church. We won our first International Award for the construction of that chapel.

Please pray for George and his family. There are no known arrangements at this time.

The Knights of Columbus, Council 11402, built Our Lady Queen of the Knights Chapel at All Saint's Catholic Church. Late in 1997 Monsignor R. Donald Kiernan, Pastor at All Saints, asked the Knights to build a place for quiet prayer and meditation to replace the makeshift chapel located in the church's cry room.

George Novac took on the project as chairman in July 1998. George put together a committee consisting of Richard Holcomb handling fund raising, Robert Greene overseeing interior decorating and design, and Sam Portis as general contractor for the project. The small religious articles store in the vestibule of the Church was converted into a beautiful 400 square-foot chapel. Behind a clear stained glass door with a cross and red trim, the chapel has a new altar, paneling and chairs of cherry wood named after the 12 apostles. Panel lights installed above the crucifix, altar and baptismal font provide various levels of light.

The Knights of Council 11402 completely financed the \$27,000 plus project with, among other contributions, various members paying \$1,000 for memorial plaques on the altar, crucifix and chairs.

Our Lady Queen of the Knights Chapel was opened in late 1998 and was dedicated in a solemn ceremony February 8, 1999 by Archbishop John F. Donoghue. The chapel is available for prayer whenever the church is open and is used for weekly exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. It is also used for baptisms, weddings and Mass for small groups. Project chairman, George Novac's grandson was the first person to be baptized in the new chapel.

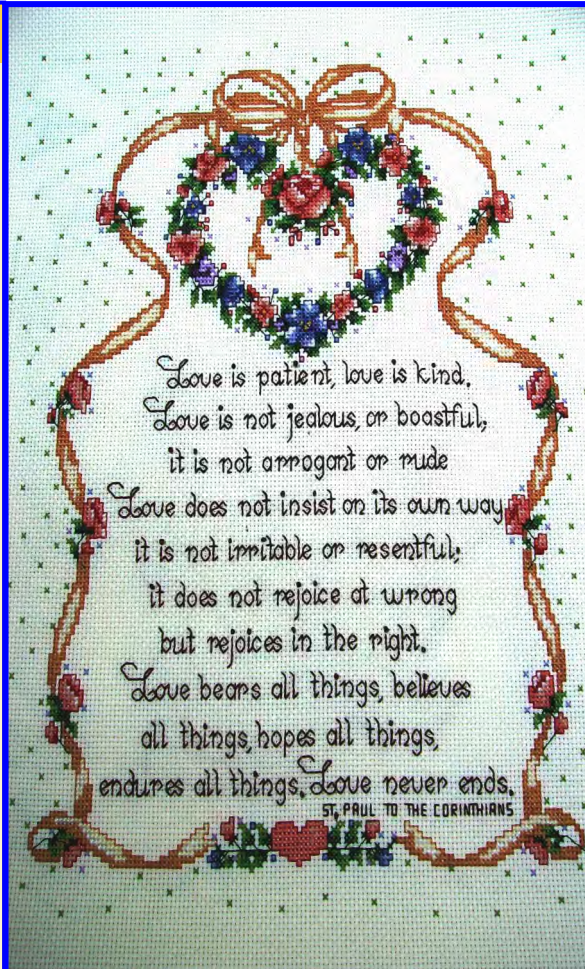

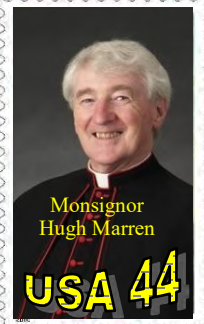
