trand Knight's Report

Worthy Brothers:

The vernal equinox has recently passed, and we're moving deeper into Spring. We've just completed a successful 11th annual Lenten fish fry, and we're anticipating the great climax of the liturgical year at Easter.

We're also entering into the final quarter of our

Fraternal Year 2006-2007. It's at this point in the year that the Grand Knight appoints a Nominating Committee to begin the search for next year's Council officer candidates.

A combination of this time of year with its many "signposts" and "waypoints" and the discussions I've had with members of the Nominating Committee have started me reflecting upon some of the challenges and opportunities facing All Saints Council 11402.

Over the next few years Council 11402 must continue to reach out to you, to encourage more of you to become involved, and to reach out to a new generation of Brothers who will carry on the tradition so nobly and richly-created by our founding generation.

This is probably the second-largest fund raiser for the Council, after the Lenten Fish Fry. We hope you all will respond when the time comes to sell some onions!!

I'm also pleased to announce that for the first time, Council 11402 will have a float in the <u>Dunwoody Salutes America</u> <u>4th of July Parade</u>. We've formed an *ad hoc* committee to look into designing and building a float. We believe that the more we are out in the community, the more our parishioners will come to understand how truly great it is to be a Knight of Columbus.




You may contact any member of the committee with whom you are most comfortable. We look forward to your input, and thank you for your interest and participation.





Fr. James Stephen Behrens, OCSO, monk, noted author of three published books





2007 Fish Fry Easily Breaks All Records !!!

With one more Friday Fry to go before press time, the 2007 Tony Ardagna Memorial Fish Fry was about to break into record territory. We already had broken our single night record of 1,012 with 1,032 meals served.

Needing only 390 meals served to tie last year, our final total easily exceeded last year by several hundred meals. In fact, the 6,000 meal milestone was shattered. We seem to be settling into a comfortable 900-1000 Friday meal range more and more often as the years progress. A final "official" report from our Financial Secretary will be issued next month.

Vidalia Onions -- The Smell Of \$ucce\$\$

It's that time of the year again to plan for our ANNUAL sale of our Vidalia Onions. The current schedule calls for the Onions to Arrive on the weekend of April 28/29 - - barring any long term adverse weather.

Last year we had 6 other Councils that joined us in this project, with our Council providing the management of getting the Onions delivered to each individual church. However, our key effort will come from our specific sale of onions to our own All Saints parishioners. Last year YOU all helped us sell 450 ten-pound bags of onions, and we will order that many again this year. The plan is to sell them again for \$9.00 per ten-pound bag.

Just like last year, we will count on everyone's participation to assist in the sale. We need to cover all doors at all Masses in order to completely sell out as we have in the past. Remember, spouses, and teenaged children may help as well. It is important to have many hands helping to speed the process, so there is a minimum of waiting for our "customers".



We will also again offer pre-sale coupons before each mass, so manpower is extremely critical.

A sign-up sheet will be available at our next council meeting, so that you can select the mass time(s) that best fits you. This is a good one-day moneymaker for us, so we look for everyone to help. Please consider coming EARLY to your regular Mass to help us at the end of the previous Mass and then stay to help us after your regular Mass.

New Hospitality Committee Instituted

If (in the opinion of the volunteers) it is necessary to contact them on a more frequent basis, they will do so.

The sick list has been has been divided among the ten volunteers who will act in teams of two. In addition to making contact, they will also schedule once a quarter an opportunity to share with the homebound person a day when we would conduct a Communion Service.

In the event that they find that there is a need to provide the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick to any individual, Deacon Ray Egan will be contacted. Egan will then contact a priest and make the necessary arrangements for the person to receive this healing and grace-restoring sacrament.

Several motions of importance were voted at the March 6th Business meeting. As you can see, this was a very fruitful and important meeting.

- The amended by-laws were approved.
- The stipend for the Diaconate was passed.
- The amount of \$1,770 to reimburse the parish for walk-in freezer repairs was passed.
- The amount of \$1,000 for a new fish fry outside awning was passed.
- Two checks for \$500 each were presented to representatives of Pregnancy Resources and Atlanta Intercultural Ministries.
- A motion to purchase 72 additional monogrammed council baseball hats for future fish fry use at \$6.00 was raised. A vote will be taken at the April meeting to approve. They will be sold to council members for \$8.00 each, but will be free to cooks who require them.
- Three members were admitted 1 transfer and two reinstatements. Story in this newsletter.
- Twelve candidate Form 100's were approved as potential new members. Three of the twelve have already been exemplified on March 27.
