Grand Knight's Report

Brothers,

As I pass the two-third-year mark as your 9th Grand Knight, I would like to reflect on those eight months in office. They have seen great successes and a few shortfalls, but it certainly hasn't been dull.

We've just added another crowning glory with our latest record Lenten Fish Fry. We are the envy of the diocese with our ability to regularly crank out 1,000 meals in three hours, (an average of one every 10.8 seconds.) It's looking like our first 7,000 meal Lent.

Other councils have started adopting our methods with success. Two councils have asked for our secret clam chowder recipe, but we had to turn them down. Our Tony Ardagna recipe is still in a bank vault next to the Coca Cola formula.

We purchased that barbeque trailer that we had wanted for so long and have gotten an amazing amount of mileage out of it already. It forced us to clean out our garage finally to come up with permanent storage space. It's about time to fire it up again.

Our first golf tournament in some years was a success and we learned some great pointers about honing it into a world-class event in the future. Thanks to Sir Knight Matt Filla and the Horseshoe Bend Country Club, we have an excellent venue for Monday, September 21st, and future years.

Our council membership is sneaking up gradually toward the 300 level, membership is younger, council meetings are more crowded, and acolyte teams are expanding. Now if we could just get more insurance members, so we could reach the coveted Double Star Award for an amazing third consecutive year.

Our first and second Degree Teams are continuing to crank out new knights for All Saints and any other council that has a need to utilize our ceremonies. We are promoting brothers upward to solidify the memberships in several councils and make more brothers officer-eligible at the third degree level.

Speaking of the third degree, we have a special need to move many of our 130 third-degree-ers up into the

sacred 4th degree brotherhood. These are the guys that give our Order that special panache that makes society stand up and take notice.

Our McGivney Hall is quite often the monthly home of the Fr. Charles J. Watters Assembly #2688— an organization of 160 Sir Knights from All Saints, St. Andrew, and St. Brigid. They'll be very active with all the honor guard requests coming up this summer for Confirmations, First Communions, and many other special events.

Consider joining the elite ranks Saturday, April 25th. Return the applications that have been sent out. We can do better than promoting three or four brothers to the Watters Assembly every time.

This year we will be partnering with the members of these other councils for a weekend summer retreat at Simpsonwood Retreat Center in Norcross on August 22/23. We have 40 rooms reserved this year and are looking forward to a very special event.

In a couple of weeks, we'll be filling another eighteen wheeler stocked with about 2000 ten-pound bags of Vidalia onions. We'll divvy them up among about seven councils and sell our normal consignment of 495 bags at the church doors. We'll need a lot of help.

We are always looking for new fun events to make a difference in the community. This year we have been invited to partake in the Dunwoody Soap Box Derby on May 30th.

Many local organizations are already planning to either sponsor a car or help run the event. I hope that our Order can make a conspicuous showing at this wonderful new community youth event to be held right in our own backyard on Cotillion Drive. Help celebrate our incorporation as Georgia's newest city. We're dead center in the middle of this enthusiasm.

As Lent winds down and we approach Easter, the holiest day in the Church year, that special greeting used by knights — *"Vivat Jesus"* (may Jesus live)— takes on a special symbolism at the Resurrection.

Through six Lenten fish fry events out of the eight scheduled, the All Saints 2009 edition has broken a record for meal sales each and every week.

As the chart below indicates, we are already 556 meals ahead of last year in total. This means that we are on a possible track for our first 7,000 meal Lenten program. All this because we didn't raise our prices in a difficult economic period and people really appreciate the value of dining with us.

Great management by our two "big fish", Dennis Caniglia and Tom Simon and our many devoted team captains have resulted in a smooth process.

This table shows us nearing 5,000 meals served after six events.

The increase (about 13%) is the difference between the number of meals served last year versus this year. Last year was a record year.

We have actually broken the 1,000 meals served per event 6 times.

There was one such event in 2004 not shown. The 1,050 meal total is our new all-time record, and we are flirting with it every week now.

Knight Soap Box Derby Entry



On May 30th, the *Dunwoody Kiwanis Club* will sponsor the *Dunwoody/Northeast Georgia Soap Box Derby* race on the moderate grade of Cotillion Drive in Dunwoody. First Baptist Church grounds on North Peachtree will be the staging area.

The winner from the Stock (8-13 years) and Super Stock (10-17) Divisions will go on to Akron, Ohio to represent our region and our community in the National Championships.

Our Council has been invited to participate in this event by building and sponsoring a competition car. The cars come in kits that only need assembly. Kits take only about 4-6 hours to assemble. We'll discuss participation at the April 7th meeting.

A completed racer will cost about \$655 and the race entry fee is only \$35. This is inexpensive investment in community youth. Competitors will include our own Troop 434, Doraville Police, Dunwoody Homeowners Association, and several churches.
