Brothers,

Thank you all for once more amazing me with your record-breaking 2010 Lenten Fish Fry event. I never thought it was possible to funnel even more folks through our Parish Social Hall, but you did.

Running about 150 meals short of last year's record with only one Friday to go, we needed a totally unattainable number of 1,118 dinners to break last year's record. I knew it was impossible because we had never before served more than 1,050 dinners in one evening. Recessions do happen, you know.

Then came the shocking news that we had served 1,139 meals, even though we ran out of food for latecomers and had to turn people away. Unbelievable !!

It could not be a coincidence that just before this miracle of the stoves and fishes that our Catholic Georgia Bulletin had sent a reporter and a photographer to chronicle our event for their bi-weekly diocesan newspaper. Our Brother Dennis Crean had suggested they stop by if they wanted to see a real live spectacle.

Not only did they write a nice story, but they also went through the trouble of creating a slideshow with audio for their online edition. (Who knew that the Georgia Bulletin has an entire online edition.)

After reading the article, click the **"View Audio Slideshow"** button, click the left arrow, and enjoy your brothers in sound and action. I don't doubt that this fantastic publicity brought an extra amount of customers on that last Friday.

We give our sincere thanks to reporter Andrew Nelson and photographer Michael Alexander of that very professional publication.

As is our custom, we scheduled an Appreciation Fish Fry Party for the volunteers, customers, council brothers, spouses, and guests. The April 18th Sunday 3 PM barbeque became a "test run" for a parish barbeque fundraiser later in the year. We fed about 200 people with 10 Boston butts and now we know the ratio for one double that size.

But first we have a Vidalia Onion Sale to think about. Please help us sell our 475 bags at the church doors. They are an easy sell and John Buchholz needs a lot of help to ensure another success.

You may recall that last year we won the State Award for best Religious Activity for our unique Mass Acolyte Program. This year we hope to do it again by now submitting our "Fathers for Good" seminar programs for award consideration.

Sir Knight Jeff Durthaler and Brother Mike Tobia have gone out of their way to compile, schedule, and host all these very successful talks to the young fathers and husbands of our parish. We made excellent use of our new media center using videos and computer presentations on the large

TV screen.

And need I remind anyone that we are deeply involved in a partnership with the All Saints Men's Club to make their annual Charity Golf Tourney another blockbuster for the charities we both hold dear. It looks as if there will be 130 golfers taking part on May 10th at St. Marlo Country Club. If you can add any donations or prizes for the silent auction, they would be much appreciated.

As we near an ending point in our fraternal year, all brothers should be thinking about how they can more fully participate in the life of the Council by becoming officers and activity chairmen. A new set of leaders will be taking over the organization in July and I only pray they will have all the magnificent co-operation that I have had the last two years.

All Saints' Knights Serve Up Fish, Fun, Blessings

DUNWOODY—A small army of Knights of Columbus members is responsible for the traditional Lent fish fry dinner at All Saints Church. In a three-hour window, close to 1,000 meals are sold, which averages to be about one meal every 10 seconds.

What does it take to pull together this noisy, carnival atmosphere on the eight Fridays of Lent?

Just to start: 140 pounds of potatoes. 72 pounds of green beans. 397 individual pieces of seasoned salmon. Not to mention the coleslaw, fried cod, buckets of clam chowder.

And that's not to forget the hard-working men, who crack jokes at each other's expense. Like Bill Luckert who spends a couple hours hovering over the boiling pots of green beans. He said the steam rising to his face is like a spa. A colleague shouts that the steam gives him the best complexion of the group.

Members of Knights of Columbus Council 11402 have been doing this for more than a dozen years. They have gotten the meal service to a science: they know to have waiters deliver food to sitting customers because a buffet takes too much time. Golf carts deliver vegetables and wrapped fish from the lower kitchen. There are two lines, the fast-moving take-out line and one for the dining room. In fact, veterans of the fish fry crew have gone to other parishes to offer advice on making other operations run smoother.

The money they collect supports the many charities supported by the organization.

Lou Hlad, the Grand Knight of the Knights of Columbus at All Saints, said so many people attend because it is a close-knit parish and the meals are inexpensive: \$7 for a fish meal dinner, \$8 for salmon, with \$1 off for the over-55 crowd.

"Where in town are you going to get a better deal than that? It's \$4 for the kids meal, so people bring their families. It doesn't take long to get up to 1,000 meals," he said.

"People from all the churches around here buy our fish. We have Methodists and Baptists—they see our sign, and they drop in."

"It is kind of like a carnival. There is a lot of noise. It is just a lot of fun." said Hlad.

All Saints Church, one of many parishes in the Atlanta Archdiocese hosting fish fries during Lent, is located at 2443 Mount Vernon Road, Dunwoody.

Final Numbers Yield Yet Another Record (ho hum)



It was a very familiar scene at the All Saints Social Hall as customers jammed the room for their 2010 fish dinners. We kept the cost the same this year to the appreciation of all. A large snowstorm on the night of our Knights-only dinner probably cost us nearly 100 dinners and we started the year off with a bit of a deficit compared to last year.

The last two frys were the ones that put us over the top. They were both records for that date's event. Our unbelievable final Friday with 1,139 dinners broke our all-time record for a single date and ensured a record for the total Lenten events. God Bless you all!!

In discussing this with our grower source in South Georgia, he feels that the WET and COLD weather experienced in our Sunny South has slowed down the onion growth. So we need to plan accordingly. If it's possible the sale will be April 24-25, but we feel the actual date will be May 1-2.

Once again we will use the CourierSouth warehouse facilities of Ed Krise (oops, **Deacon** Ed Krise) to store, then break down the truckload into smaller sub lots to be delivered to the participating councils.



Supporting Assembly's Founder Day Dinner

Our Fr. Charles J. Watters Fourth Degree Assembly #2688 held a **Founder's Day "Year of the Priest" Dinner Dance** on Saturday, April 10th, at St. Andrew's Family Center. 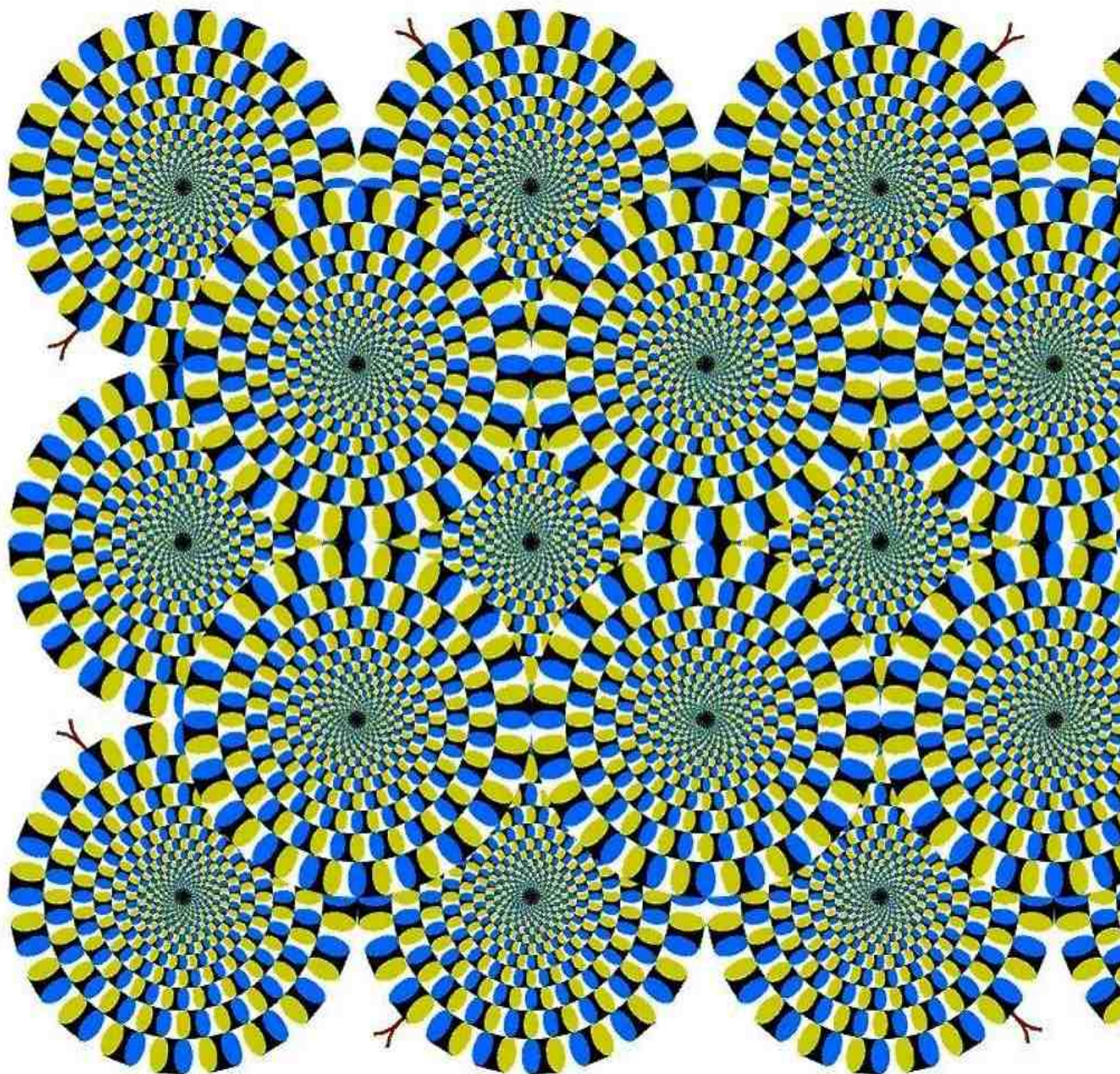
