

15th Annual Fish Fry Breaking Records

This year's "World Famous" Fish Fry is off to a flying start. Every one of our first five Fish Frys have set new records for that comparative event versus all other years. We are already 503 meals over last year's numbers, and last year was a record year. We hope to break 7,000 in 2011. Fred Kahlil of TV Channel 11 Alive featured our last fry on his "Unique Eats" news segment. Fred is an All Saints parishioner.

This bodes well for another annual record, especially if the weather is good from here on out. Our last Friday fry this year recorded our ninth 1,000+ night in our history. We thank Dave Riedinger and Anita Mitchell for their continuing detailed statistical analysis.

To put our sales increases in perspective, our very first Fry in 1997 sold 2007 total meals. By the year 2000, we were just under 4,000. The curve just keeps going up and we are at capacity of our facilities. Next year we will need to make some dramatic changes if we wish to continue our rapid sales escalation.

Two recently-received charity requests will be brought up before the council at the April meeting. Please come and opine



Brother Joseph Wittman Passes



We were saddened to learn that 3rd degree brother, Joseph Wittman, 79, one of our first Council 11402 brothers, passed away on March 9, 2011 after a prolonged illness. Joe and Evelyn Wittman were honored in our May 2006 newsletter for celebrating their 50th wedding anniversary,. They were the first such couple to get such council recognition and now that number has reached some dozens. Wittman is the 31st council brother to pass and the third this year in the first three months. He suffered from acute Alzheimer's disease.

Introduced by a mutual friend while Joe was attending St. John's University in Brooklyn, they were surprised to learn that they both worked at Royal Globe Insurance. He worked part-time and Evelyn full-time in the Data

Processing Department.

In 1955, Joe joined the K of C Glendale Council, graduated from St. John's, joined the US Navy and went on active duty in May. He was commissioned an Ensign and assigned to Aviation Maintenance. He and Evelyn became engaged in December.

In 1956, he and Evelyn were married by an old friend, Monsignor Tom Hendel, and soon after Joe left for an extended cruise. He served on two carriers (USS Saratoga and USS Forrestal). His naval career exceeded 23 years and he retired from the Navy Reserve in 1978 as a Commander.

Joe was active with the Knights for several years, until job relocations and family commitments intervened. He moved from New York City to Atlanta as Group Vice President of NDC in 1980. Soon after Council 11402 was created, Joe reapplied for activation of membership. He served in our Council as Retention and Recruiting Chairman and helped in the renovation of McGivney Hall by doing much of the tile work. Through all this, Evelyn kept the home fires burning.

His later career was Adjunct Instructor with *Gwinnett Technical College* teaching Small Business Accounting. This position requires classroom presence on Tuesdays and Thursdays and again created conflicts with K of C activities.

Evelyn and Joe were blessed with five children (Richard, Patricia, Robert, Marianne and Joseph) and also three grandchildren (Christine, John and Elizabeth.) Please pray for Joe, Evelyn, and the extended family.

Our brother, Fr. Bill Hao, said a special Mass for Joe on March 19th (appropriately St. Joseph Feast Day) in the chapel. Deacon Ray Egan has also scheduled five parish Masses for him, as we do for all deceased brothers.

Combined 1st/2nd Degree at McGivney

We always hold a 1st degree exemplification on the last Tuesday of the month at McGivney, so the one now scheduled for Tuesday, March 29th in no big surprise. This time, however, we are sweetening the pot. Right after the 1st degree exemplification, we will turn right around and have a 2nd degree exemplification. Eight brand new candidates will become brothers at the regular 7:30 1st degree ceremony. Then after a short intermission, they have the opportunity to attend the 2nd degree ceremony. Two for the price of one.

All brothers who are currently 1st through 4th degree are invited as observers for the first ceremony. Then the new and previous 1st degree brothers go upstairs to the antechamber awaiting the 2nd degree.

This dual ceremony is important because on Saturday, April 16th, All Saints will hold its annual 3rd Degree exemplification in our parish Social Hall, and we want all our brothers to have a shot at becoming a full 3rd degree knight in our own house.

The April 16th 3rd degree exemplification will be a big deal with brothers coming from all over the northern part of Georgia from dozens of councils.

All Saints has 74 first degree members, 33 second degree members, 118 third degree members, and now 100 fourth degree members for a total of 325. That means that 74 existing first-degree brothers plus any new candidates can potentially end up as 2nd degree brothers on March 29th. These people plus the existing 33 second degree brothers could form a huge contingent for our April 16th third degree. These would then be added to the pool of 118 existing 3rd degree brothers. Mature councils are known by the number of high-ranking brothers they can foster. We are a mature council that can get even more so.

Candidates for both first and second degree ceremonies will register before the first ceremony. Existing first degree members may still register after the first degree ceremony ends if they do not wish to observe the first ceremony Doors will briefly reopen after that first ceremony concludes. This should be about 8:30 PM.

We hope that after the evening ends, the number of our 1st degree members is very small.

Another combined 1st/2nd degree ceremony will be held at Mary Our Queen Council 14944 at 6260 The Corners Parkways, Norcross 30092 on Saturday morning, April 9th. This is yet another chance to become a 3rd degree at our social hall on April 16th.






