We welcomed seven new first degree brothers into our council last Tuesday making us just one short of Double Star for this Fraternal Year. In case you think that the Fish Frys are the only thing that goes on at All Saints during Lent, your council, led by brand new Knight Bill Herald, was instrumental in helping put on the *Rally for Religious Freedom* downtown at the Capitol at noon on Friday March 23. Nearly a thousand people came out in the middle of a workday to demonstrate in support of their First Amendment Freedom.

Friday night, March 23 was also the first of two "PRAISE HIM" concerts put on by the Missionaries of the Poor at All Saints. The

other one was on Sunday. The Knights did an amazing job transforming the Gym from the Fish Fry restaurant to the "PRAISE HIM" Concert Hall. Truly, the age of miracles is not past!!

We had significant participation from the Knights at the Christ Renews His Parish program on the weekend of March 10-11. We also had good participation in the Men's Lenten Evening of Reflection, on March 20 at which Brother Knight, Fr. David Daly, gave a spiritual talk after the 7:00 PM mass followed by an opportunity for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. After that, Fr. Daly, Fr. Peek and Fr. Kerr (of the Missionaries of the Poor) joined us at McGivney Hall for some fellowship.

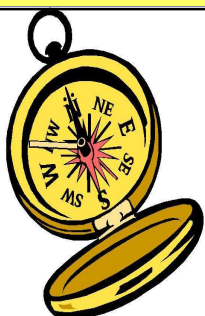
As I write this, we are preparing for the final Friday Fish Fry of the Lenten Season. Hopefully, all of us have taken this opportunity to examine

Council Officer Elections in June



Every year at our June Council meeting we elect a slate of officers to serve for the following fraternal year -- July 1st through June 30th. All elected offices are re-voted.

The council has a nominating committee consisting of the three Trustees, Lou Hlad, Gert Kampfer, and Don Myers. The duty of these three is to poll the current officers to ascertain if they are amenable to continuing for another year and to talk to other council members that they believe would make valuable officers for that year or the future.

The nominating committee then makes a public non-binding recommendation for each of the offices as a starting point. However, any council member attaining the 3rd degree is eligible to become an officer in any of the officer positions and may make his desire known to run for any office against any slate nominee. A member may make known his desire to run as late as the moment before the vote is to be taken for an office.

The elected officers are: Grand Knight, Deputy Grand Knight, Chancellor, Advocate, Treasurer, Recorder, Warden, two Inside Guards, and two Outside Guards. The Grand Knight appoints the Financial Secretary, the Chaplain, and the Lecturer.

The six chairmen of the council subcommittees are also appointed by the Grand Knight and those positions need not be filled by 3rd or 4th degree members. The committees are Youth, Family, Church, Community, Council, and Right-to-Life. They manage any activity that falls into their particular category.

All Saints Acolyte Program Expansion



All Saints 11402 has a unique service program in all the world. Our brothers serve on the altar for every funeral held at our parish. They also serve at times for special occasions. There is about one funeral per week on average.

Currently 75 brothers are arranged into five teams, each with a team captain. Their director is Norb Braza at nlbraza@aol.com and 770-393-8645. Four teams rotate duties for funerals during the week and the fifth team is the weekend team for brothers that have fulltime jobs.

Each brother acolyte wears a navy blue blazer, grey dress slacks, white shirt, black dress shoes, and a special blue tie with KofC logos. The tie is given to all members free of charge to ensure uniformity of appearance. A typical Mass team consists of a cross bearer, two candle bearers, water and wine bearers. If available a sixth brother is used for incense bearer and to balance the team on the altar. Serving on the altar for Mass is a huge honor and responsibility.

All altar movements are choreographed for uniformity, dignity, and reverence. Training is not difficult. The altar items, candles, and chairs are handled before Mass by the team and stored away afterward. Any attendee at an All Saints funeral can not help but be impressed by the beauty of the unique ceremony. We constantly receive thanks and compliments from family and friends of the deceased. The team is always invited to church receptions held afterward.

If you were an altar server in your youth, or even if you were not, we hope that you will consider joining this beautiful ministry started by our own Sir Knight Monsignor Kiernan in 1997. He was having trouble finding altar servers on school days and turned to the Knights. We have handled every funeral at All Saints since that time. **Consider joining one of our teams. We are in special need of additional weekend acolytes.** This timeframe allows our younger working brothers to take a very important and active part in council activities. And if truth be told, it is a lot of fun.

We are again in the debt of the Dunwoody Crier Newspaper for the nice article in their March 21, 2012 edition (above left) that publicized our 2012 Lenten Fish Fry. These articles especially broaden the awareness of our event to non-parishioners who dine with us in great numbers. This year we sold over 8,000 total Lenten meals !!

It doesn't seem possible that the council could continue breaking meal sales records year after year, but we do. Moving the dining area to the gymnasium this year was a shot in the arm for an event that was busting at the seams in the small parish social hall.

With an infusion of newly-purchased tables and comfortable chairs and a second state-of-the-art kitchen built to the left of the stage, the event is much more compact in its layout now. Previously, the knights cooked food in three locations --- the social hall kitchen, a tent set up outside the social hall, and the old existing kitchen in the gym. Food items were walked and driven by golf carts to the social hall dining area. Now, with two adjoining kitchens in the gym, all the food items are prepared just a few feet apart and brought faster to the diners.

When we were selling 1,000 meals in three hours, we used to advertise that we produced a meal in just over 10 seconds. Now with the nightly meals exceeding 1,200 in three hours, we produce a meal every 9 seconds!! We understand that the speed of light will probably be a future limiting factor. Thanks to all who helped.

Our March 27th First Degree ceremony provided another healthy group of 7 brothers, two of which were already “brothers”.

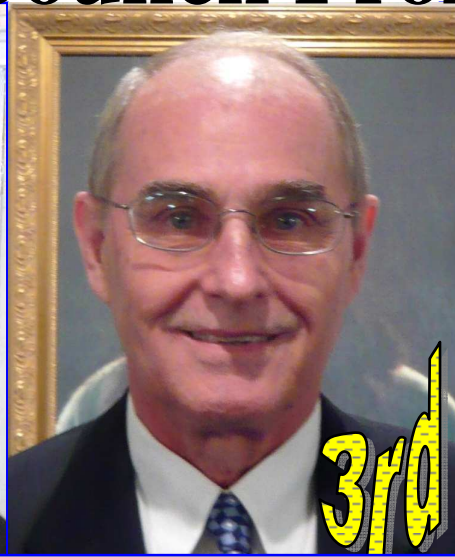

April Insurance Tip --- Four Parts of Retirement: Phase One

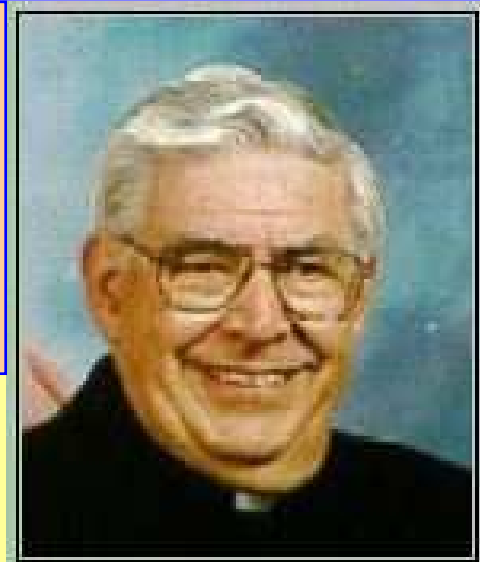

At the airport, the chapel for the first time in memory hosted an Ash Wednesday Communion service. Two Catholic deacons and a Protestant minister distributed ashes all day. The day isn't just a Catholic observance anymore. Women and men of other Christian faiths also received ashes.

Deacons Ray Egan and Gerald Collins marked the foreheads with the sign of the cross for all who asked.

"We don't care (whether people are Catholic). If they are Christian, they know why we look to be marked," said Deacon Egan. "We are here to serve all the people," he said. Deacon Collins, who also ministers at Christ Our Hope Church, Lithonia, said helping at the airport on this popular day "isn't that different from a parish. People still need to be served," he said. Earlier, the deacons led a prayer service. The roar of a jet engine filled the room. At the airport, the chapel for the first time in memory hosted an Ash Wednesday Communion service. Two Catholic deacons and a Protestant minister distributed ashes all day.

Deacon Egan, who spends much time in the airport ministry, said Lent is "a time of searching." He said people have ashes on their forehead as a sign of their faith and a sign of penitence. People should wear the sign of the cross "proudly, but be of good cheer," he said.



The Interfaith Chapel serves the tens of thousands of airport workers and also the 92+ millions who fly through Atlanta with a quiet, reflection space. Atlanta religious leaders made it possible. It is sustained by a nonprofit organization, the Interfaith Airport Chaplaincy, funded by donations and foundation grants. Deacon Egan called it the largest unofficial parish in the archdiocese. Much of the time for an airport chaplain is spent on the concourses, talking with travelers and workers, he said.

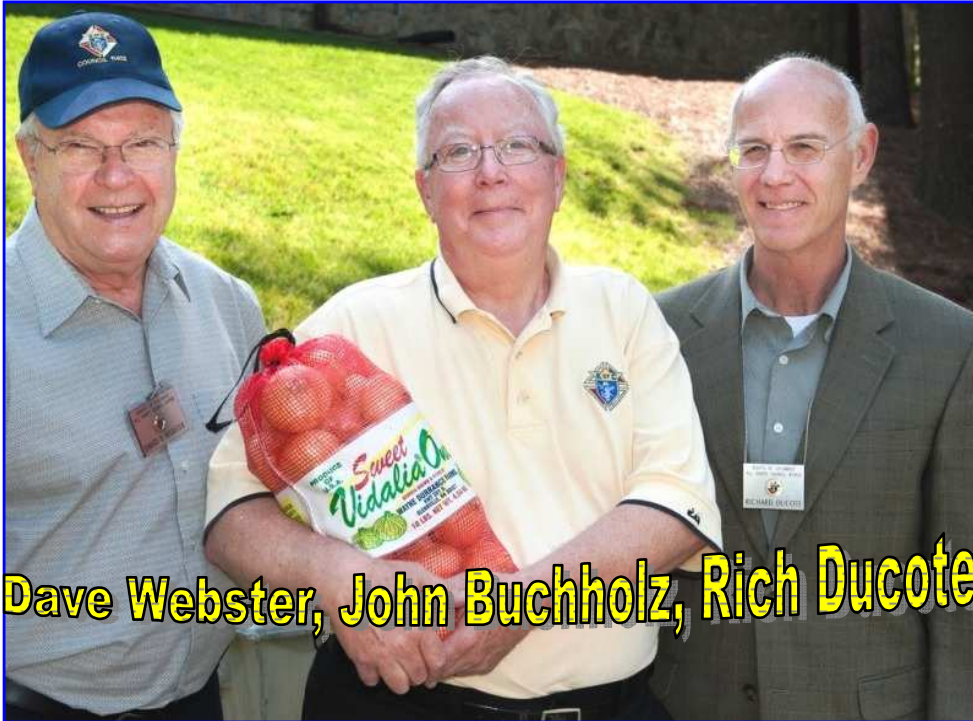

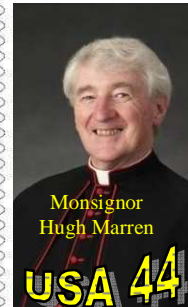
