Easter. Hopefully, it included watching Pope Francis celebrate his first Easter Mass from St. Peter's Basilica Square in Vatican City.

While the Pope is not a Knight, he certainly shares our sense of serving the poor and less fortunate, as noted by Supreme Knight Carl Anderson. "Pope Francis is well known for his emphasis on charity — the first principle of the Knights of Columbus," said Anderson.

He added that the Knights plan to work with Pope Francis throughout his pontificate to further the mission of the Church. To quote the Supreme Knight, "both in our efforts for evangelization and in our charitable work, we will strive with him to bring the light of Christ to the people of our continent during his historic pontificate."

Anderson believes the choice of Francis is "certainly going to have a large impact on Hispanics" in the United States, who are overwhelmingly Catholic, but "a big challenge for the church obviously is secularization and the success of some Protestant denominations" seeking converts.

Noting Francis' "very visible, very determined and consistent work for charity and solidarity

with the poor," Anderson said, "I think this is going to have a verv large impact on the church universally, but also in the church in the **United States.**"

Additional Acolytes Still Needed

All Saints Council 11402 has a special parish service ministry that may be unique over all the councils in the world. We know of no other council that provides rotating teams of knight altar servers that assist on the altar at all funeral Masses in their parish. We currently have about 70 brothers assigned to 5 teams that provide this service first requested by former pastor Monsignor Donald Kiernan in 1998.

Acolytes wear matching outfits composed of navy blue blazers, medium grey dress slacks, white shirts, black shoes and socks. The council provides each with a blue Knights of Columbus logo tie worth \$30. A full complement of Mass acolytes might consist of a cross bearer, two torch bearers, two water and wine handlers, and an incense bearer. Team members alternate roles and learn them all in good time.

Visitors to All Saints marvel at the reverence and professionalism of the formal presentation that each parish funeral exhibits. There are about 50 funerals per year at All Saints, and some other special Mass occasions utilize our teams as well. If you work during the week, we can still use you on Saturdays or for special evening Masses.

Knights Host Homeless Shelters

On Sunday, March 24, our Council hosted a second homeless shelter night with Brother Len Dorrien in charge of this ministry.

We start out by making 200 simple sandwiches for the goodie bags we give to the men in the morning.

The ladies prepare a nutritious meal in the shelter kitchen and the knights act as waiters, monitors, and companions to the homeless through the night after the ladies head home.

The men (and knights) sleep on mattresses spread over the floor. About 100 homeless are served each night during the winter season.





The homeless men partake in a filling meal and then settle down for the night on their provided mattresses.

The brothers care for them during the entire night and into the breakfast hour with coffee, donuts, headache pills, conversation, and whatever else they might need.

Then they are given food bags and they must again return to the streets.




We lose about 1,000 veterans of that great conflict every day.


