Grand Knight's Report

Brothers:

I truly don't know where to start, as this has been an amazing time for Council 11402. So I'll start at the beginning with a Fish Fry history lesson ripped from the pages of an article written, almost a decade ago, by our now esteemed Past Grand Knight – and newsletter editor - Lou Hlad.

The now famous Lenten Fish Fry Dinners started in 1997. Brother Knights Al Garofalo and George Novac approached Tony Ardagna with the notion.

Tony was reluctant, along with Msgr. Kiernan, because of the available facilities and the manpower necessary to make the venture a success. They were encouraged, however, by council members and decided to move forward with the project.

Tony's son, Joe Ardagno and Greg Wakham of Taco Mac, a local restaurant chain, worked diligently with the Knights the first year to get the project rolling. 2007 meals were prepared during the first year.

The number of meals increased steadily year after year. At start of the 2006 season, we dedicated our Lenten Fish Fry to Tony Ardagna, the major contributor to our success who passed away on December 28th, 2005. During the 2006 Lenten Season, we served 5621 meals and 1283 clam chowders.

I wanted to pass along the history of the Fish Fry to give some perspective to this past Friday night, when we served an all-time record of 1,422 meals! That's an average of 7.9 meals per minute (one every 7.7 seconds) in near-flawless fashion. Meals were served to diners in an average time of 5-10 minutes.

At one point in the evening, I saw two of Dunwoody's most prominent Protestant pastors breaking bread with us (who knows,

maybe we'll see them at All Saints on Sundays as well) !

As we head into the final two Fish Frys, we are 469 meals ahead of our season-long record of 8,008. With DeKalb County on spring break starting this coming weekend, our numbers could be down a bit for the final two Frys, but I'll be very surprised if that record survives.

I want to thank everyone that has worked so hard to make the Fish Frys an overwhelming success. Your unity and fraternity have been awesome, as well as the manner in which you greet and treat our diners. I can't tell you the number of patrons, many non-All Saints parishioners, who compliment the Knights for helping foster an amazing sense of community.

"Give me a fish and I'll eat for a day. Teach me to fish and I'll eat for a lifetime. Come to the Fish Fry and I'll eat a fabulous meal, served lickety-split, in a wonderful atmosphere by the truly selfless Knights of Columbus, Council 11402!"

While the Fish Fry remains our signature fundraiser, I wouldn't be surprised if our Bingo games share top-billing in a few years.

Our first public Bingo was this past Thursday evening, and it could not have gone much better. A nice group of 72 players had a great time winning \$490 in prize money, with the council netting more than \$600.

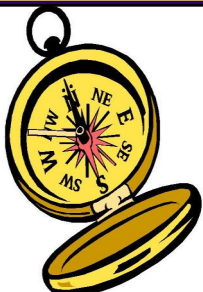

Knights Host Homeless Shelter Nights



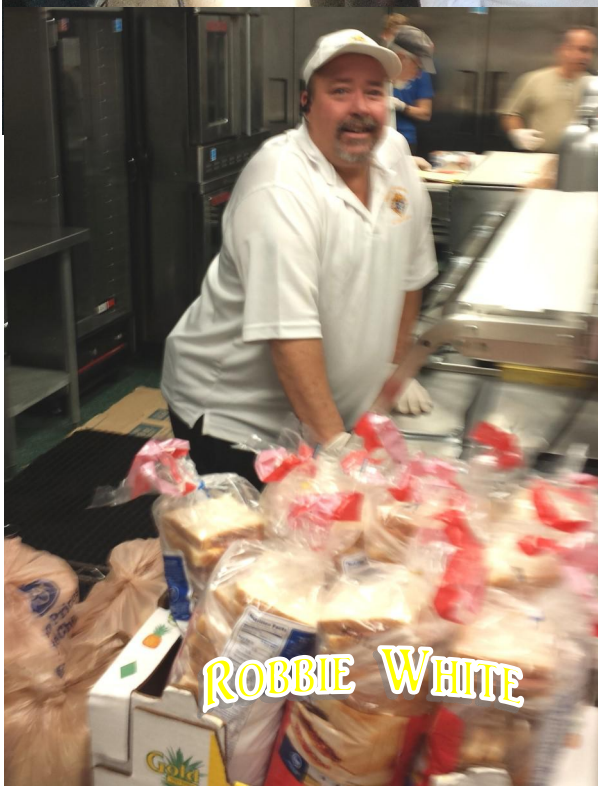

As our council does every year, the brothers hosted two nights out of the ten parish-scheduled nights at the downtown homeless shelter in the shadow of the state capitol building.

Parish ladies provide evening meals, while the brothers make goodie bags with sandwiches, fruit, and snacks for the men as they return to the streets in the morning.

The ladies go home after the evening meal, while the brothers stay the night to keep order and minister to the 100 homeless men housed at either Central Presbyterian Church or the adjacent Shrine of the Immaculate Conception.

Brother Len Dorrien is in charge of the ten parish night commitments and assembles the teams. He has run this ministry for several years now.

If you have never volunteered for this service as yet, it is one of the most rewarding things that the knights do. Please consider doing it next year.

Supporting “Jackets for Jackets” Program

At our February meeting, Brother Bernie Marino alerted the council to a charitable program at Georgia Tech that provides men’s and women’s suits to students with financial needs to allow them to look properly groomed for job interviews. This program has the opportunity of raising the Knight profile there to help the new Georgia tech Council as well. Please consider it.

Gentlemen we have an opportunity to participate in the “**Jackets for Jackets**,” program initiated by the Georgia Tech Center for Career Development & Discovery.

The Tech campus is a diverse place with students coming from a variety of economic backgrounds. Georgia Tech has some students who, due to financial hardship, are delaying their job searches or trying to conduct them without professional attire. It is common for students to approach the Development Center at Tech and seek help because they are unable to afford a suit. So, let’s lend our help!

If you have any suits that you no longer wear, they are candidates for donation to “Jackets for Jackets.” More specifically, women’s and men’s suits of all sizes that are navy blue, dark grey, or black are “suitable” to help students look as sharp and professional as possible for their job search activities.

All donated suits should be dry clean “ready” and left in the dry cleaner bag.

If you have any concerns about hygiene, the student who borrows the suit must show proof of dry cleaning when returning it to Tech.

GT pins will be attached to each suit, and a database for tracking each suit will be employed.

April Tip -- Four Parts of Retirement. Phase One.

In the next four articles, I would like to discuss a goal that's on many workers' radar: retirement. To some, retirement is the pot of gold at the end of the rainbow or the reward after a long career. It's a time to relax, take up a hobby and enjoy life. 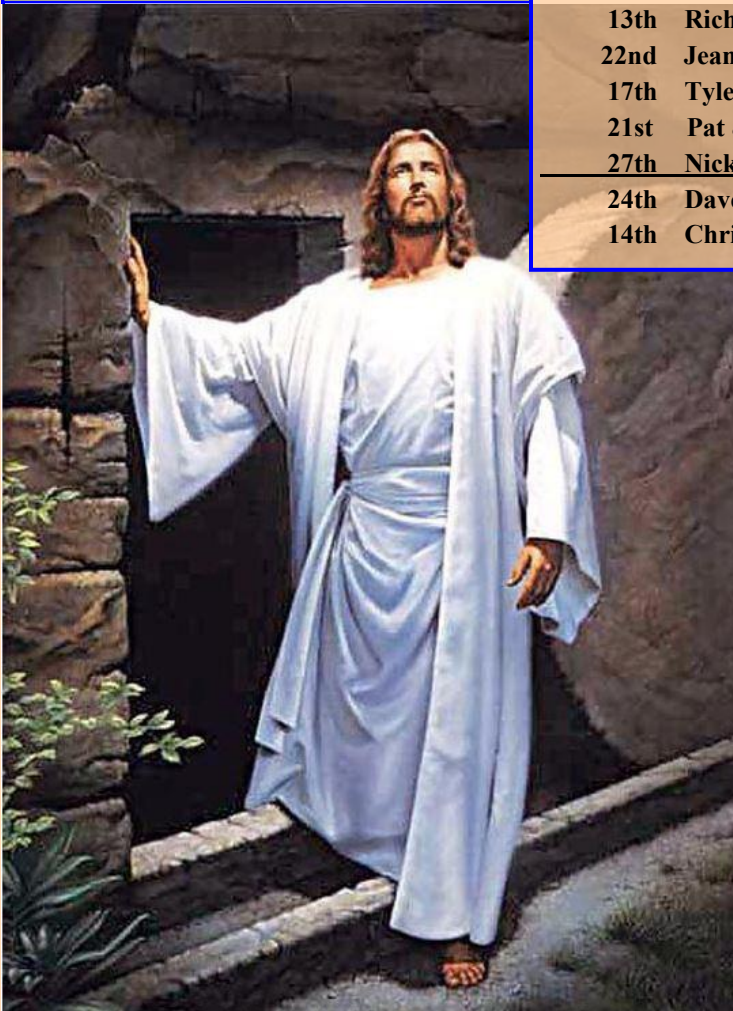

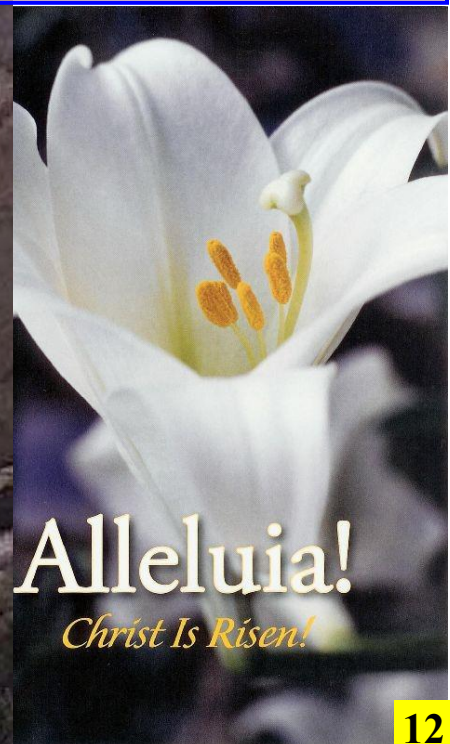
O God, our Creator, all life is in your hands from conception until death. **Help us to cherish our children** and to reverence the awesome privilege of our share in creation.

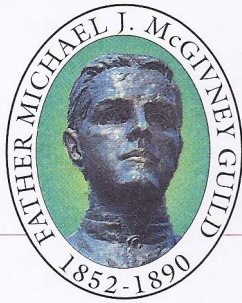

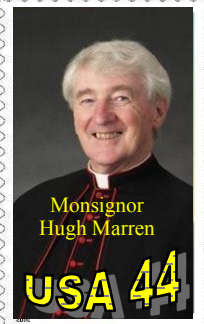
