Another Amazing Fish Fry Concludes

Despite a very rainy string of Fridays, our fish fry events set all-time records for five individual dates — the Knights-only fry, Friday 2, Friday 3, Friday 5, and Friday 6.. Even with these 5 individual date records, we were not quite able to exceed our total record of 8,436 meals served for all of Lent. We fell a mere 14 meals short. Our 19th annual event was one of the smoothest-running event ever.

If we hadn't had the weather anomalies that occurred on Ash Wednesday and the first Friday, we would have blown away the annual total for last year... but since we were down on the first Friday by 363 meals from last year's first Friday, we ended the year 14 meals shy of beating last year.

This is amazing stuff! I talk to MANY of the folks that dine with us each Friday. Besides the fact that we have the Methodists, Baptists, and members of the Jewish faith join us every week, we also have people that come from other parishes that are simply blown away and impressed by our All Saints Knights of Columbus council. Tootsie Roll Drive is Great Success

Our brother knights spent two weekends outside the All Saints church doors and outside local Kroger, Ace Hardware, Walgreens, and Target doors to hand out complementary tootsie rolls and solicit contributions for people with intellectual disabilities.

The generosity of the community was again evident with many mentioning how they enjoyed our Lenten Fish Frys. Sir Knights Gene Gannon and Greg Crnkovich managed the events. Sir Knight BJ Van Gundy was able to round up some rolling carts for us that were essential.

The final counting of proceeds continues with a very preliminary estimate of about \$3,610 being collected for intellectual charities. It is expected that our council will not deduct the \$500 cost of the tootsie rolls and will vote to send the entire amount to the Georgia State Council for addition to the similar collections for all 107 councils in Georgia. The State Council then returns 50% of the individual amounts collected per council back to each Council for local giving. The State then contributes its larger portion to its identified targeted intellectual charities for greater impact. Here are some photos.

This year again our Council sponsored two of the days assigned to All Saints Parish on Sunday February 15th and Sunday March 15th. The shelter is housed at both the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception and Central Presbyterian Church. The two churches are adjacent in the shadow of the Georgia Capitol and volunteers from All Saints manage both facilities totaling 100 homeless men on assigned days.

Woman from All Saints cook an evening meal for the men and leave for home afterward. Knights stay the night with the men and tend to their needs until morning. Sandwiches made by the brothers are parting gifts for the men as they return to the streets. Our Sir Knight Len Dorrien is in charge of our efforts. 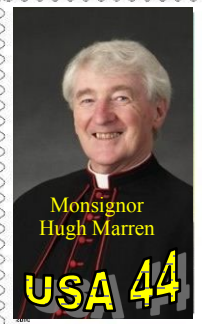
