Grand Knight's Report

Worthy Brothers:

Council 11402 is off to another great start this fraternal year! We have a good group of enthusiastic, committed Officers and Program Chairs.

We met a few weeks, ago, to outline the budget for FY 2007-2008 and to review our "baseline" of programs. Several ideas were generated for new programs during the course of the year, and we're looking forward to implementing them.

One of the things we're going to try to do this year is

align ourselves better with programs being run on the State and Supreme levels. This includes participation in the Substance Abuse Awareness campaigns and the Wheelchair charity drives. Some more information on these programs will be forthcoming.

Congratulations are in order, too, for our entry in the **Dunwoody Salutes America 4**th **of July Parade.** Our float "*The Santa Maria*" won 1st prize in the Non-Profit/ Religious category. Many Brother Knights helped build and outfit the float.

Special mention must be made of the work by Nan Eberley and Mary Ann Lehman on the sails. These ladies spent three long days and two nights hand-lettering and stenciling the sails.

Another "tip o' the hat" to Brother Knights Mike Will, Ron Collins, and Sam Portis

who did the majority of construction on the float, and Brother Knight Kent Polzin for his help in arranging the tractor and trailer used during the parade. Brother Knight John Paul supplied the audio system and a "killer" mix tape which helped put us "over the top!" Many thanks, too, to all the Knights and family members who walked the parade route, passing out candy, and generally adding to the fun!!!

August is going to be a busy month for Council 11402. We have three projects that will require assistance from the membership, each involving different skill sets.

We will be assisting the Sullivan Center in painting and upgrading their cafeteria ceilings. The drywall installation is being done by volunteers from UPS, and 11402 is going to provide professional taping for the joints. Our volunteers will then be involved in painting a textured surface onto the ceiling.

We've also offered to assist the "People Making Progress" program by repainting their offices and conference rooms, plus a little "touch up" in areas that need some TLC.

Finally, our own *All Saints Pre-School* has asked us to reprise our efforts to assemble and install some new furniture and fixtures as they expand into more space in the Activities building. Most of these projects will occur during the weekends in August and will involve no more than a day of activity. We know you'll be responsive and want to "pitch in" to help.

The last weekend of August is our annual Spiritual Retreat. This two-day event features a presentation by Deacon Alfred Mitchell, overnight lodging and dining at Simpsonwood Retreat Center in Norcross, and an opportunity to reconnect spiritually and personally with your Brother Knights. Finally, I'd like to "look ahead". On Saturday, September 8th from 9 AM to 3 PM, Council 11402 will be hosting a **2nd and 3rd Degree Ceremonial** in our own Social Hall. As I recall, we have not hosted these advanced ceremonials since Summer, 2000. These are two separate ceremonials, run sequentially,

and followed by a luncheon provided by Council 11402.

We need several volunteers to assist us with set-up, operations, and luncheon during the course of the day. More important, however, is the opportunity for our Brother Knights in the 1st degree to move through the process of full Knighthood by taking the 3rd Degree.

Approximately 1/3 of our membership has not advanced to the $3^{\rm rd}$ Degree, and we hope that most of you will avail yourself of this opportunity. There is no cost to you to attend, lunch is provided by the Council, and the lessons learned in becoming a $2^{\rm nd}$ and $3^{\rm rd}$ Degree member are life-changing and permanent. There is no better way to reaffirm your commitment to the Knights than by becoming a $3^{\rm rd}$ Degree member.

Have we got a treat for you!! Don't miss this one.

We didn't just go out and get a retreat master for our August Council Retreat, we signed up the Director of the Diaconate of the Atlanta Archdiocese—who just happens to be a nationally-renowned "story teller." Deacon Alfred Mitchell uses storytelling techniques as his special way of bringing his homilies alive and making them meaningful. (Remind you of another famous parable-teller?)

He learned the art of storytelling as a boy in South Carolina at his beloved grandmother's knee. Many of the stories she told were about family members and residents of the small town in which they lived. Some were humorous and all contained a moral of some kind. He tells the same type of stories.

Mitchell was ordained to the diaconate in May of 1987 and assigned to the parish of *Saints Peter and Paul* in Decatur. He was appointed the *Director of the Atlanta Archdiocese Deacon Personnel* soon after in 1990. His professional involvement with storytelling began right after he became a deacon and has evolved until this day. He teaches seminars on storytelling and belongs to seven societies that foster this unusual craft. He is a founding member of the National Association of African-American Catholic Deacons (NAAACD).

In his own words:

"I believe strongly in the power of stories. They have a way of putting people at ease. Stories help us answer three very important questions. Who am I? Where do I come from? And where am I going?"

Our retreat topic is "A Walk With Jesus — From the Desert to Emmaus." The retreat generally consists of an opening prayer or hymn for each talk. This is followed by a passage from scripture, a story, short lecture and reflection. Time is always allowed for the participants to reflect on what has been said.

Our retreat will again be held at the excellent facility of the *Simpsonwood Conference and Retreat Center*. See their web site at www.simpsonwood.org. Last year 25 of our members attended the two-day retreat and came away very impressed at the professionalism of this venue. The rooms are comfortable, the cafeteria is well-stocked, the buildings are akin to a hotel, and there is ample serenity in the surrounding woods for walking, meditation, and reflection. There will be a total of five formal lesson talks by the retreat master.

We expect the <u>total</u> cost to be about <u>\$95 per person</u>— not bad for two days lodging, all the food you can eat, and comfortable conference hall accommodations. Private rooms are available at a total cost of <u>\$128 per person</u> if so desired.

The retreat will run from 8 AM on Saturday August 25 to a concluding noon lunch on Sunday August 26. Vigil Mass to fulfill the Sunday obligation will be held on Saturday evening. You will still have the bulk of Sunday left to spend with family and take care of some of your weekend chores.

Help us to break new records for member participation. All members of other councils are welcome as well.

The organization is headquartered in Grimsby, Lincolnshire, United Kingdom.

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Latin Phrases Used in our Newsletter

You have probably noticed that Latin phrases are creeping into our newsletter. This is in keeping with the ancient dictum "Quidquid latine dictum sit, altum viditur" (Whatever is said in Latin sounds profound.) We certainly agree.

Our motto on the front page "Opere et Veritate" means "in deed and in truth" and was taken directly from 1 John 3,18. This motto was chosen over "Minutus cantorum, minutus balorum, minutus carborata descendum pantorum" (A little song, a little dance, a little seltzer down your pants) which was deemed to be a little long and a tad less religious.

You will be reading more Latin phrases in our publications and hearing more used in our meetings. Examples would be "Revelare pecunia" (Show me the money), "Domino vobiscum" (The pizza guy is here), "Vescere bracis meis" (Eat my shorts), "Non est mea culpa" (It is not my fault), "Perscriptio in minibus tabellariorum est" (The check is in the mail.)

There is a growing worldwide interest in Latin, and you probably read that the Pope is again allowing more Masses to be said in Latin. This Council will be doing its part to educate our members in the proper use of this beautiful language.

Atlanta Fourth Degree to be Held on October 13th

On Saturday October 13th, a Fourth Degree Exemplification will be held at 10 AM at the *Atlanta Airport Marriott Hotel*. It is a grandiose affair with hundreds of candidates in black tuxedos and over a hundred honor guards in regalia. It is not something you will easily forget. This is the culmination of Father McGivney's dream for a huge, active organization that can make a difference in society. Unsuspecting onlookers staying at the hotel are usually in shock and awe—and especially if they are non-Catholics who are not familiar with the Knights of Columbus.

The All Saints Council has about 75 third degree members. There is no reason that we can not field a huge contingent of candidates, spouses, and officer observers to make this a big Council event. Our sister councils in the Watters Assembly always field sizeable groups and they all have less members. For that reason, all 3rd degree members will be alerted. Because this is a fourth degree event, our Watters Assembly provides the coordination rather than our Council.

This event will not be without costs— a tuxedo may have to be purchased, there are costs for the hotel ballroom rental, the cocktail reception, the spouses' lunch during the closed exemplification, the group Mass, and the seated dinner later. Don't plan to cut the grass on this day, it is an all-day affair. It will leave a favorable, lasting impression on candidates.

- Step 1: Obtain a Form 4 to register for the ceremony. These are available at McGivney. Fill one out and return it to us.
- Step 2: Get a regular black tuxedo (no tails) if you don't already own one. You will need a plain white tuxedo dress shirt (no frilly lace, no upward wing collar), a black cummerbund (no vest), studs and cuff links, a black bow tie, and shined dress shoes. We suggest <u>purchase</u> for about \$260, rather than <u>rental</u> over \$100. Fourth degree Sir Knights often use tuxedos for other Assembly formal events or optional honor guard duty. If you ever go on an ocean cruise, they also have a formal captain's tux dress-up night. You will be presented a ceremonial baldric during the event (a colorful diagonal K of C sash that goes across your chest.)

Tuxedos may be purchased anywhere. A good local source is located in the new huge Perimeter Place shopping center across from Perimeter Mall. The store below is just off the central car roundabout circle.

Step 3: Pay the other event costs to Bob Heald of our council (who is also the comptroller of the Watters Assembly.)

Some, like the spouse's luncheon and the formal dinner, are optional. These were typical costs last year:

Candidate fee \$70, Banquet \$42 (non-candidate), Ladies Luncheon \$25 each, Buffet after degree \$15 each.

(Candidate fee includes, one Banquet ticket, Fourth Degree lapel pin, Social Baldric, and Degree Certificate)
