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Grand Knight's Report

Brothers,

We begin the new Fraternal Year with a healthy council consisting of 291 members—just a few from my very arbitrary goal of 300.

Some of these brothers are slated to spin off into a new sister council now forming at *Mary Our Queen Parish*. Helping the Order to expand will probably become our greatest achievement of the new year. I hope we always maintain a specially close relationship when this council is chartered.

On Saturday, September 12th, All Saints will host

a huge 3rd Degree exemplification in our Social Hall. You will recall that last September, 120 candidates came to our similar event from all over the state. Nobody knows how many will show up on our doorstep this year.

I hope that many of you will attend as observers. The State Deputy and all his officers will attend and later hold their periodic meeting here. It is quite an honor for our council.

Since we only have 17 second degree members eligible for this ceremony, we will have our work cut out promoting many of our 67 first degree brothers to second degree before Sept. 12th. Our objective is to greatly increase the number of third degree (122) and fourth degree (85) we have.

Our attention is also highly focused on the August 22/23 retreat at Simpsonwood. There are a few slots still open. Our limit is 40 participants. Don't be left out. It promises to be a very special weekend.

Those of you who haven't been to McGivney in a while will be surprised to see our 52" high def TV that doubles in an audio/visual presentation role. We expect to hold more sports evenings and social and educational events in our beautiful hall. Our back office is being retrofitted with storage cabinets and surface space for a computer lab.

Our first venture into education will be partnership with the parish adult education department to hold

an eight-part class on *Christian Fatherhood* for young fathers. Sunday sessions will be held at 11:30 AM in McGivney on September 13, 20, 27, October 18,25, and November 1, 15, and 22.

Brothers Durthaler and Tobia set up the program with Katie Hall of the Adult Education Department. Our new audio/visual equipment will be employed. We hope that all brothers with young children will sign up to attend this important series touted by the Order in a very recent KofC *Columbian Magazine*.

Our support of parish youth continues in August as

we host our annual *Altar Server Outing* on Saturday, August 15th, a *Welcome Back to High School Cookout* at our McGivney Hall on Sunday, August 16th, after 6 PM Mass, and finally a *Welcome Back to College Cookout* with Father Bryan Small at Emory Catholic Center.

Our recent very pleasant success with the revived council family dinner concept held at *Oscar's Villa Capri Restaurant* has encouraged us to add another even larger family dinner to our calendar.

On Sunday evening, September 20th, our second such event is now scheduled at <u>Altobeli's</u> at Old Alabama and Haynes Bridge Roads. This fine dinner will be only \$30 per plate including tax and tip (how <u>do</u> we do it?) We should be able to easily accommodate 48 or more folks. A detailed flyer is in this newsletter. We anticipate a sellout.

Our officers never sleep. They are busy planning a large *Columbus Day Knights of Columbus Golf Tournament* on October 12th and a parish *Monte Carlo Night* on November 20th. Throw in a **Fourth Degree Exemplification** at the Atlanta Airport Westin Hotel on November 7th as a pot sweetener.

Council Night at Altobeli's Italian Restaurant

On Sunday, September 20th, at 6PM, the council will hold its second dinner outing for knights, spouses, and guests at the *Altobeli's Restaurant and Piano Bar* at 3000 Old Alabama Road and Haynes Bridge Road (see *www.altobelis.com*).

We will be able to accommodate a maximum of 48 people in a reserved area of tables within view of the entertainment. A special menu with special pricing has been arranged to make the evening economical, delicious, and fun.

We will offer a choice of the 3 entrees shown below on the sample menu. The attendees do "NOT" have to make their selection until the night of the dinner.

To keep the price reasonable, we did not include a dessert, since we suspect that the majority of older folks do not order desserts late in the evening.



If we wish, the council can supply a layer cake from Publix or Costco and bring it to the dinner. They normally charge \$1.95 a plate service charge, but for us they will do it at "NO CHARGE". We do not have to make that decision before.

The price for this enjoyable evening will be only \$30.00 per person which INCLUDES TAX & TIP.



He will acknowledge each receipt of a check with a confirmation e-mail. **Because Jack is making all arrangements**, **reservations with him are a must.** When the number of persons exceeds 48, a waiting list will be created. Those on that list can only be accommodated when cancellations are received.

We might want to point out that one complementary glass of wine (red or white) will be offered to each attendee, but they can purchase additional wine or spirits from the bar or by giving a credit card to the waiter. We do not wish to run a tab and then try to get the money from each Knight later. Your \$30 per person check should suffice for the base meal with no surprises.

Altobeli's is located in the Kroger Shopping Center at the intersection of Old Alabama and Haynes Bridge Road, an easy drive from All Saints. We have invited the priests of All Saints parish to join us as guests, and sincerely hope they can. Don't miss this one.


August 22nd/23rd Simpsonwood Summer Retreat



On Saturday August 22nd and Sunday August 23rd, a retreat will be held at the Simpson-wood Retreat Center on Jones Bridge Circle in Norcross. The event will start Saturday morning at 8 AM just after breakfast and conclude the first day after a 7 PM Mass that fulfills the Sunday obligation. The priest celebrating that Mass will be named at a later time. The retreat will resume Sunday morning and conclude around lunchtime, still leaving the bulk of Sunday for family activities. Continuing Charitable Benevolence Efforts

Our council benevolence continued at the July 7th Business Meeting and during the entire month:

- The Charity Review Committee reported favorably on a request to donate \$1,000 for the Missionaries of the Poor in Jamaica. The motion was tabled until it can be voted before the council at the August 4th meeting.
- The Council donated the total of \$300.to All Saints Troop 434 for their summer camp fund.
- The Council donated the initial sum of \$250 to the City of Dunwoody for the purchase of a defibrbiillator unit for their fund to equip police cars. A motion for another \$1,500 will be discussed at the August meeting. A speaker from Dunwoody will make the case before the council.
- The Charity Review Committee reported favorably on a donation of \$1,500 to the general fund of the Sister Sullivan Center. The issue was tabled until a council vote at the August meeting.
- The council donated \$500 to the "Friends of Dunwoody Library" for shelves in the children's section.
- The council donated \$500 to the Nicholas House after more information was obtained on that charity.
- The council presented Beth Schmehling, Executive Director of the Eleaine Clark Center, with a check for \$1,700+.
- Sincere thanks go out to everyone who make our participation in the **Dunwoody Fourth of July Parade** a success. Special thanks go out to Bruce Malinoff for all his management. He won the Knight-of-the-Month for his efforts.
- Our sincere thanks go out to the brothers who retrofitted McGivney Hall with an audio/visual system, back office cabinetry and computer equipment to allow us to better serve the parish and the community.

This will be a large event with well over 100 candidates from all over North Georgia receiving the degree. Many state officers will be present. We request the presence of many existing 3rd and 4th degree brothers as observers. Lunch will be served afterward. There will be no charge for our Council 11403 candidates. Other candidates and all observers will be charged a modest fee for lunch.

4th Degree Exemplification — will be held at late morning (TBA) on November 7th at the Atlanta Airport Westin Hotel. Black tuxedo and evening gowns required. After the exemplification, lunch, hospitality suites, evening Mass, dinner, and dance will be held. Prices to be announced. Candidates from all over North Georgia will attend along with all state officers and dignitaries. All 3rd degree members will receive instruction packets.

McGivney Hall Upgrades and Improvements

We also will proceed with educational and social events now made possible with this new equipment.


We actually won first place in the religious banner category for the banners made by Brother Earl Cole.


