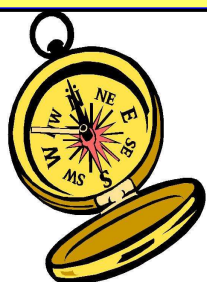
Cookout with Father Bryan Small at Emory Catholic Center. Expect more details on these events as they develop.

Knights Continue Placing Ultrasound Machines

On May 25th our Center was presented a brand new ultrasound machine donated by the Knights of Columbus. The Ultrasound Project is supported by the Knights of Columbus Culture of Life Fund. Every Knight contributes to this fund through his membership dues. Under the program, local and state councils raise funds to place the sonographs in crisis pregnancy centers, identify the centers and work with local dioceses to ensure that the centers are operated in accordance with the teaching of the Church. When 50% of the funds are raised the Supreme Council will match the local funds to purchase the machines. Past Grand Knight Paul Zock of Council 7662 in Dalton Georgia, is in the medical equipment business and is able to supply machines which retail for \$38,000 for \$22,000. St. Marguerite d'Youville Council 12905 of Lawrenceville raised \$7,500 and another \$3,500 was donated by the Georgia State Council to fund the local portion of this machine.

David Canale, Georgia State Pro-Life Director for the Knights stated: "Research shows that 70 -80% of women who are planning to abort their babies will change their minds after seeing a sonograph image of the baby. Each of these machines can save

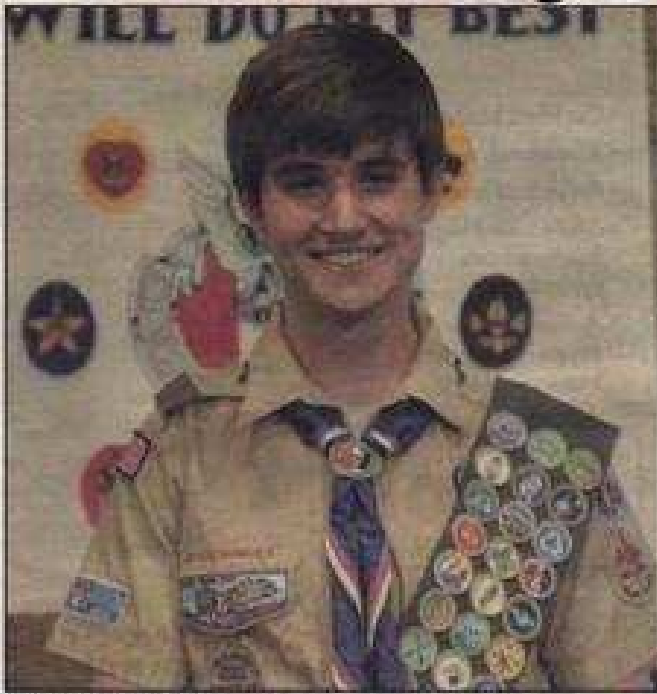
hundreds of lives per year." James St. John, Georgia State Deputy of the Knights noted that this is the 5th machine placed by the Knights in Georgia. Previously machines were placed in crisis pregnancy centers in Dalton, Decatur, and Albany, Georgia as well as in Kingston, Jamaica with the Missionaries of Charity.

Noreen Coughlin, Director of Advice and Aid Pregnancy Problem Center, stated: "It has been such a blessing to have the support of The Knights of Columbus. To have 50 brother Knights tour the center and present to the new Ultrasound was a thrill! Our center is looking forward to launching the use of limited Ultrasound under the medical direction of Dr. Kathleen Raviele. Our center has been operating since 1984 through the support of the Catholic community. The efforts of the Knights have been a consistent support and we can't thank you enough."

The Knights have a long history of working with the Center. Past State Deputy John M. Brenner serves on the Centers Board of Directors and Members of Immaculate Heart of Mary Council 4420 in Hapeville under the Direction of Grand Knight Lyle Volkmer, extensively remodeled the entire center last year. Christopher Travers is Eagle Scout

All Saints' Troop Awards 43rd Eagle

In a Court of Honor held recently at All Saints Catholic Church, Christopher Travers received his Eagle Scout award. Travers is the 43rd recipient from Troop 434 to attain the Eagle Scout rank.

Christopher joined Troop 434 in the spring of 2004. His leadership positions included Den Chief, Patrol Leader and Senior Patrol Leader. While being active in 434, Christopher logged over 160 service hours, 127 camping nights, and backpacked 371 miles. He went to Philmont Scout ranch twice in 2008, and 2010. Christopher was elected into the Order of the Arrow in 2009, and earned 32 merit badges while earning the Eagle Rank.

Reflecting on his two trips to Philmont, Christopher stated: "I learned a lot from the older scouts on my first trip, and then taught the younger scouts on my second trip."

Travers Eagle Scout project was building a walking trail behind Dunwoody High School. This project continues to serve the parents and students of Vandy and Dunwoody Elementary

schools, and has become a popular and functional addition to this area.

Troop 434 was chartered in March of 1986, and has been led by Scoutmaster Jerry Travers for the duration. Mr. Travers has enjoyed a long career leading the Scouts of this Troop, and certainly the ceremony honoring his son will become a personal highlight.

"I was just as nervous presenting this Eagle to my son as I have for the first 42 Eagle Scouts. I have been looking forward to this day since he was born," Scoutmaster Travers stated.

Travers wife, Karen followed, "I am very proud of Christopher, and thrilled for his Dad."

Scoutmaster Travers closed the ceremony with a "Scoutmaster Minute", brief remarks that serve to inspire Scouts.

"Being a leader isn't enough. A Scout must be a successful follower. Eagle Scouts are as good at following as they are at leading, and that made the difference and is one of the reasons that Christopher is here with us today, an Eagle Scout."

The July 20th, 2011 *Dunwoody Crier* reported that Christopher Travers of our own All Saints Boy Scout Troop 434 has attained the rank of Eagle Scout.

Christopher is the grandson of our deceased Sir Knight Jerry Travers, Sr. Christopher's father, Jerry Travers, Jr. (note the resemblance) is the present Scoutmaster of the troop and a good partner and friend of our council. (He has promised to join the council when his scoutmaster days are over.)

Jerry keeps cranking out Eagle Scouts one floor above us. All eight sons of our Brother Sir Knight Richard Ducote also fall into this category. Past Grand Knight Lou Hlad's son, Louie, was Jerry's 13th Eagle Scout.

As another interesting connection to 11402, our own monster cooker (Grillzilla) has a memorial plaque on it commemorating Jerry Travers, Sr., because of a generous Travers family donation to the council in his memory.

We congratulate Jerry and Karen on the wonderful accomplishment of their son and the continuing efforts of Jerry, Jr. to mold fine young men.

David Bertrand admits there are times when his exercise program can seem, well, a little bit nuts.

Like when he's in training. He doesn't have time to run the distances he should, so he wears a 65-pound, lead-filled vest and carries a Goodyear tire across his shoulders to make his training runs around Dunwoody harder.

"It looks odd," Bertrand admitted. "People think I'm very weird carrying that tire."

Some drivers have even stopped and asked if he needs a ride to the nearest gas station to get his flat fixed.

He doesn't. Running to the corner gas station would be nothing for Bertrand. Heck, these days, running marathons doesn't mean all that much. He's run marathons — a dozen of them, by his count. He's taking part in Iron Man competitions, which mix swimming, bicycling and running. Those events weren't challenging enough. These days he runs "ultramathons" that stretch out for 50 kilometers, or 50 miles, or even 100 miles.

Yes, he has run a 100-mile race. And he plans to do it again.

"I just like to challenge myself," he said one recent morning as he took a break from his day job as a Sandy Springs police major. "I just like to live. I like to challenge myself physically and mentally."

And he likes running. "Other than my children, I love running better than anything in the world," he said. "I run every chance I get."

He's run for much of his life. He ran distance races for his high school track team, he said, but says he wasn't very good. "I was terrible at it. I took last in ev-

ery race."

Now age 48, he can run farther in a day than many people drive. Not that it's easy to jog the distance, from say, Sandy Springs to Macon. When he was running the 100-mile race from Key

Largo to Key West in the Florida Keys, he found out just how tough it can be. For one thing, it took him more than 26 hours, which is a long time to go without sleep, even under normal conditions.

At about mile 88, he said, things started going wrong. He suddenly thought the woman running in front of him had risen off the ground. She appeared to be levitating and running in the air. "I thought, 'That's not normal,'" he said.

He sat down for a moment and downed a soft drink. "I thought, 'That can't be right, so let me drink a Coke,'" he said.

Soon, he was back on track. After all, he still had 12 miles to go.

Now he's planning another 100-miler. The course crosses the mountains of Alabama.

"I love challenges," he said. "I love to see how far I can push my body. I just love life."

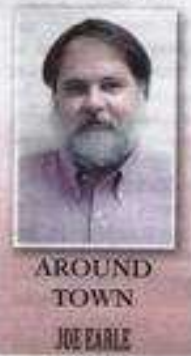
Besides, it will give him a reason to add another tattoo. He has 22 now, he said. They date back to when he was in high school. Five mark his runs, including a rectangular green one that looks like a roadside mile marker and says simply "Mile 100."

Soon, he may need room for an even larger number. He has his eyes on a race in which runners travel from one side of the state of Georgia to the other. Runners get 4 1/2 days to run the 260 miles, he said.

Why would anyone do that? "It's kind of like

the Iron Man [races]. You cross the finish line," he said, "and say, 'Damn, now what? It's a good feeling running across the finish line, but now what am I going to do?'"

John William Lynch, Jr., age 85, of Duluth, passed away on June 21, 2011 at Gwinnett Medical Center. Mr. Lynch, a native of Hammond, Indiana, enlisted in the U.S. Navy during World War II, and served in the Philippines and the Pacific theater. He graduated from St. Joseph's College in Rensselaer, Indiana with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Business Administration.

During his 35 year career in the tire industry, he served in many capacities; first, with UniRoyal as Manager of Passenger Tire Sales. He then joined Goodyear/Kelly Springfield as Manager of Retail Marketing Sales in Custom Brands. He was later promoted to Chief Executive Officer of Custom Brands International-Europe in Brussels, Belgium. Upon his return to the United States, he served in Kansas City, Missouri, and ended his career in Cumberland, Maryland with Kelly Springfield as General Manager of the Wholesale Tire Division.

Mr. Lynch was the Co-Founder and first President of the Duluth Merchant's Association, and was active in many other local associations, including: former Chairman-Resource & Environment Committee of the Gwinnett Chamber of Commerce; Member of the American Legion (Post 251); Member of the Catholic War Veterans (Post 0004); Member of the Knights of Columbus (4th degree, Council #2688); Member of the Knights of Columbus (3rd degree, Council #11402), both at All Saints Catholic Church in Dunwoody. He was also a member of Mary, Our Queen Catholic Church in Norcross.

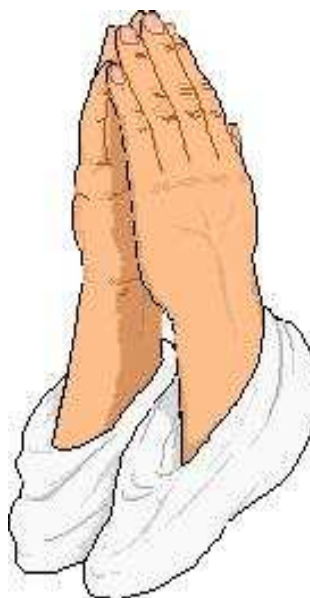

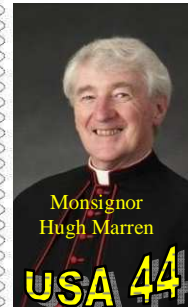
