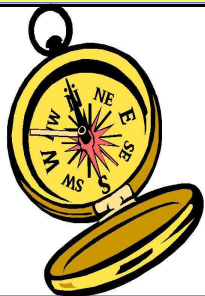

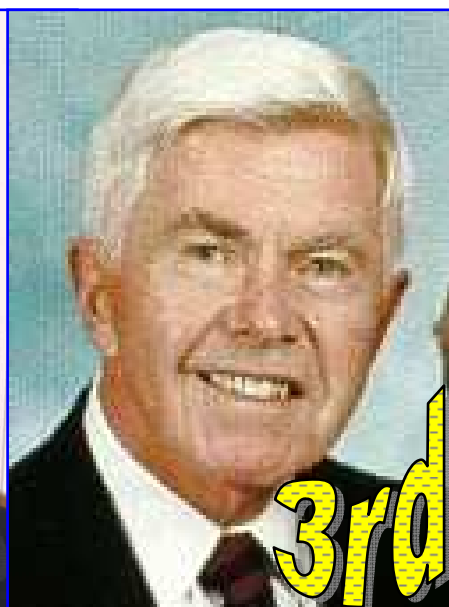

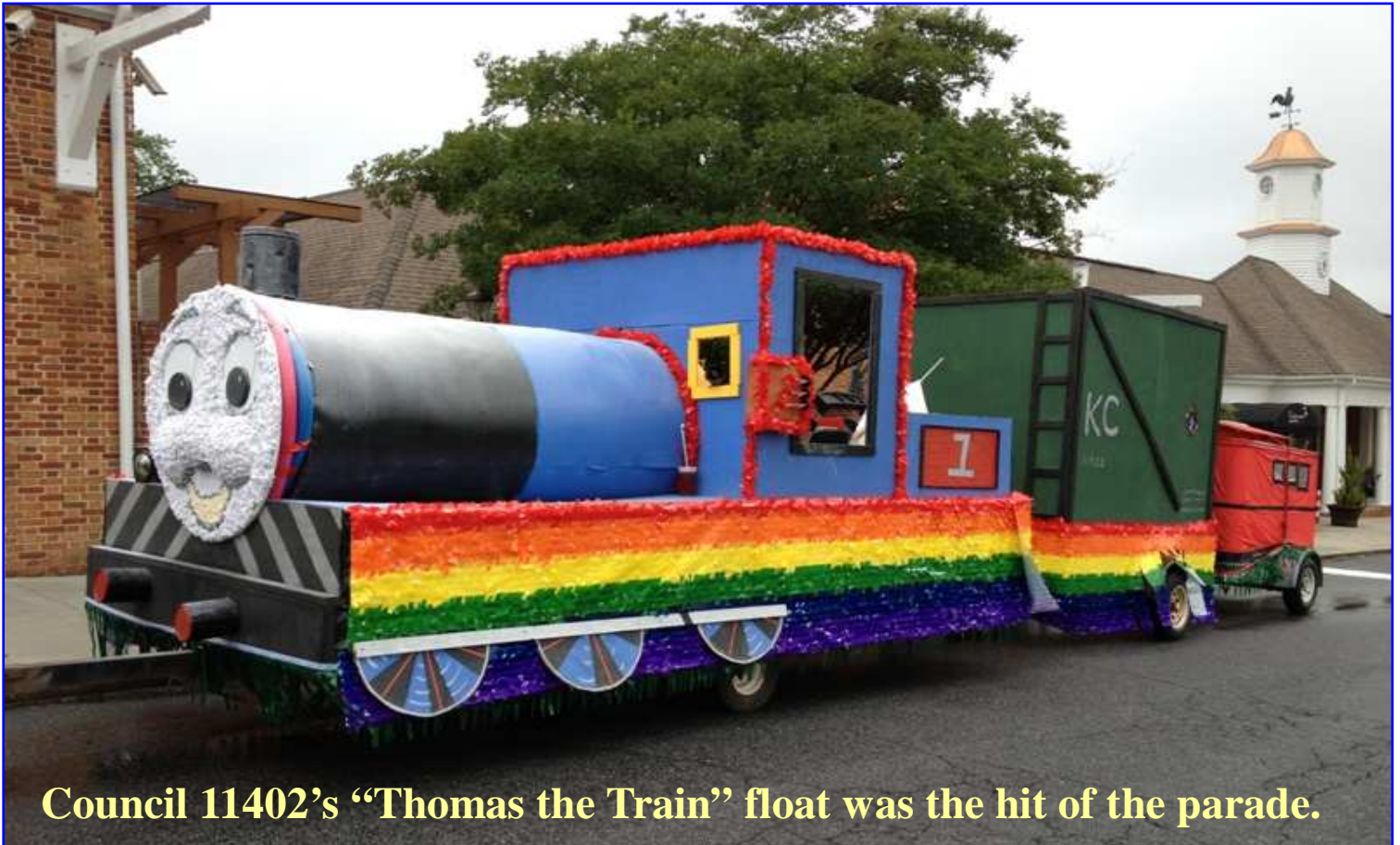
## Bob Mitchell Gains Shining Armor Award

# Council Now Supports Fourth Seminarian

At a recent meeting, Brother Gert Kampfer asked if our council would be willing to sponsor a fourth seminarian who was a member of the Georgia Tech Council 14496 and was studying for the priesthood. Kampfer is now a transfer Financial Secretary to that council and notes that this fledgling council does not have a lot of resources at this time. We agreed to add a fourth seminarian this year per his request.

Anthony Almeter joined the KofC in November 2006 at the former Southern Catholic College in Dawsonville and he is now a member at Tech. He finished his second year as a seminarian with the *Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest*, a society of priests in the Catholic Church that celebrates the Liturgy in Latin in accordance with its constitutions and founding documents.

He graduated from Southern Catholic College in 2009 and had during that time received the T.J. Goggin Education Foundation Scholarship.

His interest in the Latin liturgy encouraged him to major in music that dovetailed with a desire to join this traditional order of priests that keeps Latin liturgy alive.

During that time he was quoted:

*“The generosity of those who support the T.J. Goggin Education Foundation has been a tremendous blessing. Their efforts have certainly helped to ease the financial burdens of Catholics who are seeking higher education both to receive and contribute to the service of the Catholic Church. In studying music, I hope to serve the Church through ennobling the Sacred Liturgy with true Sacred Music from the Catholic Church’s Heritage and Tradition.”*

Anthony is a native from Thomson, GA and his father is a Brother Knight at the local council. He was stationed in Florence, Italy for most of his studies. Lately, Anthony was in France on assignment to help at a parish until the end of June.

During August, he will return home to Georgia for the month to have some much needed vacation and it is hoped that he can drop by at the Tech Council. 5

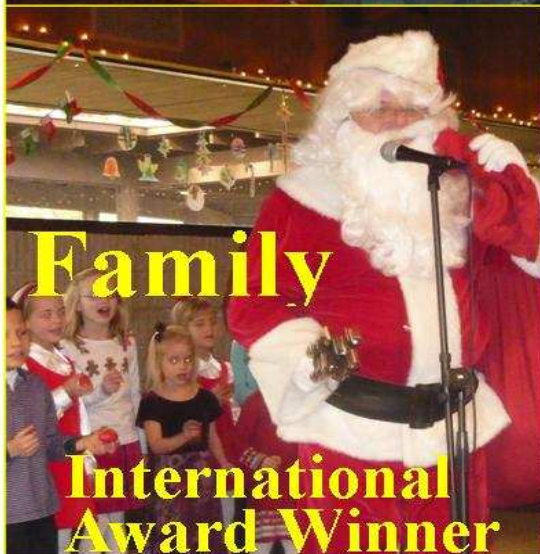

# New 4th Degree Assembly Formed

Our Georgia 4th Degree Master, Thomas Frizzy, has announced that he is splitting our Fr. Charles J. Watters Assembly 2688 into two Assemblies. The Watters Assembly had grown to 230 members and was at a size that could be divided successfully.

The new Assembly will be called the Fr. Joseph T. O'Callahan Assembly named after a WWII naval officer chaplain who received the Medal of Honor. He was a Jesuit priest. The choice is fitting, since our Fr. Charles J. Watters was an army chaplain who received the Medal of Honor in Vietnam.

Master Frizzy is splitting off the St. Brigid faction of our Assembly to form the new organization. It is expected that the new group will start off with 80 members. The

Watters Assembly had consisted of 4th degree Sir Knights from All Saints, St. Andrew, Mary Our Queen, and St. Brigid Councils. St. Brigid is a huge parish with about 3,500 families and about 400 members in their council. Their Sir Knights will be transferring from the Watters Assembly, although the choice of an Assembly is a personal decision and a few will remain.

Both Assemblies will be busy recruiting new members for the 4th degree exemplification scheduled for November 16th at the Gwinnett Marriott in Duluth to bolster numbers. It is a great time for All Saints 3rd degree members to decide to become Sir Knight in our Watters Assembly.

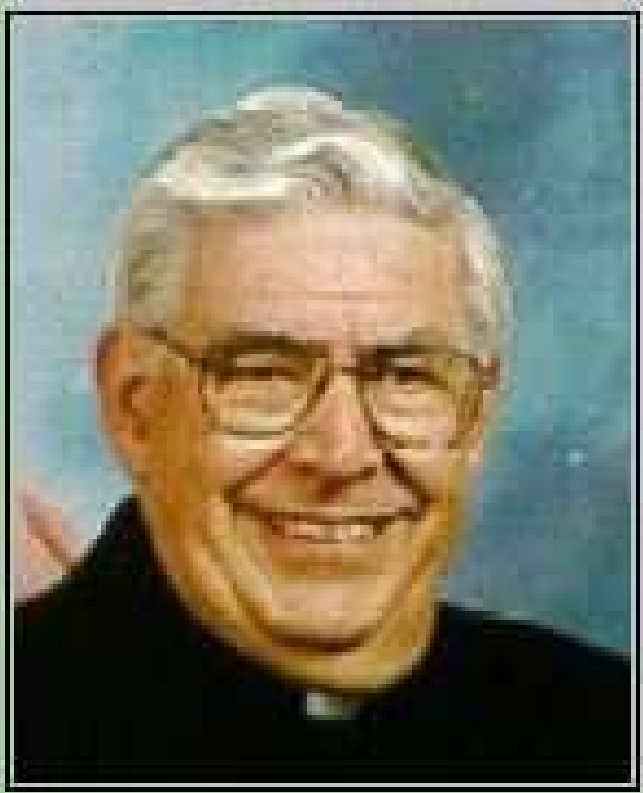
Although Supreme has not yet assigned an official organization number to the new Assembly, they have a full slate of officers chosen. Their first Faithful Navigator (think Grand Knight) is Richard Holcomb, the new St. Brigid pastor, Fr. Neil Herlihy, is their Faithful Friar (think Chaplain), retiring State Deputy Rick Sisko is their Faithful Pilot (think Warden), and our former District Deputy, Rick Langheim, is their Color Corps Commander.

It is expected that the two Assemblies will work closely together, since many longtime friendships exist between the two bodies. They can partner on local honor guard events, but the new organization should take a burden off our Color Corps Commander, Bob Mitchell, who had managed over 80 events last year. Many were at St. Brigid.

The O'Callahan Assembly will have an "unofficial" meeting on August 14th to establish committees, set goals for the fraternal year, etc. to hit the ground running to commence officially on 9/11 (scary date). We welcome our quickly growing community of Sir Knights.

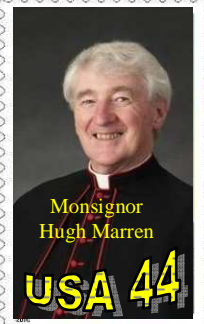
