
Volunteer at St. Joseph's creates honor for nurses

Dunwoody resident Norbert Braza, a 14-year volunteer at Emory Saint Josephs Hospital, used his hobby skills to design and create a stained glass window at the hospital as a tribute to the nurses for receiving the monthly DAISY Award.

The window that features a daisy, the emblem for an international foundation that honors nurses, now occupies a permanent spot on the Daisy wall located on the fifth floor in the hospital, which also includes the names and portraits of the award winners.

For the past 14 years, the 83-year-old has been a valued and respected member of the volunteer team. His professional background includes positions from designing nuclear reactors for the U.S. Navy to encouraging companies to use a new technology at the time – computers. As a volunteer, Braza has used his computer skills and artistic talents to help others in many areas of the hospital.

Some of his work has consisted of developing spreadsheets and databases for various hospital departments that have maximized the efficiency of care for patients.

"I discovered that no matter how you old you are, you keep on learning," Braza said. "I never fully understood all of the things a nurse does, until I started reading and working with them. Nurses put a lot of time into treating patients, and reviewing processes to make them more effective so they can provide better treatment and minimize costs."

For the past several years, Braza has also created stained glass windows for Habitat for Humanity houses that have been built by his congregation at All Saints Catholic Church.

"It made me extremely proud to be able to do this," said Braza. "We each have God-given talents and we have to use them to the best of our ability," he said modestly.

In 1994 All Saints committed to support the construction of one Habitat for Humanity house. Now 20 years later we are preparing for the construction of our 21st house on August 23, 2014.

KofC 11402 has been an integral part of this project for many years, providing volunteer labor and lunch for one Saturday on each of the builds. Twenty families had the "unreachable" dream of owning a safe, warm, and sustainable home to raise their family and with your support the

dream became reality.

Once again the parish will be required to raise \$55,000 to seed the construction, working with the HFH affiliate. The financial and volunteer support from All Saints allows the selected homeowner to secure an affordable mortgage of approximately 90K at "0" interest secured by the HFH Atlanta affiliate. The Atlanta affiliate has recently celebrated their 30th anniversary and has now constructed over 1,200 homes. This effort has changed the lives of 5,000 family members for generations to come.


