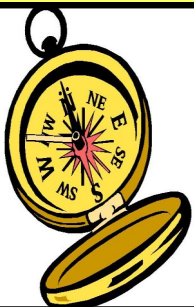
Last month:

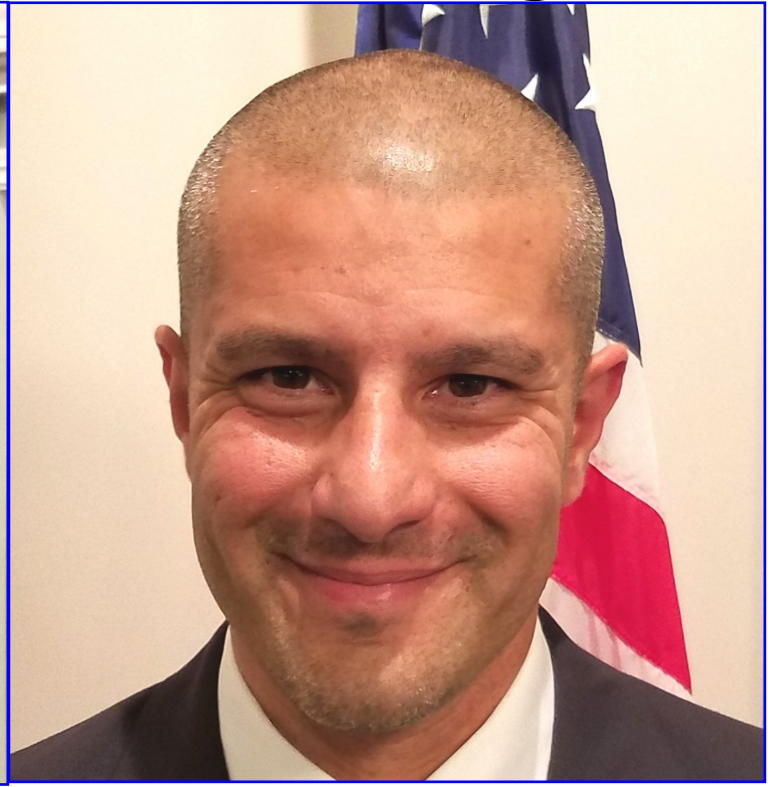

“Knights Helping Widows” Program Starts



“Knights Helping Widows” is intended to be a “Handy-Man Similar” resource for those widows who have no one to help them with minor household problems that might present a hazard to health and safety.

A short list of some of these problems include: light switches and receptacles that don't work, plumbing leaks, toilet repair, hinges, locks, door bells, carpet bunching, smoke alarms, out of reach, light bulb replacement, installation of safety bars, weatherproofing windows and doors, nonslip surface preparation, and more. We will provide the labor with you providing the material needed for the repair.

What does a widow needing help do?

Call or email our Program Coordinator, John Shaffer at 770-349-5278 or k9shaffer@aol.com. John will forward your request to a Knight who will contact you to set up an appointment. When he meets with you, he will have Knights of Columbus Identification and appropriate release forms.

After evaluating your needs, he will make recommendations and setup a repair schedule. In some instances, it may be necessary to make alternative recommendations if you live outside our service area or your issues require

greater expertise than we can offer. In such an event, we are prepared to have someone available to help you ask the right questions when you are negotiating with a contractor or other service provider. When repairs are completed, we will follow-up to assure that the work has been done to your satisfaction.

We, the members of All Saints Knights of Columbus, pray that you find a small bit of peace and comfort in knowing that your husband's spirit lives on through the spirit of our Council.

If you are willing to become a handyman for minor fixes at the homes of our council widows, please contact John Shaffer at his contact info shown above. Our Widows Committee is becoming more active in maintaining communications with all our widows. Recently we sent Easter cards to all widows whose addresses we have. We already invite our widows to play monthly BINGO at Council expense.

Mr. Bob Rogers, President and CEO of Saving Grace, will speak on Monday September 11th in the All Saints Parish Social Hall on this important issue. The public is invited.

Street Grace is one of the pioneers in the human trafficking “space” – a \$290 million illegal industry in Georgia, alone. We are an Atlanta-based, faith-driven organization collaborating with faith, business and community leaders providing a comprehensive path to end Domestic Minor Sex Trafficking (DMST) in Metro Atlanta and throughout the United States. DMST is sexual activity in which there is a promise of the exchange of something of value to a child or another person(s) for sex with that child.

Street Grace mobilizes community resources – financial, human, and material – to fight DMST through awareness, education and action.

The event begins with a meet-and-greet social at 6:30 PM with a cash bar. A buffet dinner for \$10 starts at 7 PM , and the talk begins at 7:30. The Mens Club is open to women and the general public as well. Don’t miss this interesting and informative meeting.

August Parish Bingo— Another Great Night !!



We recorded 165 players on August 24th. This was a decrease from our overflow July crowd, but welcome. Our Bingo sales were \$2,616, our Bingo prizes were \$910 plus three gift cards, yielding Bingo gross proceeds of \$1,706. We also received \$263 from food donations, \$293 from drink donations, and \$205 from the 50/50 raffle sale. Cost of food and drink, 7% sales tax, state license fee, Crier ad cost, and cost of supplies are still to be deducted. A good number of players brought Dunwoody Crier coupon ads in for free additional playing sheets. One council widow played for free. Our Bingo nights are becoming a popular parish staple every month.

Catholic League Letter

Here is a recent letter from the Catholic League on religious and civil rights of churches. Such rights are a huge issue in the country now.

NJ Court Upholds Church Autonomy

August 15, 2017

Catholic League president Bill Donohue comments on a ruling granted on August 14 that affirms Church autonomy:

A few months ago, the parents of two female students enrolled in St. Theresa's School in Kenilworth, New Jersey sought to force the school to reinstate their children after they were denied admission to the school this fall. They lost in Superior Court yesterday, as well they should have.

Judge Donald A. Kessler read his decision for three hours from the bench, so chock full of detail was this bizarre lawsuit.

It all began last December when the girls' father, Scott Phillips, filed a lawsuit to get his daughter, Sydney, on the boys basketball team after the season for the girls was cancelled. He succeeded in arranging for her to play in the last game of the boys team in February.

Two months later, the school said the girls were not welcome to return for the next school year. That's when Phillips sued the school, and the Archdiocese of Newark, seeking to force the school to reverse its decision.

"The court does not have the authority to meddle in this decision," said Judge Kessler. The judge was not sparing of the parents, noting how they went public with their complaint, causing undue commotion in the community. To be specific, he cited threatening letters sent by the girls' mother, Theresa Mullen.

Judge Kessler noted that the parents have a record of lodging complaints whenever they don't get their way. In 2016, when the older son of the parents was not named the eighth grade valedictorian, both parents sounded off. Scott Phillips was so enraged that he called the female principal a "son of a b****." The archdiocese intervened to help restore order, but to no avail—the parents remained publicly indignant.

The issue of Church autonomy is fast becoming one of the most contentious matters in the nation. Separation of church and state obviously doesn't mean much to those who advocate state control of Catholic institutions, but if the Church cannot decide its own internal strictures, it is no longer Catholic. That is exactly what the activists want, which is why they must be fought at every turn.

This also goes to show how vacuous the mantra of diversity is. Those who truly believe in pluralism do not seek to access the heavy hand of the state to force sectarian institutions to march to the beat of its secular drum.

Shown above is the new electronic payment page on our council kc11402.org web site. You go to that web site, choose “Members Enter Here”, log in with your last name and membership number (on your member card), choose “2017 Dues Payment”, and then get to above screen.

You may then pay your dues online for \$41.50 (which includes a \$1.50 electronic processing fee) by using a credit card **or** your PayPal account which takes that amount directly out of your checking account like a debit card. Your personal PayPal account must be set up independently. A new second web page choice allows you to set up automatic \$41.50 PayPal payments for 5 years.

Of course, you may still pay your normal 2017 annual dues of \$40 directly at a meeting or send a \$40 check made out to “**KofC Council 11402**” to our Financial Secretary, Ralph O’Connor, at 390 17th St., NW, Unit 5069, Atlanta, GA 30363. His email is ralph390@comcast.net.

If a member is less than 26 years old on December 31, 2016, annual dues are only \$20. If you are a designated “Honorary” member (65 years old and a Knight for 25 consecutive years), your dues are only \$10. Priests, deacons, or members of a religious order pay no dues. Anyone who has been a Knight for 50 unbroken years likewise pays no dues.

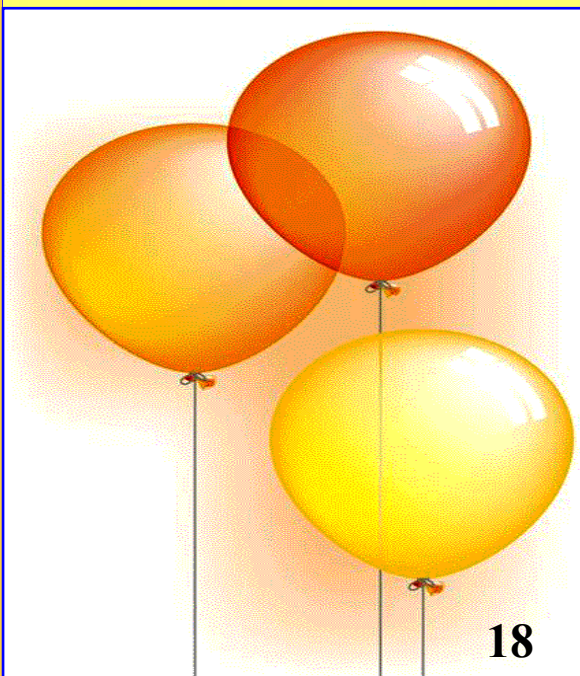

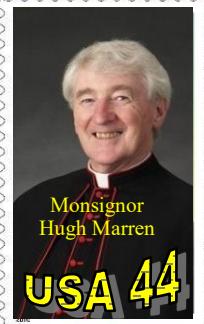
