Grand Knight's Report

I received an email last week from a Brother Knight. It was one of those broadcast emails that get sent out indiscriminately to everyone in your address book. The subject was "Keeping Christ in Christmas." The tone of the email was exhortative, demanding that I chant "Keep Christ in Christmas" every day and giving examples of when I should stand up and be counted, for example, by correcting others who fall prey to calling it a "holiday bush" rather than a Christmas tree, or abbreviate the word as Xmas.

As I mused upon this veiled demand, I began to wonder whether such token sloganeering was really in keeping with the intent and meaning of the Christmas season. Not surprisingly, I concluded it was not. I also reflected upon our annual campaign to "Keep Christ in Christmas" that sells religious-themed Christmas cards and magnetic nativity scenes suitable for mounting on your automobile.

Is this really "Keeping Christ in Christmas," I wondered? I'll leave it to each of you to decide for yourselves. For my part, I thought I'd offer another alternative to help us "Keep Christ in Christmas" this season.

I begin by using the word "**CHRIST**" as an acronym. Not surprisingly, I thought of "**C**" as standing for "**charity**," but charity in the sense of "love," not almsgiving. Sure, we all feel good when we throw a dollar into the red kettle at the Kroger's, but charity means much more. Charity means treating others and ourselves with mutual respect and love, especially while referencing the Greatest Gift of all.

The "**H**" can stand for "**humility**." The Christ-child was born into the most humble of circumstances, and practiced humility in all aspects of His life. We all can practice humility by being

respectful of others and putting their needs ahead of ours.

The "**R**" reminds us to practice **reverence and respect**. The whole Christmas season is built on a sense of there being something "special" about to happen. The Advent liturgies help prepare us for the coming of the Christ. A proper sense of reverence and respect during this time of preparation fosters a deeper, more meaningful appreciation of the wonderful events that unfolded 2000 years ago.

The "**I**" stands for "**incarnation**." Oftentimes, we're tempted to see the Incarnation as God "stepping down" into our world, taking on our flesh, enduring and suffering our mortality. I offer for your consideration another aspect, that through the Incarnation we are able to "step up" to God. What a great gift and an awesome responsibility!

This thought is intimately bound up with the "**S**" that stands for "**salvation**." Christmas points toward Easter, when God's plan for the redemption of fallen humanity reached its fullness in the Resurrection.

And last, we have the "**T**" that stands for "**thanksgiving**." It goes without saying that we should be ever mindful of the great gift that God has given us through Christ his Son, and this should inspire in us a sense of thanksgiving and praise.

For what it's worth, that's what I believe it means to "Keep Christ in Christmas." On behalf of all the Council Officers and Trustees, we wish each one of you and your families a Blessed and Holy Christmas and a Prosperous and Happy New Year.

On an exceptional Fall afternoon, All Saints Knights of Columbus Council 11402 hosted its 4th annual *Veterans Appreciation Cookout* on Sunday, November 12th from 1:30 – 4 PM in the lower parking lot. Over 100 (veterans plus family) attended and were treated to exceptional picnic fare.

McGivney Hall was temporarily converted by Sir Knight Kirby Baden into a military museum of treasured keepsakes including pictures, old newspapers, uniforms, scrapbooks, military articles, and posters from several different wars. A video ran with features from all the military services.

Brother John Vail spoke eloquently about his experiences in Vietnam. All the veterans present (male and female) introduced themselves and then summarized their own service history. This occasion was a well-deserved parish “**thank you**” for all that they have done to keep us free and safe.

The grand finale of the event was a formal flag retirement ceremony hosted by our own All Saints Boy Scout Troop 434. At least 30 American flags that were too worn and tattered to be of further use were burned on a wooden pyre while a scout read the official service of flag retirement.

The first flag was ceremoniously cut into sections that were carefully folded before their final incineration. A flag that flew over the U.S.S. Arizona was later retired. The proceedings were quite interesting and moving.

An Honor Guard of Knights flanked the scouts and added beautiful visual presence to the already impressive scout event. Veterans in the crowd came up as a group for long-delayed recognition and hardy thanks. Bless them all!

National Catholic Reporter “*The Word from Rome*” (Excerpt)

Even if they had no financial resources whatsoever, the Knights of Columbus would still be an important force in Catholic affairs. With 1.7 million members, principally in the United States, they are the largest lay Catholic organization in the world. Supreme Knight Carl Anderson is an influential Catholic intellectual and speaker. Members of the Knights are known around the world for their commitment, perhaps especially to pro-life causes.

Yet there's no doubt that the Knights' financial clout puts the group in a class by itself. A fresh reminder came this week, as some 1,000 Knights gathered in Orlando, Florida, for their 124th Supreme Convention. The gathering attracted some 80 bishops and archbishops, including ten cardinals.

During the meeting, Anderson informed the Knights that their insurance program, which boasts a staff of 1,400 agents, has grown by nearly 50 percent in the last five years. It now has **\$60 billion** of life insurance in force, and a staggering \$13 billion in assets. (Among other things, that figure towers over the Vatican's roughly \$800 million in assets).

During the past decade, the Knights have donated more than \$1.208 billion to charity; this year alone, the group has given \$140 million. Yet the Knights also contribute to myriad ecclesiastical causes, making friends in high places in a way that other Catholic groups can only dream about.

A brief story illustrates the point.

Just after I arrived in Rome in the summer of 2000, a long-awaited refurbishing of the lighting system in the *scavi*, the excavations below St. Peter's Basilica where the bones of St. Peter are believed to rest, was unveiled. I didn't sign up for a tour for journalists, busy with my Italian classes. Shortly thereafter, however, I got a note from the home office saying NCR wanted a cover story on the *scavi* in a matter of days. I feared I had blown it, since normally it takes two weeks to get a tour. I faxed in an emergency request, however, and within five minutes I got a phone call asking if 8:00 AM the following day would be convenient; I asked if my wife could join me, and was told "of course."

We arrived just before 8:00, and found a group of English-speaking pilgrims assembling. We assumed we had simply been added to the group, so we purchased tickets and waited. Just as the group was departing, however, a troika of distinguished-looking men in dark suits approached, calling out my name. It turned out to be Pietro Zander, from the Vatican's excavations office, along with Nazzareno Gabrielli, the avuncular director of scientific research for the Vatican museums, and one of Gabrielli's aides.

Gabrielli spent the next two hours with Shannon and me, explaining complicated points of microbiology and art history, taking us into sealed-off nooks and crannies that ordinary tourists never see. At one point, we stepped inside a locked area of the pagan mausoleum buried under the basilica, because Gabrielli wanted to explain something about the masonry. He proceeded to thump the ornate first century B.C. walls, and encouraged us to do the same. His blows swiftly brought down a small chunk of the wall, which elicited little more than a bemused *mama mia* and a shrug.

Though the experience was delightful, I couldn't help but wonder if the brain trust at the *scavi* did this for every reporter who faxed in a request.

As we finished, we exited St. Peter's Basilica and came out under a portico. Zander took me by the arm, pointed up to an exterior part of the basilica, and explained that funding from the Knights of Columbus had paid for its restoration.

"I want you to know how grateful we are," he intoned. "Grateful," he repeated, for emphasis.

Then I got it: The VIP treatment had nothing to do with me. These officials had gone out of their way for an American Catholic in order to return a favor to the Knights. I suppose Zander assumed I would get word back to the right people. By no means am I suggesting there was anything sinister about this -- quite the contrary -- but it does illustrate how the generosity of the Knights spawns gratitude.


Come to think of it, I never did what Zander implicitly asked. So to the Knights, albeit six years late, on the occasion of your Orlando convention, this relayed message: The Vatican says "Thank You."


