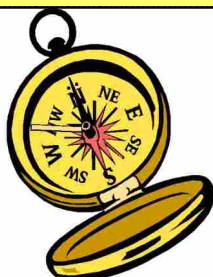

If you didn't go down to Atlanta International Speedway on Sunday, October 23rd, to join the brothers in hosting a corporate hospitality tent, you missed a great time. Each volunteer earned about \$50 for the Council and got in to see the race for free using his worker badge. We had 20 volunteers, including Knights, spouses, and friends.

The only criteria for participating was attaining an age of 21 and passing a test on alcohol awareness, because the tents were serving adult beverages.

For the first time ever, the alcohol awareness test was administered on line with the participant printing out his success certificate. These were sent to Sir Knight Don Myers, who then took them down to the raceway before the event and registered our folks as legal servers.

The race organizers love to use the Knights, because they know we have experience hosting large events and never give them a bit of trouble. **Great job, Don Myers!!**

Passed and Pending Council Benevolence Actions

At the November meeting, Deputy Grand Knight Lou Hlad brought to a vote the suspension of the \$1,000 request by Wiley Maloof for Sister Sponsa's *Our Lady of Fatima Home* in Liberia. The vote was unanimously in favor and that amount will be forwarded to Sister Sponsa, the true birth sister of our late parish founder, Father Joseph Beltran.

A gift of \$1,000 was presented to Jessica Harms for help with the medical bills from her accidental fall. At our last meeting, gifts of \$1,000 each were presented to representatives of *Elaine Clark Center* and *People Making Progress*.

Grand Knight Greg Crnkovich provided some additional details regarding our latest benevolence initiative to aid our paralyzed brother, Matt Dewhurst, by raising the funds to purchase a special handicap-fitted van with a wheelchair lift to give him mobility. A trust fund for Matt has been set up at Peachtree Bank and a generous kick-off donation of \$1,000 has already been made by an anonymous brother. A steering committee of twelve brothers has been formed to focus all efforts of the council toward a fund goal approximating \$35,000 by May 1st. (See donation instructions below.)

Two new charity requests were presented to the Deputy Grand Knight for Charity Review Committee consideration. They will be announced in detail to the council at the December meeting.

Any member may fill out a "*Request for Charity*" Form available at McGivney Hall, and thereby provide a detailed, written justification for the charitable need. The Charity Review Committee (consisting of the five program directors, the deputy grand knight, and at least one of our three trustees) will meet to consider the relevance/amount of any gift. If approved, it is proposed to the Council for further consideration, debate, and final vote of the membership assembled.

Any gift must make a meaningful impact to the charity considered, since our funds are limited. National or even local charities with huge budgets are not considered, since the percentage of impact is quite minor.

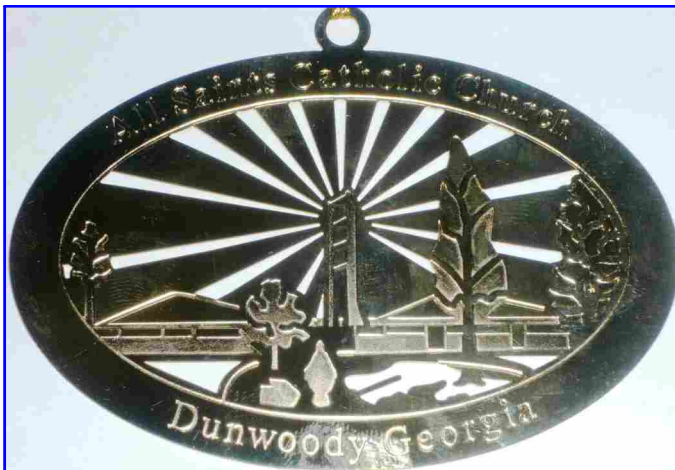
A musician hired by the Pre-school entertains the attendees and gets the schoolers to show off some of their best moves.

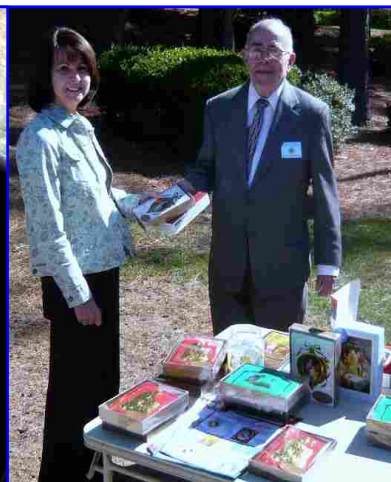
