Saturday the 13<sup>th</sup> saw the first (possibly annual) Spaghetti Dinner for the benefit of our parish Cub Scouts after the 5:00 PM Saturday Mass. About 300 meals were served and it was a resounding success.

The seventh member shown is transfer Ed Qualters whose photo we lacked.





Six boys and girls from Dunwoody and Johns Creek were named council level champions of the 2010 Knights of Columbus Soccer Challenge and then competed at the district level.

Each of these winners then competed in the district competitions held on Sunday, November 7th at Saint Brigid Catholic Church Soccer Fields with an eye (and a foot) on winning the state championship. The Council gladly responded by scheduling Saturday, November 6th, for the day we would participate in tidying up our Dunwoody neighborhood.


Shown are two of our new young brothers, Tim Krulia and Andy Pokelwaldt, who stepped up to the challenge.




