This could be a great idea for Christmas gifts for your family

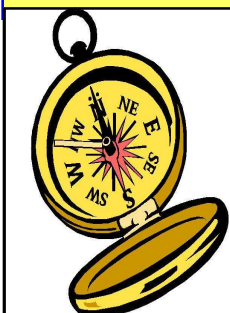

All Saints has developed a reputation, of sorts, as being one of the highest performing sales efforts in the Archdiocese. Last year, we sold \$9,500 in product, on a day many will remember as being bitterly cold, blustery, and snowy. Our all time "best" was in 2007 when we did \$10,700.

Council 11402 has strongly supported the Monastery, and we do so by returning 100% of the proceeds back to the Monastery. We sell at our "cost" directly to the parish, at a savings of 10-15% over the on-line catalog prices in the Monastery Gift Shop. Plus, no shipping!!!

We'll be outside the church beginning with 5:00 PM Mass on Saturday, Dec 10 and all Sunday Masses including the 5 PM Mass. The Monastery usually sends a monk to help support us. It's a lot of fun, even if the weather can turn nasty! And, we'll have a credit card machine on-loan, which is the secret to our better-than-most sales!!!

Frank Zimmerer took his 3rd degree last month to become a full knight. We had reported the promotion last issue, but did not have his picture. Here it is.

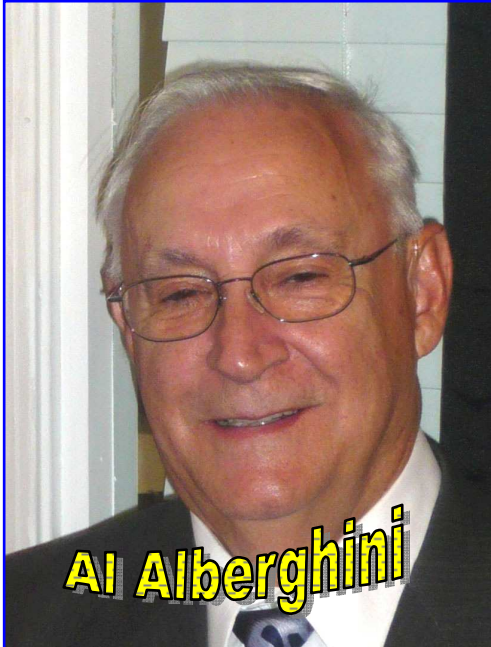


We have invited our new Parochial Vicar *Fr. Joseph Peek* to transfer into our council and he said he would.

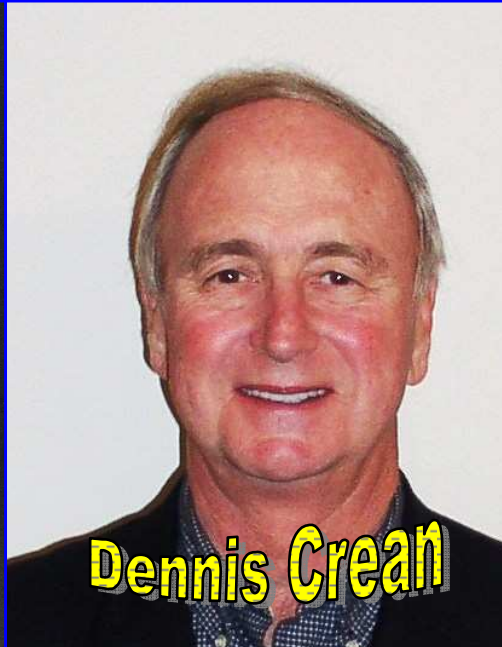

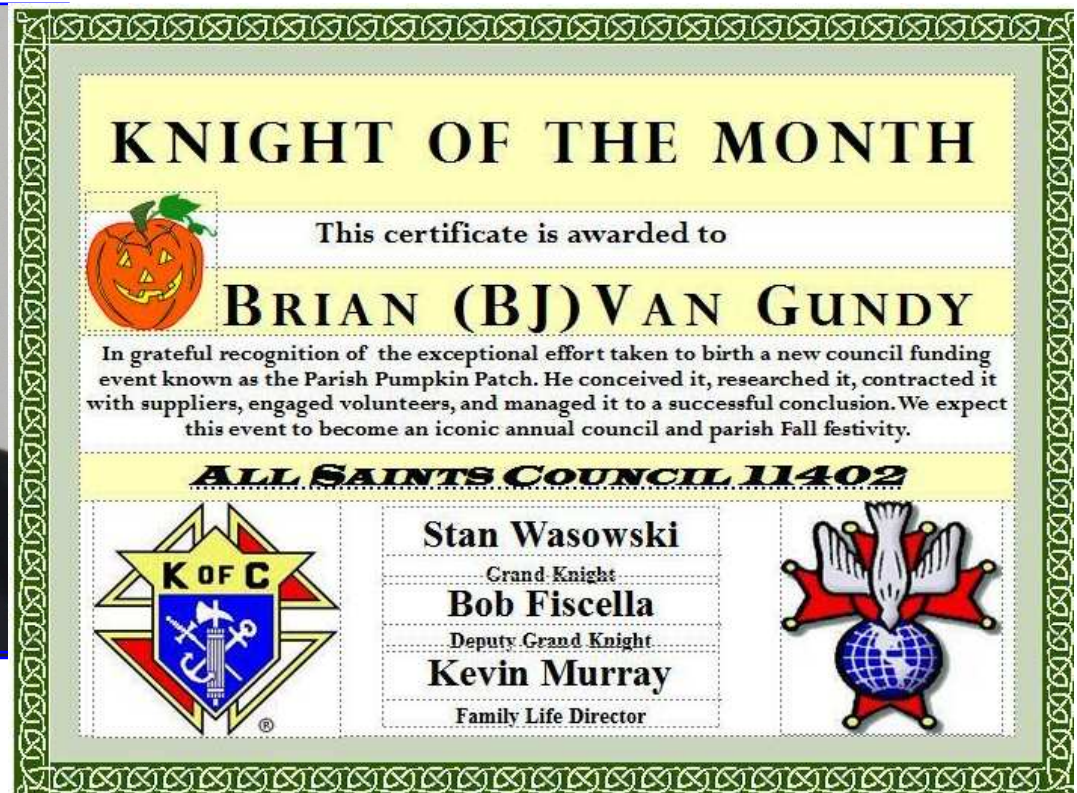
At the November 12th Fourth Degree at St. John Neumann, we had seven members progress to Sir Knight status.

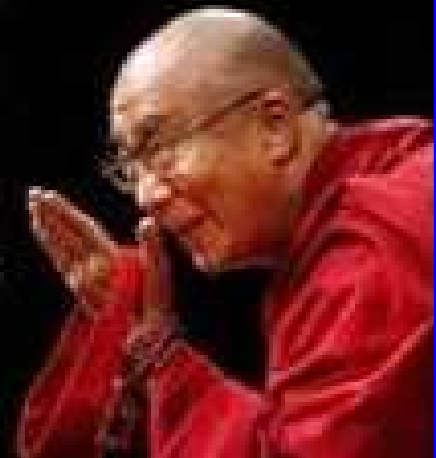

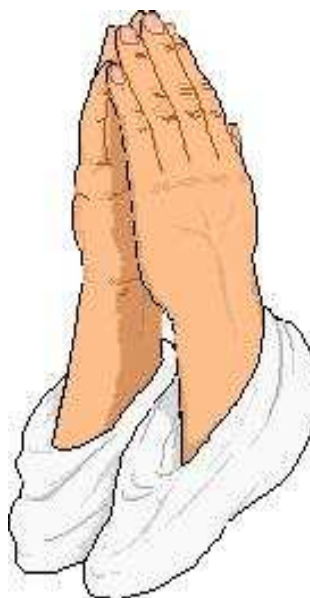

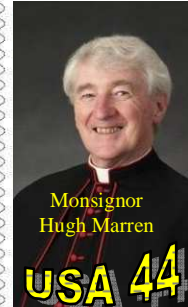
