

Council 11402 has strongly supported the Monastery, and we do so by returning 100% of the proceeds back to the Monastery. We sell at our "cost" directly to the parish, at a savings of 10-15% over the online catalog prices in the Monastery Gift Shop. Plus, no shipping!!!

We'll be outside the church beginning with 5:00 PM Mass on Saturday, Dec 10 and all Sunday Masses including the 5 PM Mass. The Monastery usually sends a monk to help support us. It's a lot of fun, even if the weather can turn nasty! And, we'll have a credit card machine on-loan, which is the secret to our better-than-most sales!!!


