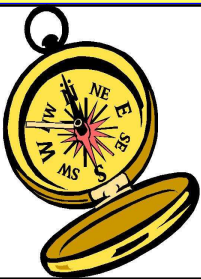
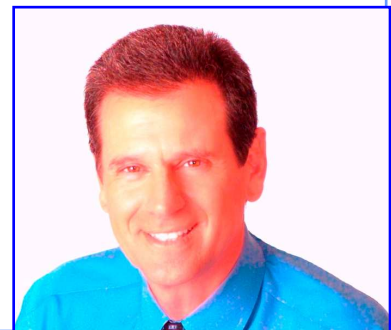
In closing, I leave you with a Christmas prayer that I stumbled across.

Don Myers was elected by the officers to finish Gert's term as trustee. He had been our trustee previously.

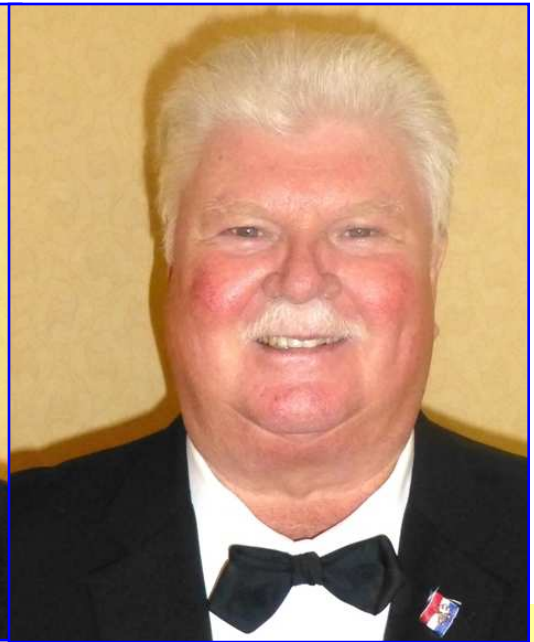
Three New Sir Knights Promoted 11/10/12

Knights Sponsor Monastery Fudge Sale



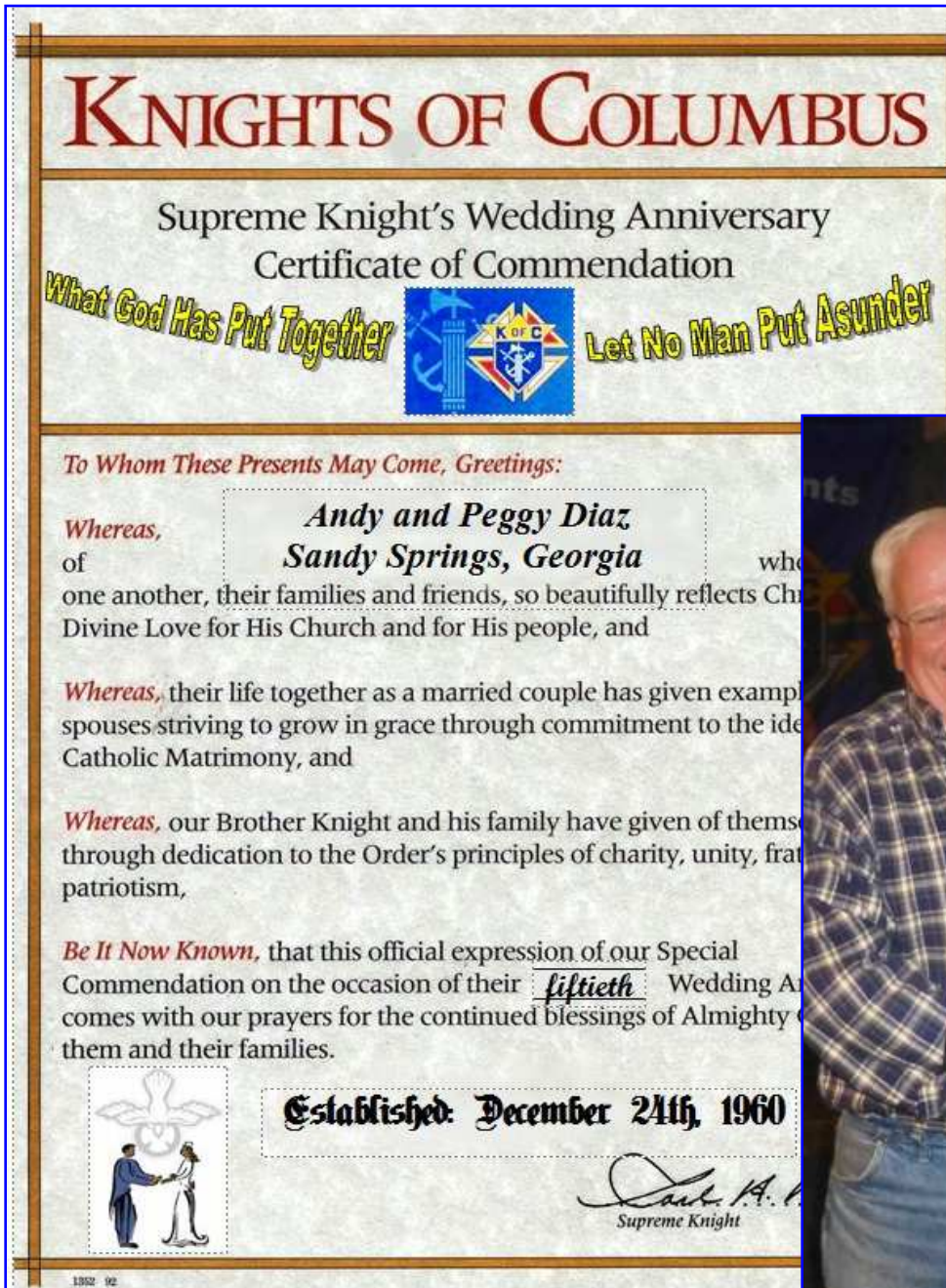

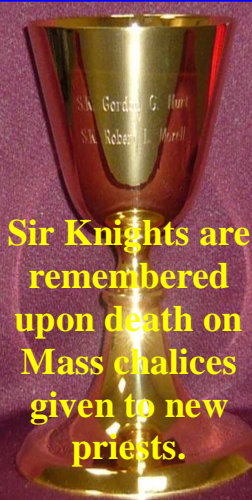

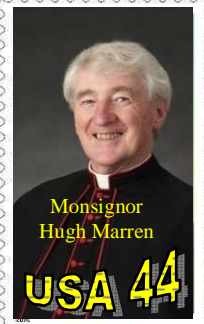
