As noted above, we have a few dates that have yet to be determined, so please keep your eyes and calendars open for more details.

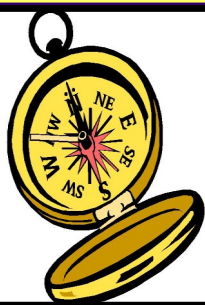
This year's Parish Christmas Party will include the Star Award being presented to our Council. Please make a genuine effort to be in attendance.

“Holy Name of Jesus” Chinese Mission

Archbishop Wilton Gregory officiated on Sunday November 15th at the official dedication of the new *“Holy Name of Jesus”* Chinese Mission co-located at All Saints Church. He presented a formal archdiocesan charter document which added one new community to the existing 70 Catholic churches and missions now making up the Atlanta Archdiocese.

For 25 years, the unnamed group of about 70 Chinese families had been an “apostolate” within the All Saints community. It is now designated a named “mission” capable of an independent operation under the continued leadership of our Sir Knights Fr. William Hao and Monsignor Hugh Marren.

The group has been searching for a site it could purchase for a functioning church. The archdiocese is active in conducting this search on the general Atlanta north side with a notable Chinese population. As the mission grows, it will in time be re-designated a full Catholic Parish.

Our Fr. Charles Watters Assembly Honor Guard attended the celebration Mass and was treated as royalty at the social hall reception following. Many in the Chinese community were not familiar with a KofC honor guard, but their historical culture loves the pomp and ceremony exhibited.

Mary Our Queen Parish was once a mission of All Saints under Monsignor Kiernan before it was designated a full parish. Now *“Holy Name of Jesus”* Mission is hoping for that same transition.



November Parish Bingo—Another Great Month!!



Our Parish Bingo Accountant, Brother Ralph O'Connor, reported that the November 19th Bingo event had another excellent crowd of 111 players including some council widows who play free with the council paying their fee. A young man fiddles with his necktie, trying without success to knot it correctly.

His struggle catches a nice lady's eye.

"Do you know how to tie it properly?" she asks.

"No, ma'am," he responds.

She gets her husband involved. After a little tutorial,

one gentleman helps another to complete his outfit.

The tiny but powerful moment among three strangers happened as Redd Desmond Thomas walked through the Lindbergh MARTA station. Before he hopped onto his train, Thomas snapped a quick photo and posted the endearing image with a message on his publicly accessible Facebook page.

"I love this!" he posted.

Other people did, too. The post had been liked, shared or commented on more than 1 million times by Tuesday

While she was busy fending off the shutterbugs, they inadvertently became Internet stars. They've heard from friends all over the world.

"I'm not famous," Al Alberghini demurred with a chuckle. "My goodness. We were just trying to help a young man out and never gave it a thought beyond that."

Three new Eagles named from All Saints' troop

It was a busy summer for the Boy Scouts of Troop 434 chartered out of All Saints Catholic Church. Three scouts earned the coveted rank of Eagle. Last month, the three life-long friends, who met and became friends in preschool, celebrated their accomplishment with a joint Court of Honor held in the Social Hall at All Saints Catholic Church.

Ben Stecker earned his Eagle rank in June. Ben has held the leadership positions of senior patrol leader (twice) and patrol leader. Stecker was responsible for leading the troop of 50 scouts not only in weekly meetings, monthly campouts, but also over the entire course of a summer camp. An accomplished guitarist, Ben has played many venues including Lemonade Days, Woodruff Camp, and many church functions. Currently a sophomore at Dunwoody High School, Ben also plays football for the Wildcat's varsity football and lacrosse teams.

Jason Hughes earned his rank in July. Hughes held leadership as a den leader which was pivotal in helping Cub Scouts transition into Boy Scouts. Following his leadership with the Cub Scouts, Jason held the position of troop guide that allowed him to lead his peers through skills management, meetings and campouts. Attending Dunwoody High School, he is a sophomore who

competes on the cross country varsity and track teams. Jason earned his letter his freshmen year as he ran with the varsity boys' team at the state finals.

Parker Hughes also earned his rank in July. As a den leader, Parker was instrumental in helping Cub Scouts prepare to become Boy Scouts. Parker also became a troop guide where he helped the other scouts prepare for meetings, complete merit badges, and organize for campouts. Parker is a sophomore at Dunwoody High School where he is member of the Wildcat's varsity football team and member of the region champion wrestling team.

In July 2014, Ben, Jason and Parker all led a crew from their troop on an 86-mile hike through the Philmont Scout Ranch near Cimarron, N.M. Using their skills as experienced scouts, the boys navigated the trails and cliffs of the high desert over a two-week campout.

All three Eagles worked on projects to support the preschool at All Saint's Catholic Church. In the preschool's play and pray meadow, Ben created a rosary walk complete with decorative paver stones to help guide the children as they recite their prayers. Jason restored the outdoor classroom back to its former glory complete with custom wood table and whiteboard to allow the teachers to

guide the children in their learnings. Parker rejuvenated the play sand lot by replacing rotten stumps and timbers to create a safe and enjoyable place for the children to explore

digging and creative play. It goes without saying that none of their Eagle projects would have been possible without the incredible support of Hope Long, the All Saints Preschool

director.

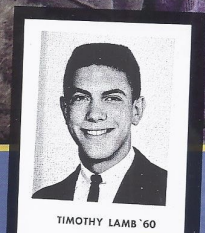
Hardly a month goes by that one or more of our All Saints brothers and/or spouses is not making news. We are proud to honor them in our newsletter and congratulate them for their activities.

It is very important to continue support for your past educational institutions.

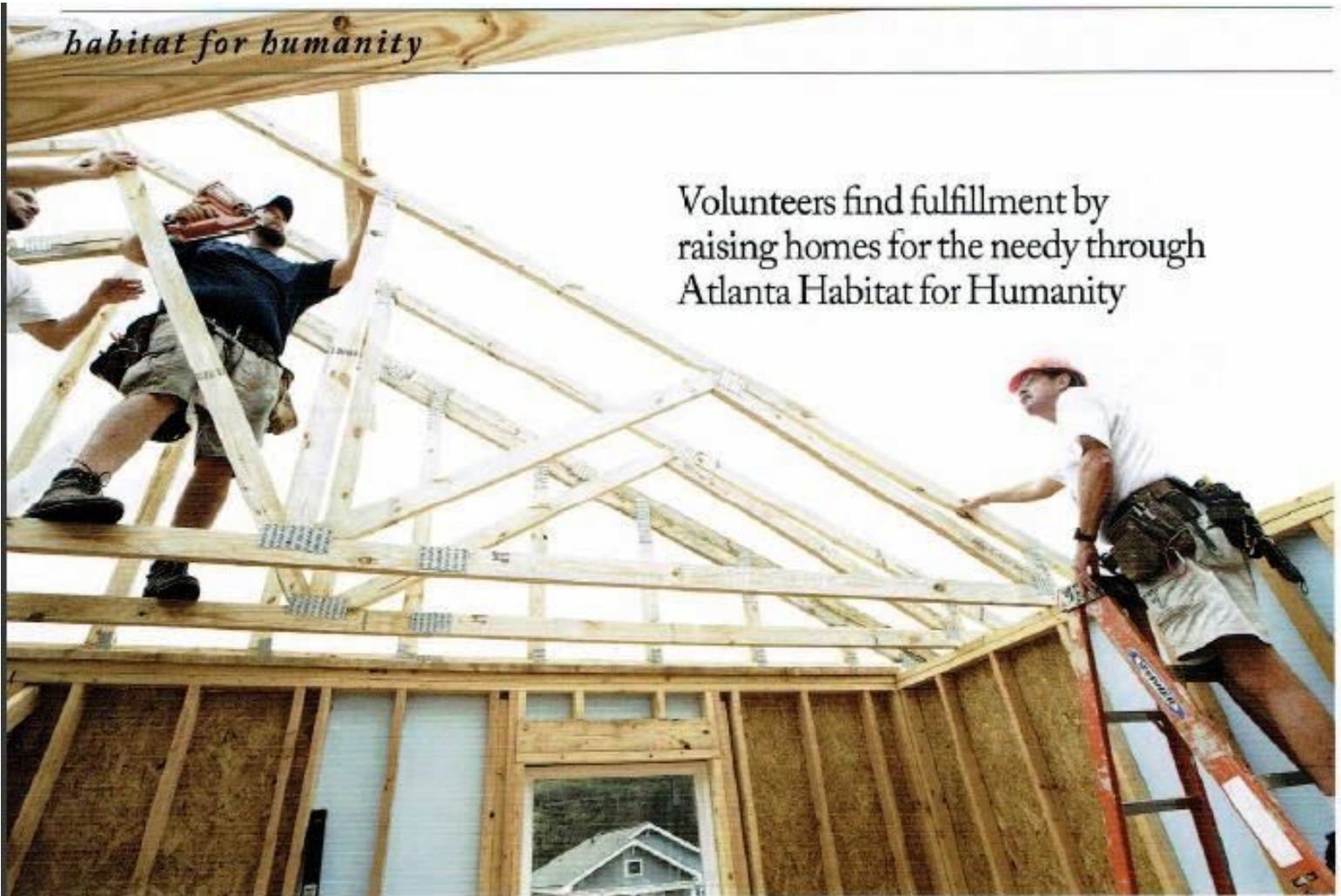

Building on good works

“Lord, tell me where I’m supposed to be.” That is the prayer Alex Cook says regularly. He prays.

He waits. He listens. In 2007, the answer was clear: Work for Habitat for Humanity.

The 43-year-old Decatur resident briefly volunteered for the nonprofit with youth groups in high school and college, and returned as an adult in 1999. A landscape architect at the time, he joined his co-workers for a Habitat volunteer project.

Founded in Americus in 1976, Habitat for Humanity International is a nonprofit that provides homes to families in need through “partnership housing,” which puts volunteers side by side with people who need homes in order to build simple houses. »

"I've been outdoorsy and hands-on since I was a kid, so Habitat felt like a natural fit," Cook says. "I had such a great time that first day. I began showing up week after week and the fire was re-lit."

"Over time I became a volunteer skilled supervisor, managing specific tasks and groups of volunteers. I realized I enjoyed my weekends as a volunteer much more than my weekdays behind the computer. Landscape architecture became a grind."

When he was let go from his job in late 2007, Cook wondered, "How can I get out of this field and not struggle, money-wise?"

Cook visited a career counselor, took aptitude tests and did some soul searching. A house leader position was open with Habitat and, though he knew it would mean a 50 percent pay cut, he also knew a greater reward could be gained.

"I never understood being passionate about a job before Habitat," says Cook, who has built more than 35 homes over the past eight years. "This job had me staying up in the middle of the night looking up carpentry problems. I'd crawl through homes under construction just to see how they did this or that. My quality of life instantly improved."

Atlanta Habitat has built more than 1,300 homes, housing over 5,000 family members. In 2008, about a year into his new job, Cook was working on Atlanta Habitat's 1,001st house when he met volunteer Mike Will as part of a group lifting a heavy beam atop two front porch columns.

Since then, Cook is always happy to see Will's name on his list of workers. Best known for his accuracy and efficiency, Will specializes in trim carpentry, cabinet and interior door work.

"I've done everything," says Will, 66. "However, as you get older, you do things that are lower to the ground."

Will was introduced to Habitat in 1994 through All Saints Catholic Church, where he and his family are members. "We thought we'd do one house, and that led to 22," Will says. "It was just so infectious to help someone. You start volunteering and you feel alive. It makes you feel like you have a purpose in life and that purpose is to give back."

Will runs the Habitat Guild at church, and his entire family is also involved. "My wife Jane organizes volunteers, I have one daughter who creates brochures and another who comes out and works on sites," he says. "I have gained more from this experience than I've ever given, and I know my family feels the same."

Cook can also attest that Habitat is a great place to build relationships: Through volunteering for Habitat he met his wife, Gwen.

"A group of us would go to Manuel's Tavern on Saturdays after working all day," Cook says. "Gwen was there, I thought she was cool and we started hanging out. We married a few years later, and she still volunteers as a skilled supervisor. She runs the saw to cut the roof decking."

Will and Cook both agree that the best part of serving through Habitat is the moment they hand the keys over to a new homeowner.

"Anyone can write a check, and that, of course, is great and needed," Will says. "But to write a check, then go out and volunteer on a build? Wow. You see where your money is going, you meet the homeowners, who are there working by your side, and it's just so meaningful."

Cook echoes that sentiment. "The reward of volunteering, specifically with Habitat, is that you get to know the homeowners personally and you get to see how you're affecting their life," he says. "You show up, give your time, share your skills and now their kids have a place to sit and do their homework every night. You raise the expectation for the next generation. They see that their parent is a homeowner and they realize they can achieve the same thing. It really gives you a sense of pride and, for me anyway, is a reminder that I'm right where I want to be."

Brother Denis Shortal is New Dunwoody Mayor

Shortal sweeps to win, Ernst takes Brookhaven

New mayors in Dunwoody and Brookhaven now have about a six-week honeymoon period before taking the oath of office.

In Dunwoody, voters unhorsed Mayor Mike Davis. While the result was not a complete surprise, the size of the margin was. Denny Shortal, an original city councilor and mayor pro-tem, won with 63 percent of the vote to 34 percent for Davis.

Shortal won all 13 of the city's precincts and won every demographic group, according to a pre-election poll done for The Crier. Turnout in the city was 24 percent.

The campaign was about personality more than issues, with neither candidate choosing to go

negative. In the last 10 days of the campaign, social media lit up, questioning the candidates' positions on and effort for a rebuild of Austin Elementary. Both candidates vote at Austin and Davis had his best performance there, though still falling short.

Voters seemed to prefer Shortal's down-home approach to Davis's record of attracting and retaining businesses. During the campaign The Crier received more than 20 letters criticizing Davis for specific votes and positions. Ironically, Shortal shared each of those positions.

Voters angry about the re-design of Dunwoody Village Park-

way, a wider concrete trail in Brook Run Park and even proposals for a roundabout took out their displeasure with Davis.

Though some analysts looked for a sign of anti-incumbent fever in the election, it didn't seem to be a factor anywhere on the ballot.

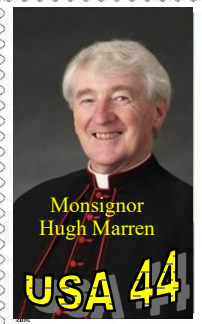
