Grand Knight's Report

Worthy Brothers:

The name "Lent" comes from same Latin root as our English word "length" and refers to the lengthening of the days as we approach the vernal equinox. As a child I was taught I had to "give something up" for Lent. This was always framed in the context of suffering--either as a foretaste of purgatory for my misdeeds, or as a reflection on and participation with the sufferings of Christ.

As an adult, I've come to understand that the Lenten abstentions are really not about suffering as much as they are about awareness, preparation, and conversion. As en fleshed spirits, we live in two worlds--the material and the spiritual. Lent lets us take stock of just how balanced we are between the material and the spiritual. The little mortifications we endure help make us aware of how addicted we are to the things of this world.

Awareness of our mortal addictions leads us to strive harder to conform our wills to God's will. As Knights we strive constantly to discern and to do God's will. Lent has a great way of focusing our attention on that goal.

The Church has two seasons of anticipation and preparation. The same liturgical colors of purple and rose are used for both. While Advent anticipates Christmas, Lent anticipates Easter. While Lent may seem a somber, dreary time, it's actually a time filled with hope and joy, because it anticipates the Resurrection. I hope that all of us will take time this Lent to work on breaking our addictions to this world, trying to conform our will to God's will, and focusing on our spiritual resurrection.

I make no apologies for my unabashed boosterism of our Lenten fish fries. Sometimes, I feel like Colonel Kilgore-- "I love the smell of fish grease in the morning! Smells like...victory!"

The fish fry is our biggest event, and the major source of revenue to fund our charitable activities. Lent comes early this year, with Ash Wednesday falling on February 21. Our fish fry season kicks off on Friday, February 16 with our practice dinner. All Saints has provided us with a new stove in the gym kitchen, and we are updating our equipment as we go along.

Our planning committee has been getting ready by putting new items on the menu, eliminating some slow-moving items, and coming up with new ways of serving our food faster and better. As always, we're looking for volunteers to help with setting up, serving, and cleaning up each Friday in Lent, beginning at 12 Noon through 3 PM, 4 PM through 8 PM, and 6 PM through 9 PM. There's plenty to do, and a place for everyone who wants to help. We'll have more details at our February business meeting on February 6th.

Lenten Fridays Become Fry Days Again This Year



It seems like we just put away the giant pots and pans for a long winter's nap, but here it is — February Fish Fry time again.

By the time you read this, some planning meetings will already have been held to manage details and form the committees that will make our 2007 Fish Frys another giant moneymaker for the council. The bulk of our yearly revenue comes from these events. We have served about 1,000 meals in an evening several times.

Scheduled again are eight frys—a practice fry for Knight families only, an Ash Wednesday fry, and six Friday frys during Lent.

We hope that every Knight will bring his family and friends to these events, and then spend some time working to make them successful. We need cooks, waiters, delivery runners, order takers, furniture movers, drivers, sweepers, and dishwashers.

All Saints has replaced the large range in the gym kitchen, so the Chowder Heads can work in safety and convenience. This gorgeous unit is already up and running ! Ray Gustin is working with his refrigeration guy to repair the walk-in freezer. The Council will probably end up paying for this. We're going to buy some new microwaves for the upstairs kitchen. Plus, Mike Paolozzi is getting prices for a new awning for the cooking area—one that doesn't require support trees.

McGivney Hall Renovations Planned

Early in 2007, the Council intends to make some renovations to McGivney Hall that were budgeted at the onset of this fiscal year, provided our facility budget is not diverted to other more pressing needs.

1. We intend to replace the worn carpeting in all three rooms with more attractive and resilient covering.
2. We intend to donate the five heavy, clumsy, non-folding square wooden tables to a needy organization. They would be replaced by folding, lightweight aluminum tables of various lengths that allow quick room configuration changes for various events.
3. We will donate the excess furniture in the back office (sofa and love seat) to a needy person or organization. That room is slated to be reconfigured as a true office with desk, filing cabinets, and additional needed storage.
4. We would like to put casters on all the officer podium furniture to enable easy movement.
5. We would like signage above our entrance door that advertises our organization as shown in the sample to the left. It is under \$250 and is already ordered.

The dates were the nights of Sunday, January 21st and Sunday, January 28th.

Tom recruited brothers to stay those nights to act as servers, monitors, friends, and hosts for about 90 destitute men who spend the nights in those two facilities during the winter months.

About nine brothers were needed for each night to split between the two facilities. The homeless men always offer a grateful prayer for their hosts just before they eat the welcome donated food.

Please volunteer your time for this fine cause. It has become one of our council’s finest traditions.

Nearly once a month, a 2nd Degree Exemplification followed shortly thereafter by a 3rd Degree Exemplification are held together at various council halls across northern Georgia. These ceremonies are free of charge to all the candidates and a very nice complimentary lunch is always served afterward. Your only effort required is to come with your Knight ID membership card and a rosary (knights always carry rosaries.)

Dress is business casual with a sport coat suggested in keeping with the religious theme. You will be home by mid-afternoon and you will be a proud Third-Degree Knight. Both ceremonies are interesting and uplifting.

Interfaith Outreach Home Obtains Funds

At our January business meeting, Grand Knight Greg Crnkovich temporarily halted the formal proceedings to present a check for \$1,000 to Ms. Deborah Walker-Little representing the Interfaith Outreach Home (IOH) at 5200-A Buford Highway in Doraville. This facility is a regular recipient of funds from both our council and All Saints Parish — www.iohome.org.

Walker-Little charmed us with a short presentation outlining the many programs for which these funds may be utilized. They provide transitional housing for families experiencing an episode of homelessness. Families live in self-contained apartments in IOH’s ten-unit facility and take part in life skills training. Self-sufficiency is regained in nine to twelve months.

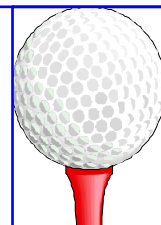
All Saints Parish was one of 30 North Atlanta churches of all denominations to address the problem of homelessness in 1989. Through 2004 more than 160 families were served.

It should also be mentioned that all the proceeds of the “*Keep Christ in Christmas*” card drive are given to the IOH as well, as has been our custom for several years.

Continued Collection of Items for Troops and Veterans

We continue to request that you bring to meetings unneeded golf equipment to send to the USO for distribution to the troops overseas (bags, clubs, balls, tees, etc.) These items are used on makeshift courses on the lovely rolling dunes of Iraq and Afghanistan and relieve some of the tedium of the troops.

Search Engine That Raises KofC Funds

A new internet search engine, **Goodsearch.Com**, has been initiated that pays any selected non-profit organization one cent (\$0.01) for every information search click. See goodsearch.com.

Before entering the normal search parameters on the search line, the user enters a charity name designated to receive the gratis penny. Example: entering “*Knights of Columbus*” sends a penny to New Haven Supreme Council per search.

The non-profit organization selected remains as the designated recipient until it is changed on a subsequent search. New recipients may be entered into the database with a template provided. Many thousands of charities are already set up., including the Supreme Council in Connecticut. Scanning the existing database is simplified by entering partial names.

Since the award per search is small, this site is effective for organizations with many members who choose to combine their searches. Here is a typical payout scenario:

Charity or School Size	People	Avg Searches per Day per Person	Estimated Revenue per Year
Small	100	2	\$730
Medium	1,000	2	\$7,300
Large	10,000	2	\$73,000
K of C	1,700,000	2	\$12.41 million

The underlying search engine employed is the Yahoo.com engine, so the searches are very high quality. The user may query the charity name to see how much money has been posted to it each month in real time.

Special Council Social Night Speaker — January 16th



Our Grand Knight surprised us by lining up a speaker for the first half hour of the regular council social night, Tuesday, January 16th.

Judy Miller of All Saints spoke of an international organization with the French name of “**I’Arche**,” a network of faith-based communities that care for people with developmental disabilities in a community setting. This organization was founded in Toronto in 1969 and today there are 121 communities on 6 continents in 31 countries serving people with disabilities in special homes.

Recently, Dr. Jean Vanier, the internationally-known founder of **I’Arche (the Ark)** was honored in Montreal with the Knights of Columbus [*Gaudium et Spes Award*](#) by Supreme Knight Carl Anderson at a banquet at Queen Elizabeth Hotel. This award, coming with a special \$100,000 honorarium, is the highest honor bestowed by the **Knights of Columbus**.

The award is named for **Gaudium et Spes** (Joy and Hope), the landmark 1965 document adopted by the Second Vatican Council. This document was a landmark in social teaching and the “Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World.” Vanier was the sixth person (and first layman) to win the award.

In 2005 an Atlanta local planning group became a I’Arche pre-project. You will recall that reaching out more to the community is one of our new council objectives. We will see if there is any way that our council can aid in establishing or serving such a community in the Atlanta area.

Council Benevolence Recommendations

Our Council *Charity Review Committee* met recently to consider several applications based upon the “**Request for Charity**” forms that have been received. As had been stated at the start of the fiscal year, the Council is looking to increase the number of charitable donations this year to draw down some of our cash reserves. Any council member may request funds for a charity and provide a proper justification case that is accepted by the *Charity Review Committee*.

These four applications were approved prior to the January Business Meeting, offered and seconded at the January business meeting, and now publicized to the general membership before final council voting approval at the February meeting. Our by-laws require this approval process for expenditures over \$250.

The four requests passed by the committee are:

Atlanta Intercultural Ministries— \$1,000 — requested by Greg Crnkovich for this after-school mentoring program for children of immigrant and refugee families can enhance reading and writing skills.

Birthright of Atlanta — \$1,000 — requested by Dave Moeller. This right-to-life organization is one of our regular recipients of financial aid. Last year Archbishop Donoghue gave out the check at our meeting.

I-Care —\$1,000— requested by Tom Burleigh. This organization provides drivers for indigent people who can not get themselves to health care facilities. Several council members are drivers.

Spirit and Truth Ministries— \$250— requested by Greg Crnkovich for this young adult group in Doraville that fosters devotion to the Holy Eucharist and Mary.

Other applications will be considered pending committee approval of “Charity Request Forms” received.

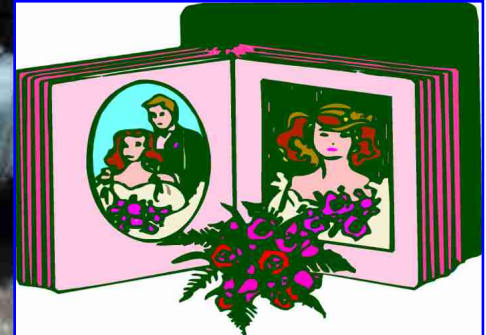

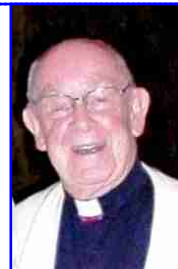
