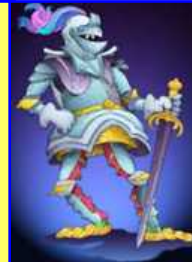

Grand Knight's Report

Brothers,

As we look forward to February, we see that another Ash Wednesday (Feb. 25th) is almost upon us. The first day of Lent signals a period of 40 days of preparation for Easter—the holiest day of the Christian calendar.

Our RCIA candidates complete their journey into the Faith at this time by no mere coincidence.

Some of our brothers are actively engaged in mentoring these Catechumens. We hope to receive one or more of these male candidates into our Order as well.

It is amazing how many knights are converts. Persons who go through a re-examination of their religious beliefs and affiliations are predisposed to look for an outlet to redirect their lives to community service. The Order is just such an outlet.

During this Lenten season, examine your commitment to service. We schedule volunteer efforts at homeless shelters, cemetery clean-ups, Elaine Clark Center workdays, Sullivan Center aid, Tootsie Roll Drives for persons with intellectual disabilities, acolyte service, memorial Masses, Habitat House builds, youth events, Honor Guard activities, parish receptions, and right-to-life activities.

This doesn't even include the fun social events like cookouts, picnics, and parties that bring people closer together into *A Civilization of Love* (which just happens to be the title of our Supreme Knight's new book.)

When you consider what you want to give up for Lent, you should consider giving up non-participation not beer. The principle of Charity does not consist in the giving of money alone, it springs from a willing heart. Engage in our activities. We need your presence and talents more than we need your \$40 in annual dues.

We need brothers to progress through all the various degrees of the Order from 1st to 4th. Remaining a 1st level member for many years is like some boy scout remaining at the "Tenderfoot" rank forever. Rekindle the pride you first felt at becoming a knight. Earn a degree.

We have been gratified lately by increased participation in our monthly meetings, by the addition of ten new acolytes, by the younger members joining the Order.

With the start of the Lenten fish frys, I hope that you will actively support this community activity. Not only does it supply the majority of the funds with which we enable benevolence, but it strengthens the parish and entire community in a common bond of cooperation. Even if you can not work the event, please engage yourself as a customer and bring your energy into the Social Hall.

This year we will again host a "practice" fish fry on February 20th, the Friday before Ash Wednesday. This event is just for knights and their families, prospective candidates and families, and special invited guests like the Women's Guild families. They have always been an integral part of the fish frys and great partners as well.



With the deteriorating economic conditions, we are hearing that brothers are finding themselves unemployed and in disturbing straits. When we offer prayers for brothers that are "sick and in distress", we always think of the "sick" part but never the "distress" part.

If you are in a position to aid a member who needs full or part-time employment, please let an officer of the council know. This is what brothers do for each other.

In the coming months, we will be initiating resistance to the "Freedom of Choice Act" that has been proposed. This FOCA legislation would mandate a right to abortion that could no longer be opposed by any future legislation. It would make abortion an entitlement the government would fund and promote. Citizens would lose their right to enact even modest regulation of the abortion industry.

The law would force every state to allow partial birth abortions—its sponsors have said a primary purpose of the bill is to ensure that killing partially born children will again be permitted nationwide. Hospitals would be unable to oppose abortions on religious, moral, or ethical grounds. Parents would be stripped of their right and responsibility to be involved in abortion decisions.

Abortion supporters have been trying to pass such a law since 1989—and now we have a Congress more disposed than any in recent years to pass the bill, and a new President who said that he would sign it into law. We knights are needed more now than ever before.

Southern Catholic College Presentation

One of the Georgia State Council's ongoing annual programs is the continuing support of *Southern Catholic College* in its evolution from one man's dream into a solid institution with firm footing in southern soil. Thus far the college has only the backing of various individuals, corporate donors, and KofC councils and has not been "adopted" by any religious organization that has a network of schools that their members support as their own.

There is a major movement of Catholics southward, but their higher education needs have not kept up with the compelling demographics. Only Southern Catholic and now Ave Maria College in the Tampa area are new entrants in serving this burgeoning need across Southern states. SCC is Georgia's only Catholic center of higher education.

This year Southern Catholic will reach a major milestone with the graduation of its first class of 50 students out of an enrollment of about 300. Their beautiful campus lies just north of Atlanta up GA. 400 in Dawsonville. The school has its own Knights of Columbus Council on campus. The child is beginning to walk. Archbishop Wilton Gregory has joined the board of the institution.

Our sister council, *St. Benedict #10633* in John's Creek, will sponsor a presentation by Jeremiah J. Ashcroft, President of Southern Catholic College, at 7 PM on **Thursday, February 5, 2009** at the St. Benedict's Parish Hall, 11045 Parsons Road, John's Creek, GA 30126. You will recall that we held our annual retreat there last Summer and our council also contributed the suggested \$2.00 per member to the Georgia State Council ongoing program of financial support. Other local councils supported SCC with a very successful golf tournament last year.

We hope that our members will turn their attention toward this wonderful young institution. It needs not only funds, but publicity, volunteerism, and a stream of talented young people to attend its already excellent facilities as students.

Continuing Charitable Benevolence Efforts

Our council benevolence continued at the January Business Meeting and during the entire month:

- The council voted a donation of \$500 to the Monastery of the Holy Spirit in Conyers.
- The council voted a donation of \$500 to defray travel expenses for the parish Jamaica Mission Trip.
- A motion for \$1000 for Birthright, Inc. was recommended, seconded, and tabled for a final vote in February.
- The Sparta cemetery work group rented a bobcat machine for \$500 to clear land. Money had been voted in November.
- The council hosted a Sunday evening at the homeless shelters in downtown Atlanta.
- Council acolytes served at all parish funerals during the month. Ten new acolytes joined the program.
- The council paid \$300 for a professional steam cleaning of all fish fry venues and equipment.
- Brother Bob Fiscella was the guest speaker at the Men's Club Meeting.
- The council hosted the Annual Free Throw Contest for the youth of the parish.
- Several brothers served on degree teams during exemplification ceremonies.
- Brothers Cmkovich, Durthaler, Francis, Tobia, and Cygnarowicz continue their RCIA and adult education mentoring.
- Brother Gray Plunkett is off to Benin, Africa again to translate the Bible into Foodoo language.

Jessica Harms' Recovery Complete

During the Fall of 2007, the Council heard the sad story of a young art teacher at Our Lady of the Assumption School in Chamblee who had fainted after giving blood and fell down on a curb and suffered facial and dental damages.

Because she had just started teaching at the school, her medical insurance had not yet kicked in and she was in need of help for medical/dental bills. Several charitable organizations arose to her aid, including our Council which donated \$1,000 to her fund. We recently read about this wonderful young lady who is now making news of a happier kind.



On December 10th, she won the grand prize in the "My Wendy, My Way" Art Contest. Miss Harms and OLA, where she teaches art, each received a \$25,000 award. Artists from 22 cities had submitted paintings in which they gave their own interpretation of the restaurant chain's well-known Wendy logo and how it fit into local themes.

Her rendition was of a young girl (Wendy) holding her father's hand and was very touching to the judges. She included background pictures including the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, the old Atlanta Cracker baseball field, and the first Atlanta railroad depot, among other landmarks.

Harms, a 2005 graduate of the University of Georgia who teaches art to 540 students, said the school will use its award to buy new technology for the classrooms. Her students watched her as she completed the painting during a two week period. The picture on the left is from the *Dunwoody Crier*.

We are most happy when we can see tangible results of our charitable works. We are especially proud of the innovation and creativity of Miss Jessica Harms, an inspiring teacher of young children. Live well and prosper.

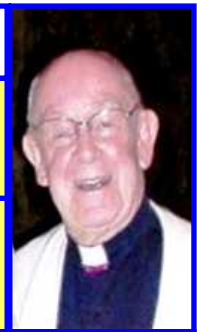
