Grand Knight's Report

Brothers,

During the last month, All Saints has witnessed two very impressive honor guard events at our church.

The Fr. Charles J. Watters Fourth Degree Assembly 2688 has been superb in honoring first our deceased founding Grand Knight, Frank Welter, and then our fifth Grand Knight, Ed Krise, on his special deacon ordination day.

I hope that these impressive displays of knight pomp and ceremony will inspire many brothers to work toward becoming Sir Knights.

These honor guards are known as "the most visible right arm of the Catholic Church". The history of the Church for centuries has been the story of knights, and this is still true today.

Even if they wear funny John Paul Jones chapeaus, the outfit is very stunning, and the members have a lot of fun and draw amazing attention at every event. Please consider joining. They have spare regalia if Sir Knights want to just give it a try.

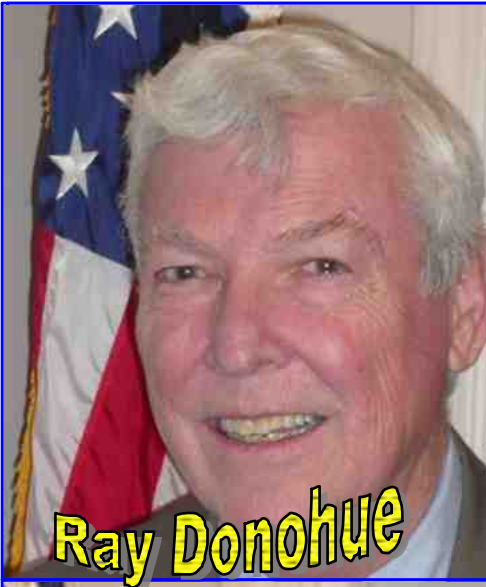

Frank Welter Invokes Fond Memories



There were many more smiles than tears at Frank Welter's funeral, perhaps because of all the fond memories the man gave to his brothers.

The poker chip box he hand-built for the regular Wednesday night poker club was featured on the entry table along with the prayer cards and the picture of Frank in his old World War II naval officer uniform. The Lieutenant Commander looked dashing even at age 86 and his uniform still fit him well.

Our founding grand knight was quite a carpenter and made many of the items still found around the church and the council hall. In his later years he settled for making thousands of rosaries that he gave to friends and charities.

He was a founding member of All Saints Parish, Council 11402, and the Watters Assembly 2688. He and wife Margaret were married for 62 years. He took care of her until his last days.

He golfed late into life, until his artificial hips no longer allowed him to do so. He drove much longer than he probably should have. When he could no longer stand for long periods, he then surrendered his honor guard regalia to Lou Hlad—who wears it proudly to this day.

This tough and crusty old knight was a model that any young brother should emulate. He leaves a legacy that we can never duplicate, but only build upon. We will miss this great man.

No honor guard was able to negotiate the close quarters and none participated.

At the 5 PM Mass at All Saints Church that evening, it was a different story. Monsignor Kiernan celebrated the Mass and Ed Krise read the gospel and gave his very first homily. The church was packed in anticipation of the graduation of their popular Deacon-in-Formation. A very impressive honor guard from the Watters Assembly had parishioner eyes and flash bulbs popping. Deacon Ed presented a large bouquet of roses to his wife sitting in the congregation to complete the event and received a thunderous applause.

Then it was on to the grand reception in the Social Hall. Deacon Ed's fellow council members from 11402 co-hosted the event for 500 of his closest friends. Fine catered food awaited the congregation and the knights provided and served the beverages. The Deacon received several presents, not the least of which were deacon stoles in various colors and for differing occasions from his council and the parish.

It appeared that our new deacon was overwhelmed by the attention showered upon him and enjoyed a special night of a lifetime. It is not uncommon for past grand knights to go on to higher office, but Ed Krise has done them one better. God bless Ed Krise in his new vocation.

Our former member, Sir Knight Lloyd Addison, will serve as their founding grand knight. He has previously served as a founding grand knight at councils in Mississippi.

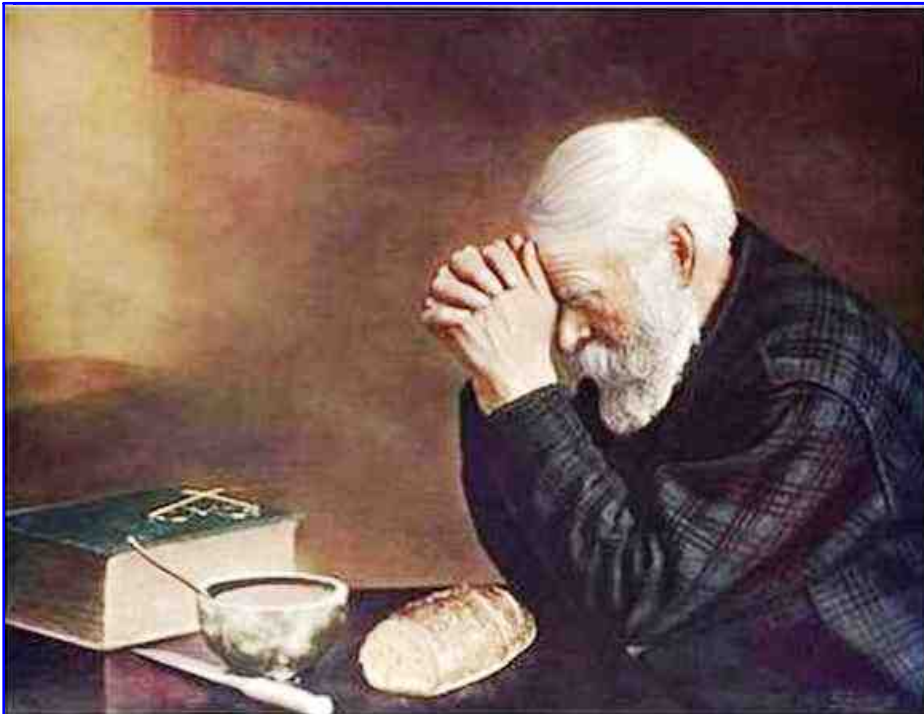

There are several more 1st degree candidates for MOQ that will be becoming knights at our upcoming ceremony on Tuesday, March 30th. It will be some time before they are able to staff their own degree teams and they are invited to rely on All Saints.

Homeless Shelter Volunteers Still Needed



Every year our council schedules two Sundays during the winter months in which we send a team of volunteers to man the dual homeless shelters next to the state capitol in downtown Atlanta.

The *Catholic Shrine of the Immaculate Conception* and the adjoining *Central Presbyterian Church* together house about 100 men overnight in their basements. The two properties connect with a common gateway. Our volunteers are always assigned to one or the other of the churches.

Women volunteers from All Saints prepare a hot meal for the homeless and bring it to the facilities. The knights prepare two hundred sandwiches and 100 food bags to be given out as the men depart on Monday morning.

Both teams serve and host the Sunday dinner. The women then leave and the men remain to spend the night with the homeless. They sleep and keep watch in three shifts. After breakfast, the homeless return to the street and male volunteers return home.

Scheduled dates are Jan 17th and Feb 21st.

Dunwoody Cleanup Volunteerism

This committee has already engaged most of the churches in Dunwoody, but not yet All Saints, in forming volunteer committees to fix up, clean up, and otherwise improve chosen areas of the city or ongoing civic problems. Our sister churches are already volunteering around Dunwoody to pick up trash, mow public unkempt areas, paint fire hydrants, adopt streets, erase spray paint, wash dirty signs, general park beautification, etc. Having approached All Saints, they have asked the Knights to spearhead the All Saints effort in late April. 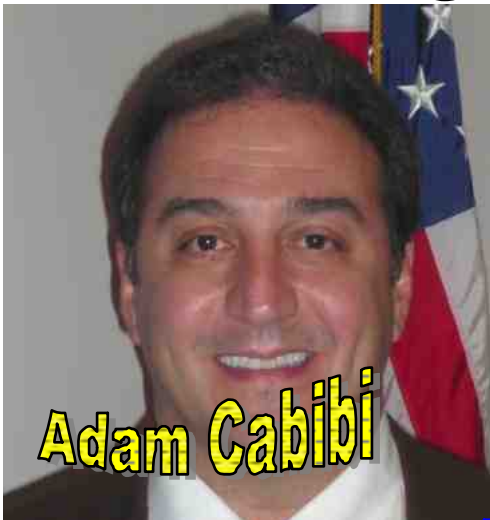

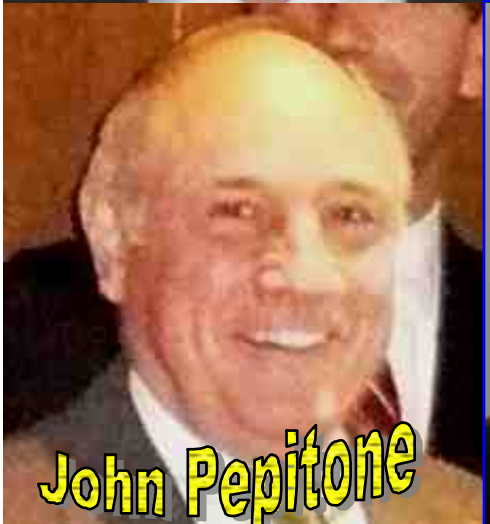
