Grand Knight's Report

Brothers:

This past month saw some impressive events at All Saints.

The Mass of Appreciation for Monsignor Kiernan, our pastor and Brother Knight was quite an event with more than thirty Fourth Degree Knights in full regalia providing an honor guard. We assisted with the reception in the gym, providing beverage service and other support. Many Knights participated in either the burse, presented to Monsignor by Deacon Ed Krise or the contribution to the Monsignor Donald Kiernan Scholarship fund at his alma mater, Providence College or both. The council's contribution plus the contributions of individual knights totaled over a thousand dollars. We also presented Monsignor with a plaque commemorating his service to the parish (Thanks to PGK Lou Hlad who produced the plaque!)

State Deputy Jim St. John came to All Saints on January 23 to present Past Grand Knight Lou Hlad the Council's fourth consecutive Double Star award. He also mentioned the International Service award that was presented to Lou and Marty at the Supreme Convention this past summer and in general was quite lavish in his praise of Council 11402.

Jeff Armbruster came to our "Social Meeting" on January 18th and gave a talk about Some Practical Lessons in Leadership. All who attended were impressed by his knowledge and perspective on this interesting subject.

We had nine brothers join our council, six new brothers at the first degree on January 25th – and three former Knights who are rejoining after being away for a while. Four new brothers from St. Thomas Aquinas also became Knights at that exemplification.

As I write this, we are in the midst of the annual parish mission. The speaker, Mr. Allen Hunt, a former pastor of a Methodist "Mega-Church" who recently converted to Catholicism, has been giving inspirational, motivational, relevant and meaningful talks. The first two evenings were more than rewarding. Seldom did an hour pass so quickly.

January marked another anniversary of *Roe v. Wade*

that legalized abortion in the United States. Many participated in marches and other events lamenting the decision and added by their presence and prayers to the growing wave of opposition to this manifestation of a growing "culture of death" in the world.

The Knights are in the forefront in supporting Pro-Life activities. While attending the Grand Knights meeting on January 29th, our State deputy informed us that the Knights had placed five ultrasound machines in Georgia and were in the process of placing several more, including one that is going to Father Ho Lung's mission in Jamaica.



2011 Knights Free Throw Tournament



Brother Jerry Cicero Made Us Proud

GERALD ANTHONY CICERO, 74

Financial expert helped blind

Friend's ailment led him to reading on radio for 10 years.



Jerry Cicero had a pleasing singing and acting voice that he put to use in high school and various productions in his native Chicago.

In Atlanta, he used that talent to serve the blind and visually impaired. The financial expert heard a radio advertisement with the nonprofit Georgia Radio Reading Service asking for volunteers to read to the community it serves, and Mr. Cicero signed up.

Once a week, he read The Atlanta Journal-Constitution live on the air with a partner.

"Jerry's tone and the pace of his voice was very personable, and he had a listenable voice," said Bettye Harris, the nonprofit's director of volunteer services. "He was able to convince listeners he was interested [in the

subject matter]."

On a few occasions, he was asked to tone down his delivery, said Susan Cicero, his wife of 30 years.

"He was a staunch Republican and was chastised for changing his voice while reading," she said jokingly. "He wasn't supposed to do that, and a couple of times he had to be told not to."

When he was 50, Gerald Anthony "Jerry" Cicero underwent heart surgery and in 2009 was diagnosed with multiple

myeloma cancer.

The Dunwoody man died Jan. 5 from complications of both illnesses at St. Joseph's Hospital. He was 74.

The memorial service will be noon today at All Saints Catholic Church in Dunwoody. H.M. Patterson & Son, Oglethorpe Hill chapel, is in charge of arrangements.

Mr. Cicero grew up in Chicago, where he graduated from St. Ignatius College Prep. He earned a bachelor's degree in history from Ohio's John Carroll University, served in the Army and made a career in finance.

In the 1970s, he moved to Atlanta to join the firm of Johnson, Lane, Space and Smith Co., and worked there for years. When he retired in 2000, he became an independent agent for Lion's Share Financial.

After heart surgery, Mr. Cicero became involved with a cardiac therapy group at St. Joseph's.

He was inspired to become a reader when Dick Hillman, a close friend

in Bethesda, Md., went blind.

"I've known him since 1965, and he was a terrific personality, quick, witty and knowledgeable about sports, movies and etc.," Mr. Hillman said. "We could talk on the phone for a half hour."

For 10 years each Friday, Mr. Cicero read the newspaper on air.

"The AJC is the only thing we read live, and the people he read with would tell you to the person what a joy it was to read with Jerry," Mrs. Harris said. "He had a sense of humor and was a funny guy, but you knew he cared about everyone."

"His voice was deep, but it had a melody to it like a tenor singer," Mrs. Cicero said. "It was an instrument for him."

Additional survivors include two daughters, Kimberly Kolodziejski of Monte Nido, Calif., and Kellie Acosta of Sandy Springs; a sister, Audrey Kasparek of Huntington Beach, Calif.; five grandchildren; and a great-grandchild.

4th Degree Exemplification Announced

It is the pleasure of the Master of the Fourth Degree in Georgia, Tom Gissy, to announce the Exemplification of the Fourth Degree in Marietta, Georgia, **Saturday, February 26, 2011**, honoring Sir Knight, Herbert Broughton, PSD, FMFD and a member of Assembly 172.

The degree and associated social activities will be held at the Marriott Atlanta Northwest. A special room rate of \$89.00 PLUS TAX per night has been arranged. This rate includes daily breakfast for up to two people per room. Room reservations are to be made directly with the hotel at 1-800-228-9290 or 770-952-7900.

The 4th Degree is one of the few formal events that we are able to involve our spouses. We strongly suggest candidates involve their spouses with all of the events of the day. Experience has shown that having a room, especially on Saturday, lends considerably to enjoying the day's exemplification into the "**Patriotic** and **Social** Degree of the Order".

Candidates request a blue application Form 4 from their council. They fill it out, sign it, and include a check for the amount corresponding to the events they select above. The Form and fees are returned to the council. Our Financial Secretary, Gert Kampfer, verifies membership in the 3rd degree, length of time as a member, and candidate membership number.

All verified forms and associated funds are then turned over by the council to the Assembly Comptroller who submitted one combined check for the council to the District Secretary by Friday February 18, 2011. **THIS IS THE ABSOLUTE DEADLINE. NO CANDIDATES OR BANQUET REQUEST WILL BE HONORED IF NOT POST-MARKED BY THIS DATE. THIS MEANS THE COUNCIL MUST RECEIVE APPLICATIONS BY EARLY FEBRUARY.**

To be eligible for this exemplification a Knight must have joined the Order prior to August 26, 2010, and have attained his Third Degree prior to this exemplification. There is no time limit for Priest, as long as he is a Third Degree member of the Order.

Each candidate must wear a black tuxedo for the exemplification. Full black tuxedo (no tails) must be accompanied with black bow tie and cummerbund, white tuxedo shirt with full collar (no flip up collar, no frilly extra lace on shirt), shined black dress shoes, and black socks.

Please make your interest known immediately to Lou Hlad at **louhlad@bellsouth.net** and 770-394-6327 to begin the process.

Expect to spend the day at the event which features an exemplification ceremony, hospitality suites, an evening Mass in full formal dress, a banquet with State Officers, and dancing in the evening. It is not necessary to stay after the exemplification, but one banquet ticket is already included in the candidate fees. We ask all 11402 candidates to make sure they are available for post-exemplification council newsletter photos.


