Grand Knight's Report

Brothers:

I trust you survived the "Storm of 2014!"

We are less than 30 days away from the start of "The World Famous Fish Fry." Our practice Fish Fry is on Friday, February 28. As always, this event is for Brother Knights as well as family and friends. All meals are \$5 – hopefully you're able to join us.

To refresh your memory on some of the results from last year:

- Exceeded 7,750 meals for the second straight year
- Average number of meals served on the seven public nights – 1,076
- Three nights exceeding 1,200 meals (remember when 1,000 was considered a monster evening!)
- The largest night ever – 1,297!

The question again becomes – just what we do for an encore? The answer is simple – we continue to provide our patrons with a fabulously -run family event with unrivaled food at a great price. It's no wonder it has become "the place to be on Friday night."

I don't know if we can increase the numbers in 2014, but that's not important. What is important is showcasing to the community the amazing unity and fraternity of Council 11402. This is our time to shine, and the men of this council never disappoint.

If you have never taken part in a Fish Fry before, please join us. Truly, the more the merrier!

In January I attended the north Georgia Grand Knights' meeting at Our Lady of the Assumption. As always, there were a lot of great ideas for the council to incorporate, as well as some interesting statistics shared by the state's general insurance agent Mike McDonough.

Did you know: Knights of Columbus insurance, established in 1882, has issued more than \$90 billion (yes billion with a B) in policies and continues to maintain the highest possible rating?

Knights of Columbus insurance made more than \$31 million in profits in 2013, 100 percent of which went directly to K of C charities (on top of \$136 million raised by council activities).

Those are all fantastic numbers. However, one number that Mike shared which is not-so-fantastic: in the United States, 70 percent of all widows live in poverty; 50 percent were not poor before their husband died! It's a sobering statistic. Give serious thought to become an insurance member. Our field agent, John Knight, is happy to help you find a policy that is affordable and makes sense.

This past year, the number of Knights in the state of Georgia passed 16,000. However, that represents only about three percent of adult Catholic men in Georgia. While the percent of All Saints men that are Knights is much higher, it's still less than 15 percent. We have room to grow.

Finally, a big pat-on-the-back and thank you to Brothers Joe DeVita, Dominic Palermo and the entire Bingo Committee for their amazing efforts in [securing a Bingo license from the state of Georgia!](#)

Our practice Bingo games have been flying under the radar, but now that we have secured a license, the games will be ramping up with the potential to become the council's largest fundraiser (surpassing the Fish Fry).

There is still work to be done, so be expecting to hear a lot more over the next couple of months.

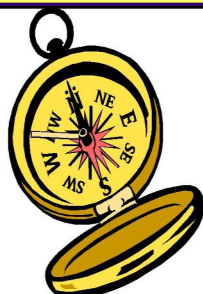

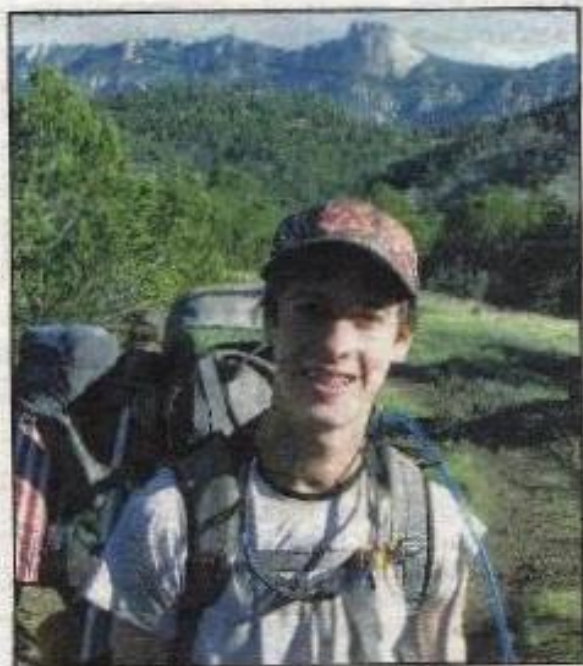
Council Aids Brewster Toward Eagle Status

You will recall that All Saints Council donated \$250 toward Jimmy Brewster's project that enhanced the parish youth garden with the addition of a full size Indian teepee. This project gave the parish youth a safe place in which to play and added a significant landmark to the grounds.

We have always helped our parish (and other church) youths who are pursuing their eagle rank. The parish can be proud of our record of having advanced 54 such youngsters to Eagle rank.

Troop 434 recognizes its 54th Eagle Scout

Marist sophomore Jimmy Brewster recently became Troop 434's 54th Eagle Scout. A member of All Saints Catholic Church and Genesis Retreat leader, Brewster was born in Atlanta and runs on the varsity cross country and track teams at Marist.

Brewster began his trail to Eagle in first grade as a Tiger Scout. As he moved through the scouting ranks, he has earned his Twentier award, and the Arrow of Light award, the highest award in Cub Scouts. After crossing over to the Troop 434 Boy Scout troop, he became a member of the Bison patrol and has held several leadership positions including patrol leader and senior patrol leader.

Brewster participated in the troop crew outing to Philmont in 2011 and went back in 2012 for a very select outing, Rayado, where he spent 20 days in the back country with a crew that introduced themselves to each other on the first day of the trek. He is scheduled to go back to Philmont for his third outing in July, 2014. He also has plans to apply to become a ranger at Philmont the summer of his 18th year. Through his Boy Scout career, he has camped 63 nights, hiked more than 400 miles and performed more than 70 hours of service.

project, he led a team of scouts, leaders, and other volunteers to construct a tipi in the Play and Pray Meadow at All Saints Catholic Church. To complete his project, his team cleared an area and constructed an authentic American Indian Tipi with locally harvested bamboo poles and an authentic hide from Wyoming. He was confirmed as an Eagle Scout on November 10, 2013.

Troop 434 has an active membership of 40-plus boys and 14 registered adult leaders. Each year 8-10 boys cross over to the troop and a good percentage stay involved until their 18th birthday. Much of this numerical success relates directly to the fact that Troop 434 is boy-lead. Every boy is required to hold leadership positions as he advances in rank. He is encouraged to step up and hold positions of increasing responsibility as he progresses on his trail to Eagle.

The program is outdoor-based with an emphasis on having fun, learning Scout skills, and advancement. The program is anchored by week-long summer camps, monthly outings, Philmont trips, as well as other activities planned by the boy leaders and the Troop Committee.

The troop meets each Monday night beginning at 7 p.m. at All Saints Catholic Church. Visitors are always welcome.

Immaculée Ilibagiza to lead retreat at All Saints Church

DUNWOODY—Immaculée Ilibagiza, the survivor of the Rwandan genocide and *New York Times* best-selling author of "Left to Tell," is returning to Atlanta to host a Weekend of Healing and Hope Retreat at All Saints Church in Dunwoody, Feb. 7-8.

Ilibagiza's story is one that has captivated people worldwide. Hiding in a cramped bathroom from the Hutu killers with seven other women for 91 days, she was finally liberated from her hiding place only to face a horrific reality. Ilibagiza emerged from that small bathroom weighing just 65 pounds and finding her entire family brutally murdered, with the exception of one brother who was studying abroad. She also found nearly one million of her extended family, friends, neighbors and fellow Rwandans massacred.

After the genocide, Ilibagiza came face-to-face with the man who killed her mother and one of her brothers. After enduring months of physical, mental and spiritual suffering, she was still able to offer the unthinkable,



telling the man, "I forgive you." During the retreat, she will tell her story and share in that same process of healing and hope.

As your professional Knights of Columbus insurance agent, I look forward to helping us grow in fraternity in any way that I can.

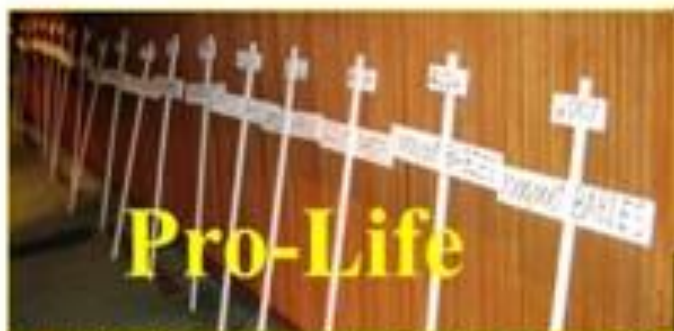

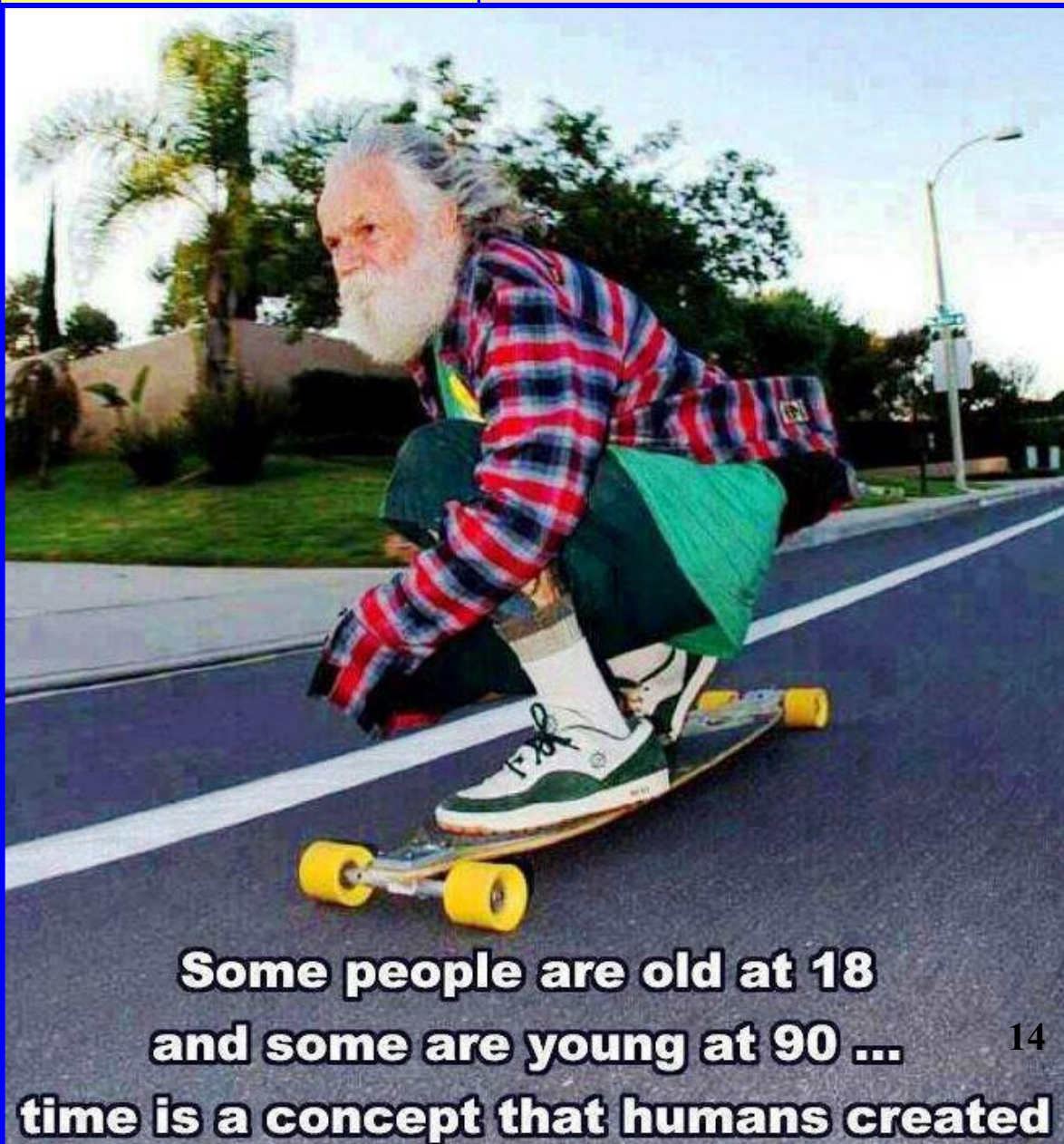
Prayer for Life

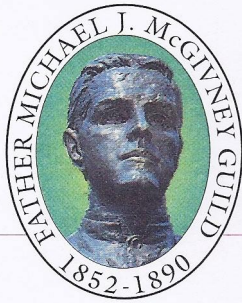

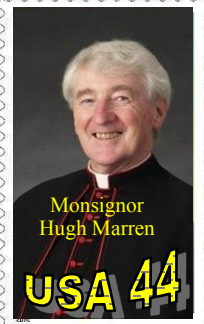
