Grand Knight's Report

Brothers,

As the new decade rushes upon us, our Council moves forward to honor two of our legendary past grand knights.

Our charter member and charter grand knight, Frank Welter, 87, has now sadly gone on to his eternal reward, but his bodily remains and friends and family now await sacred honors to be rightly accorded by his very appreciative brothers.

Family scheduling and the vagaries of the Christmas season have delayed his goodbye rites, but his

Council and Assembly brothers await patiently to usher him prayerfully and ceremoniously into eternal peace.

His name will be forever engraved on this year's Watters Assembly chalice, and it later will be awarded to a newlyordained or otherwise needy priest.

Having driven by the Welter home a few days ago, I was saddened to see the old American flag on his flagpole lowered to half staff. Keep this World War II Navy veteran and our 27th deceased brother in your prayers always.

Happily still among the living, our fifth Grand Knight, Ed Krise, will end five long years of study and be formally ordained as a permanent deacon in the Archdiocese of Atlanta. Hopefully, he will be assigned to All Saints Parish.

Krise is the only one of our nine grand knights who served a term of three years. During his term, our McGivney Hall became a reality from a previous storage room, so his legacy remains always with us.

His ordination will occur on Saturday, February 6th, and the council will host the parish reception being prepared for him that evening in the All Saints Social Hall. Please plan to attend that event.

These previous Council leaders are just two of our grand knights who have proudly distinguished themselves in Knight and community service. Currently Greg Crnkovich is our District Deputy and Rick Sisko is Georgia State Council Treasurer. Guy Stryker is a Past District Deputy and current Faithful Navigator of the Watters Assembly. George Novac served as a Faithful Navigator in Florida. Our council continues to crank out leaders who make their lasting marks on our Order at the highest levels.

For this reason we constantly encourage our members to attend the exemplifications that lead to the third and fourth degree levels that are Knight leadership platforms.

As our members continue playing a very key role in



the formation of the new Mary Our Queen Council in Norcross, we look for other opportunities to strengthen the Order. Our State Deputy, Jim St. John, recently inquired if we could look into reigniting nearby moribund St. Jude the Apostle Council.

St. Jude was the parent parish of All Saints, and thus we have a very special relationship with them. Several of our members belong to that parish, but belong to our council. I hope that All

Saints can continue to be a springboard of growth to the Order in Georgia.

On Sunday, December 20th, we were awarded our third consecutive Double Star plaque in front of a packed 10:30 Mass by State Deputy Jim St. John. It was a very proud moment for me and I hope for all of you. This type of notoriety can only help us attract even more new members.

At our recent *Desserts with Santa Party*, Sir Knight Don Meyers took down the names of eight men who expressed interest in joining our council. Our next 1st degree ceremony is scheduled for Tuesday, January 19th. There seems to be no limit to our ability to continue our healthy growth.

<u>1st Degree Exemplification</u> — will be held Tuesday, January 19th, at 7:30 PM at McGivney Hall. Candidates should arrive by 6:45 PM. Coat and tie is appropriate. Pictures will be taken.

<u>1st and 2nd Degree Exemplifications</u>— (held back to back <u>Jan.20th</u> at Atlanta Council 660 on Buford Hwy) 1st Degree Candidates need to arrive between 6:00 & 6:30 PM to register prior to the 6:30 Field Agent's presentation with a 7pm start for the ceremony. Observers are asked to bring their Council's Constitutional Role, along with all the candidate's Form - 100 and new member kit. Appropriate dress is jacket and tie.

2nd Degree Candidates are invited to observe the 1st Degree by arriving prior to the 7 PM start with their membership card, or are equally welcome to arrive by 8 PM for the 8:15 PM start of the 2nd Degree.


A message from Ed Krise to his fellow knights and all parishioners and friends:

Homeless Shelter Volunteers Needed



Every year our council schedules two Sundays during the winter months in which we send a team of volunteers to man the dual homeless shelters next to the state capitol in downtown Atlanta.


The *Catholic Shrine of the Immaculate Conception* and adjoining *Central Presbyterian Church* together house about 100 men overnight in their basements, The two properties connect with a common gateway. Our volunteers are assigned to one or the other of the churches.

Women volunteers from All Saints prepare a hot meal for the homeless and bring it to the facilities. The knights prepare two hundred sandwiches and 100 food bags to be given out as the men depart on Monday morning.

Both teams serve and host the Sunday dinner. The women then leave and the men remain to spend the night with the homeless. They sleep and keep watch in three shifts. After breakfast, the homeless return to the street and male volunteers return home. <u>Scheduled dates are Jan 17th and Feb 21st.</u>




