## Grand Knight's Report

Brothers:

Happy New Year!! As you probably know, January is named after the Roman god Janus who had two faces, one looking forward and one looking backward. As we start the new year of 2011, we should take a page out of Janus' book and look both forward and backward.

Looking back on 2010 there are quite a number of accomplishments of which the council can be proud. We can look with pride on a number of regular and ongoing projects like the Lenten Fish Fry, the *Vidalia Onion Sale*, participation in the Dunwoody Independence Day Parade, the Christmas projects of *Keep Christ in Christmas* card sales, the Monastery Fudge Sale and the Outdoor Crèche lighting, the Special Olympics Softball Tournament Sponsorship, our Habitat for Humanity, Elaine Clark center, support, the Oktoberfest, and more. We also received another Double Star Council award.

We continue our service to sick members with prayers and visitations and to the deceased with the unique Acolyte program that serves at parish funerals.

There were also, new initiatives such as the *Fathers For Good* programs, started under PGK Lou Hlad's leadership and for which this council received The International Family Service Award at the Supreme Convention last summer, participation in the Dunwoody Music Festival with our food tent, a Low Country Boil in support of the health ministry and a Spaghetti Dinner in support of the Cub Scouts, an upscale Christmas party, and a renewal of the All Saints New Years Eve celebration.

We began holding social meetings on the third Tuesday of each month and began to have regularly scheduled first degree exemplifications on

the last Tuesday of the month.

Looking forward, we plan to continue the programs that we have carried on in the past. This month we will start planning for the Lenten Fish Fry (yes, it is that time already!).

More immediately, we will be preparing for the *Mass of Appreciation* for Monsignor Kiernan who has retired, but will still be residing at the All Saints rectory. We have enjoyed a long and fruitful relationship with our brother knight Monsignor and wish him all the best in a well-deserved retirement.

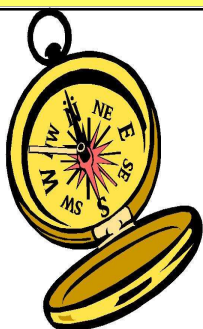

We have our work cut out for us in what looks to be an interesting, challenging and busy new year!

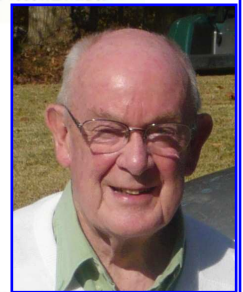

# 'Doc' Kiernan will retire from All Saints

From the Saturday vigil Mass to the final Sunday evening service this weekend, shock waves rolled through the congregation of All Saints Catholic Church as Monsignor R. Donald Kiernan announced his retirement as pastor.

"I have been asked by the archbishop to begin my retirement," he told his congregation Saturday.

He said he would retire at the end of the year, but he will continue in residence at the All Saints rectory.

Kiernan is 85 and he has been pastor of All Saints for 25 of his 61 years as a priest. No successor has been named.

In the usual cycle of staff assignments in the diocese of North Georgia, such changes occur in June.

Kiernan was told of his retirement in a short meeting last Monday with Archbishop Wilton Gregory.

Kiernan's career virtually spans the spread of Catholicism in north Georgia. When he came to Atlanta as a young priest it was part of the diocese of Savannah. While he served in 11 parishes from Savannah to Gainesville, the Catholic population doubled and re-doubled. Many Dunwoody residents remember his service as pastor of St. Jude's in Sandy Springs before All Saints was created. The parish now numbers 2200 families as members.

His service culminated in a stint of several years as one of two Vicars General for the diocese under then-Archbishop John F. Donoghue.

Greg Crnkovich, a parishioner, appreciates the history.

"The Catholic community in Georgia owes a great debt to this fine priest," Crnkovich said, "not just as a spiritual mentor but as a ground-breaking member of the Georgia civil establishment, helping create a Catholic presence in the state."

Kiernan was born in Taunton, Mass., and was graduated from Providence College and Mount St. Mary's Seminary in Maryland before being ordained a priest in 1949. He was awarded an honorary Ph.D. from Georgia State University and an honorary doctorate in law from Providence College.



Kiernan's special ministry is to law enforcement. He founded the Georgia Association of Chiefs of Police in 1962 and served as its director and chaplain for 20 years. He also served as chaplain of the International Association of Chiefs of Police, Georgia State Patrol, Georgia Bureau of Investigation, the DeKalb County police and the Atlanta offices of the ATF and the FBI.

Kiernan was a towering figure in Dunwoody as well, and was named the grand marshal of the first Dunwoody Independence Day parade in 1995.

Bill Robinson of the Dunwoody Homeowners' Association recognized his community efforts.

"The entire community will miss Father Kiernan when he retires," Robinson said. "Early on, he became an institution to citizens of all faiths as he became involved in activities both in and outside All Saints. I doubt if there is anyone in Dunwoody who is better known than Father Kiernan. He is a charter member of a group of local clergy who meet periodically to coordinate community activities. His departure will leave a hole that no one can fill."

All Saints parishioners long have enjoyed Kiernan's Irish humor. And a highlight of the pastor's annual Hoe Down was his rendition of "Butter Beans."

"Monsignor Kiernan is a pastor for the ages," said parishioner and city councilman Danny Ross. "He is a happy priest and a joyful person. We are grateful for his service to All Saints and to the entire Dunwoody community. I hope his retirement brings him good health and a big old bowl of butter beans."

Parishioner Charles Lynch is another who appreciates Kiernan's humor.

"I have been very fortunate to have been at All Saints for the past 22 years and had the honor of having Monsignor as my pastor," Lynch said. "I am glad that he will still be in residence so we can still hear his sermons and his stories, especially the ones that are 'truer than others.'"

Parishioner Bob Fiscella had a similar take.

"What happens when you mix the spirituality of Billy Graham with the comedic timing of Bob Hope - you get Monsignor Kiernan," said Fiscella. "Is there anyone in Dunwoody that has more friends or is more respected? He has that rare gift of making everyone around him feel important. In many respects, he is All Saints Church. The Archbishop won't have an easy time replacing him."

## Another Great Monastery Fudge Sale Completed



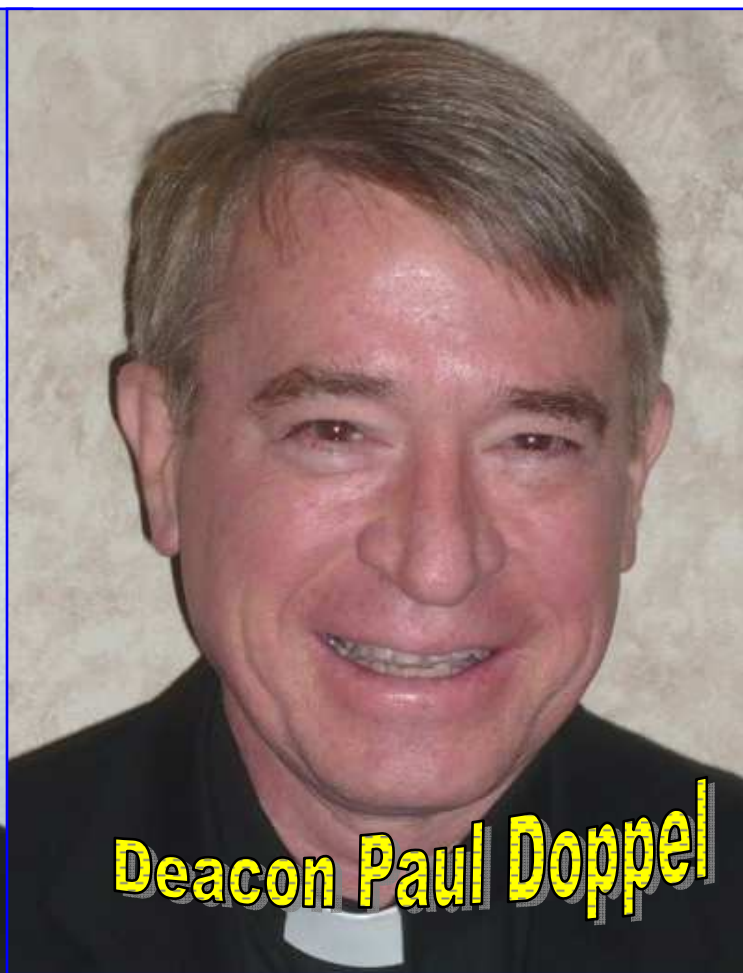
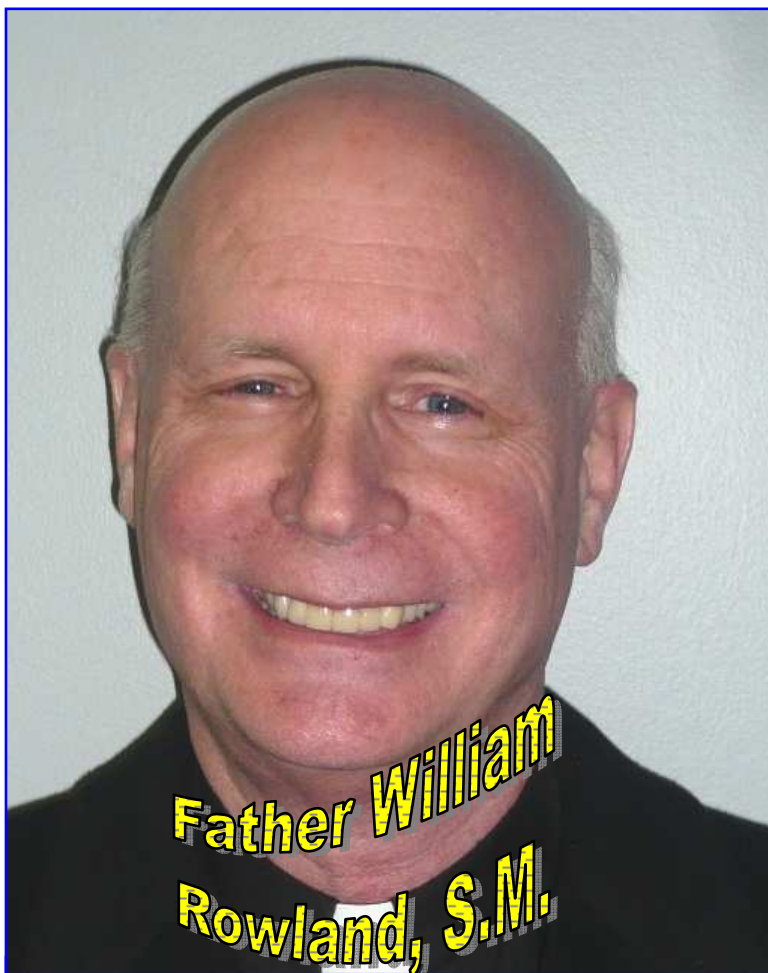
This year we sold every bit of fudge, coffee, biscotti, and fruitcake we got from the Monastery of the Holy Spirit.

# 4th Degree Exemplification Announced

It is the pleasure of the Master of the Fourth Degree in Georgia, Tom Gissy, to announce the Exemplification of the Fourth Degree in Marietta, Georgia, **Saturday, February 26, 2011**, honoring Sir Knight, Herbert Broughton, PSD, FMFD and a member of Assembly 172.

The degree and associated social activities will be held at the Marriott Atlanta Northwest. A special room rate of \$89.00 PLUS TAX per night has been arranged. This rate includes daily breakfast for up to two people per room. Room reservations are to be made directly with the hotel at 1-800-228-9290 or 770-952-7900.

The 4<sup>th</sup> Degree is one of the few formal events that we are able to involve our spouses. We strongly suggest candidates involve their spouses with all of the events of the day. Experience has shown that having a room, especially on Saturday, lends considerably to enjoying the day's exemplification into the "Patriotic and Social Degree of the Order".

Candidates request a blue application Form 4 from their council. They fill it out, sign it, and include a check for the amount corresponding to the events they select above. The Form and fees are returned to the council. Our Financial Secretary, Gert Kampfer, verifies membership in the 3rd degree, length of time as a member, and candidate membership number.

All verified forms and associated funds are then turned over by the council to the Assembly Comptroller who submitted one combined check for the council to the District Secretary by Friday February 18, 2011. **THIS IS THE ABSOLUTE DEADLINE. NO CANDIDATES OR BANQUET REQUEST WILL BE HONORED IF NOT POST-MARKED BY THIS DATE. THIS MEANS THE COUNCIL MUST RECEIVE APPLICATIONS BY EARLY FEBRUARY.**

To be eligible for this exemplification a Knight must have joined the Order prior to August 26, 2010, and have attained his Third Degree prior to this exemplification. There is no time limit for Priest, as long as he is a Third Degree member of the Order.

Each candidate must wear a black tuxedo for the exemplification. Full black tuxedo (no tails) must be accompanied with black bow tie and cummerbund, white tuxedo shirt with full collar (no flip up collar, no frilly extra lace on shirt), shined black dress shoes, and black socks.

Expect to spend the day at the event which features an exemplification ceremony, hospitality suites, an evening Mass in full formal dress, a banquet with State Officers, and dancing in the evening. It is not necessary to stay after the exemplification, but one banquet ticket is already included in the candidate fees. We ask all 11402 candidates to make sure they are available for post-exemplification council newsletter photos.

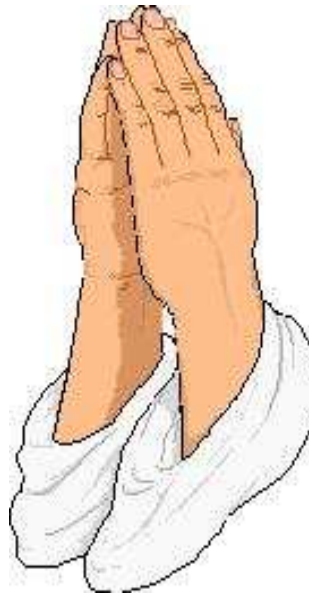

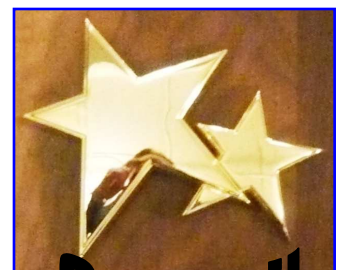
