To teach others to love by loving them.

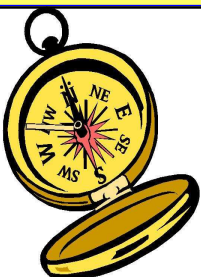

Our council brother, Sir Knight Paul Reale, was honored on October 10th with a complementary flight to the World War II Memorial in Washington, DC by the Roswell Rotary Association. All living World War II veterans are eligible for a free trip to DC through the Honor Air Flight Program which flies them free of charge and treats them as royalty coming and going. Private donations to this national charitable fund make it possible.

Our Fr. Charles J. Watters 4th degree Assembly donated \$600 to Honor Air to reimburse them for the costs for Watters member Reale. Each honoree was provided a trip guardian to take care of their every need. If you know of any living WW II veterans, they may take advantage of this program free of cost.

Paul was a featured speaker at the next Assembly meeting held at McGivney and used our TV to show a slide show of his exploits. We honor this US Navy veteran who acted as a communications specialist with the Pacific fleet during a large part of the war.

Knights Sponsor Monastery Fudge Sale

All Saints again sponsored a Fudge Sale for the benefit of the Our Lady of the Holy Spirit Monastery in Conyers, GA.

Featured this year were three flavors of fudge, biscotti, coffee from the Andes, and fruitcake. The products came in various sizes and made great Christmas gifts. Sales totaled \$9,339, about the same as previous years.

If you missed the sale, you can order by phone 1-800-592-5203 or HolySpiritMonastery.com. They also sell apple butter, some jellies, and honey on line.

All revenue from the sale went directly to the monks with none going to the Council. The monks are involved in a \$6.5 million dollar fundraising project to expand and modernize their aging facilities.

They plan to renovate their Monastic Center, Historic Barn, Abbey Store and Café, Bonsai Pottery Area, Central Garden, Café Garden, and Retreat House.

They have also added an eco-friendly cemetery called the Honey Creek Woodlands. Green burial is becoming a highly-favored funeral option. The cemetery is public.

Son Mark Moeller and our District Deputy Stan Wasowski were the primary movers on this project. We hope that a nice crowd of brothers is in attendance for the dedication.



KNIGHTS DONATE LIFE-SAVING ULTRASOUND MACHINES ACROSS THE MAP

Since its launch in January 2009, the Knights of Columbus Ultrasound Initiative has provided more than 300 ultrasound machines to qualified pregnancy resource centers around the United States. With matching funds from the Order's Culture of Life Fund, local councils raise half the expense of ultrasound machines for qualified centers through a variety of ways, such as pancake breakfasts, golf outings, Life Saver sales, pro-life baby bottle drives and second collections at Mass.

"One of the greatest blessings the Knights of Columbus has given us is that they have helped to provide the latest and greatest technology," said Bobby Williams, director of the Women's Care Center Foundation.

Many of the ultrasound machines donated by the Knights include 3D/4D imaging, a Doppler feature for hearing the baby's heartbeat, and/or the ability to sync with a large monitor, allowing others to experience viewing the baby.

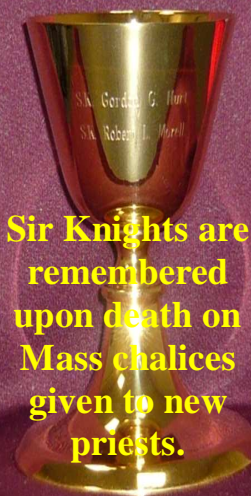

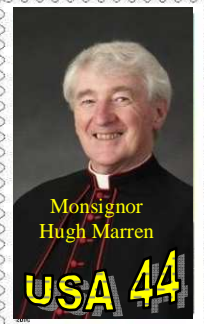
