

Grand Knight's Report

With 2014 now behind us, let's take a moment to review our council's major accomplishments and highlights.

The Culinary Squad, as usual, performed their art to perfection. With the multitude of off campus requests in addition to our Parish needs, the "Cooking Crew" continued to exceed all expectations.

In March we kicked off the Inaugural Pay for Play Bingo event, which is now a monthly staple of charity fund raising. The success of this event has allowed us to begin fulfilling Monsignor Marren's request to support Sophia Academy. In his honor, the academy has been receiving a monthly donation equal to half of the events proceeds.

2014 also included our first Friday Movie Night. This event has seen increased monthly participation, and has provided an inexpensive and wholesome opportunity for families to interact with parents and kids alike. With the addition of our new popcorn machine, it is much like a true cinematic experience.

The annual Fish Fry proved to be one of our most popular fund raisers. As always, this event's success is dictated by the tremendous voluntary support we receive from all of the Brothers. With a record setting number of meals served at 8436, I am truly humbled by the outstanding efforts from all of our council members.

On the heels of the "World Famous" Fish Fry, the Onion Sale has proven to be another very popular and profitable event. As a council we sold over 2300 bags of onions this past year, which by the way exceeds 11 tons. The remarkable growth of this fund raiser could only be achieved with the combined efforts of our Brothers. Thank you all.

The second annual Membership Drive brought our council many new and enthusiastic members that have already begun contributing to our fraternal efforts. Thanks to all of you.

This year also saw the start of the K of C Concert Series. We kicked it off with a performance by "The Buggs", a Beatles tribute band. As the table and ticket sales greatly exceeded our expectations, we realized that this event will become one of our more popular fund raising events. We are looking forward to the upcoming spring concert. Here's a hint, "Margaritaville".

Our council was honored to host the Statewide Financial Secretaries Training. We hosted over 30 councils from around the State, and State Warden, Jim Clifford facilitated the training itself. We were also pleasantly surprised by the appearance of State Deputy, Sandy Hillsman.

Our Oktoberfest event turned out to be a rousing success. Our council received multiple awards including top recruiter and top insurance agent in the State of Georgia. We were also blessed by the presence of three State Officers, as well as, our Clergy.

Desserts for Santa continues to be the "must attend" event of the Holiday Season. This year's event included some minor enhancements which contributed to its overall success.

The season also included another beneficial Monastery Fudge Sale. This year's sale generated over \$10k in proceeds for the Monastery.

Lastly, the season concluded with our Annual Knight's Christmas Party. It was an affair to remember. If you were unable to attend this year, make a point to be there in 2015.


Brothers Progress to 2nd Degree on Dec. 17th


Bingo Profits Sophia Academy


Toys for Needy Children


