## Grand Knight's Report

Worthy Brothers,

No man stands before you as Grand Knight without a profound sense of gratitude to those who have gone before him, and without an abiding sense of responsibility for what lies ahead.

I would like to thank outgoing Grand Knight Jim Miranda for his two years of service to our organization. Jim has proven to be a most capable Grand Knight and has presided over an exciting time in our Council. Jim, you will be missed!

I would also like to acknowledge the contribution of our outgoing Officers and Program Chairmen. These men provided the backbone for the successful programs we held over the past fraternal year. Thank you, gentleman!

And, finally, to our incoming Officers and Program Chairs, I extend my appreciation to you for stepping up and being willing to serve your Council. There are great things ahead, and you will be at the center of much of it!

As we embark on our Fraternal Year, it's incumbent on the incoming Grand Knight to set goals and challenges for our Council. This year, I would like to establish four main goals for Council 11402.

The **first goal** is to reflect upon our Knights' motto "*In Service to One, In Service to All.*"

As a Catholic fraternal society, the Knights' are dedicated to the care of one another and to God's neediest. Bound by the principles of charity, fraternity, and unity, we Knights have within us the power to do great things in our community by bringing Gospel values to life in

our everyday lives and in our outreach to those in need.

Our **second goal** is to develop more spiritual awareness among ourselves individually and as a group. The Knights cannot be the strong right arm of the Church without deepening the commitment to live out the Gospel in our daily lives and without deepening our awareness of the communitarian nature of our gift of church. Later this summer, we'll be holding our first two-day retreat at Simpsonwood. This follows our successful Day of Reflection held in April at Marist. These events

offer us the real possibility of deepening our relationship with Christ, and with our fellow Knights. In addition, we have many more opportunities to support the liturgical life of the parish and I hope that we'll take advantage of them.

Our **third goal** was given to us by Msgr. Kieran at the Officer Installation Mass last week. Monsignor challenged the Knights to become more active with vocation programs both by increasing our prayers for young men and women

# Introducing Our New Grand Knight — Greg Crnkovich

People often ask how to pronounce our new Grand Knight's name. We can officially reveal here that it is pronounced (**Grr-egg**).



Greg is the oldest of five children, born in Omaha, Nebraska, of a Croatian father and a Polish mother. He attended his local parochial grade school and graduated from Creighton (Jesuit) Preparatory School. He later attended Washington University in St. Louis where he received a **B.S. in Chemical Engineering** and an **M.S. in Engineering Management**.

Greg's professional career started with the Ralston Purina and Frito-Lay companies, before he moved to Atlanta in 1991 to work with a small, local engineering firm. Greg has consulted for several large companies including Procter and Gamble, Mead Johnson Nutritionals, McCormick Seasonings, Campbell Soup, and General Mills among others.

He currently is the **Director of Planning: Food and Beverage Projects** for The Austin Company of Cleveland, Ohio. His office is in Buckhead. Greg travels extensively across the U.S. supporting and developing projects in the food and related consumer goods industries.

A member at All Saints Parish since 1993, he has been active in several ministries over the years. He has been an instructor in the **Adult Education** program, a member of the **RCIA** core team, a member of the **Renew 2000** and **Why Catholic** core teams, a group facilitator for both **Renew** and **Why Catholic**, and is currently an Usher, a Greeter, and a Lector at the 12:15 Sunday Mass.

Since recently completing his M.T.S. (**Masters in Theological Studies**) from Spring Hill College (Jesuit again), he is currently working on obtaining an **M.A. in Theology** from the same institution.

Greg says that middle age is catching up with him, and it was never more obvious than with his recent foray into learning Koine Greek. He struggled through two semesters of the language, and "on a good day" could translate quite a bit of the New Testament. He has to take two more courses plus write a Master's thesis to attain his M.A. degree. He projects he'll finish that sometime in late 2007.

Although you would never know it to look at him, at one time Greg was a pretty good amateur long-distance bicyclist, having participated in Texas' "**Hotter'n Hell Hundred**" over ten times, the weeklong "**Ride the Rockies**" in Colorado, and the infamous "**Assault on Mt. Mitchell**" in the Carolinas.

Greg is a certified scuba diver, and has dived the Great Barrier Reef in Australia and several of the dive locations off the Yucatan Peninsula in Mexico. In his foolish youth, Greg also acquired a private pilot's license, and also has jumped out of few perfectly good airplanes just for the heck of it. But he is now content to spend much of his time riding in the back, with all the other "geese." He has also spent a good deal of time white water rafting out West on the Green, Salmon, and Colorado Rivers.

In his spare time, Greg enjoys reading non-fiction books; hasn't gone to but three movies since they awarded "**Rain Man**" the Best Picture and Best Actor awards in 1989; is becoming an opera "maven" to fill a large hole in his "Jeopardy" armamentarium; and he is reasonably computer literate.

If you're willing to come over and help look for it, Greg owns about every possible "gadget or tool" for the advanced cook, but oftentimes these are lost in the jumble of all his other paraphernalia. Greg is a "curmudgeon bachelor" and lives in the Kingsley Subdivision. He has no excuse for ever being late to Mass or a council meeting, since McGivney Hall is within site of his front door. His house is in a constant state of renovation and repair, although the pace of the work is not "blistering."

Scores of boxes of elf-like furniture and assorted playthings awaited all the assembly skills they could muster. Tables, chairs, wall racks, work benches, wardrobes, mirrors, play kitchen appliances, and whatever soon lay in countless pieces as the volunteers eagerly ripped open many cartons.

Some of the items (like bookshelves) were not very daunting, but one smallish carton contained a child's play oven with burners, dials with tension springs, a glass door with latches, an overhead rack, and hundreds of pieces. The instructions for all the assemblies, of course, were compiled by those inscrutable Chinese.

The new director of this facility, Hope Long, was very relieved that she and her father would not be tasked with building all this paraphernalia themselves before the opening class day of September 5<sup>th</sup>.

She moved about like a proud expectant parent watching all the modules being assembled into the vision of a parish pre-school program that had been outlined in the recent *All Saints Heritage Campaign* literature.

## Backup Music Man Needed for Exemplifications

## Council Benevolence Motions Made Last Month

During the June 6<sup>th</sup> Business Meeting, several motions were announced and seconded that our Council Charity Committee had discussed and recommended to the membership. Council By-Laws require that all expenditures over \$200 be tabled for 30 days and publicized to the general membership before final approval.

Wiley Maloof moved that **\$1,000** be donated to Sister Sponsa Beltran at *Our Lady of Fatima Rehab Center for Handicapped Children* in Liberia, Africa. Sister Sponsa is a regular recipient of Council funds and cares for 800 children.

Gert Kampfer moved that **\$1,000** be donated to *Our Lady of Perpetual Help Cancer Hospice* next to Turner Field. The All Saints community commonly supports this charity.

George Foster moved that a donation be made to *Good Samaritan Respite Center* in Augusta, Georgia to cover medical care for homeless people. The Charity Committee recommended the amount of **\$750** for this new Council charity.

The Charity Committee recommended that this year's K of C state raffle ticket refund of \$742 be augmented by \$258 additional dollars and that the **\$1,000** total be donated to *Birthright*. This is a pro-life anti-abortion organization that we often support.

At the July 6<sup>th</sup> ([Thursday!](#)) Business Meeting, all the above motions will be re-issued for final approval.

The amount of **\$1,000** in unrestricted funds and an amount not to exceed **\$750** for maintenance supplies for the *Elaine Clark Center for Exceptional Children* had already been given final approval after a thirty day period during the June business meeting.

Our Brother Knights are to be applauded for their charitable thoughtfulness.


