A Different Kind of Council Retreat— August 25/26



Have we got a treat for you!! Don't miss this one.

We didn't just go out and get a retreat master for our August Council Retreat, we signed up the Director of the Diaconate of the Atlanta Archdiocese—who just happens to be a nationally-renowned “story teller.” Deacon Alfred Mitchell uses storytelling techniques as his special way of bringing his homilies alive and making them meaningful. (Remind you of another famous parable-teller?)

He learned the art of storytelling as a boy in South Carolina at his beloved grandmother's knee. Many of the stories she told were about family members and residents of the small town in which they lived. Some were humorous and all contained a moral of some kind. He tells the same type of stories.

Mitchell was ordained to the diaconate in May of 1987 and assigned to the parish of *Saints Peter and Paul* in Decatur. He was appointed the *Director of the Atlanta Archdiocese Deacon Personnel* soon after in 1990. His professional involvement with storytelling began right after he became a deacon and has evolved until this day. He teaches seminars on storytelling and belongs to seven societies that foster this unusual craft. He is a founding member of the National Association of African-American Catholic Deacons (NAAACD).

In his own words:

“I believe strongly in the power of stories. They have a way of putting people at ease. Stories help us answer three very important questions. Who am I? Where do I come from? And where am I going?”

Our retreat topic is **“A Walk With Jesus — From the Desert to Emmaus.”** The retreat generally consists of an opening prayer or hymn for each talk. This is followed by a passage from scripture, a story, short lecture and reflection. Time is always allowed for the participants to reflect on what has been said.

After a three-year hiatus, the Council Tootsie Roll Drive (officially renamed by Supreme as the *Campaign for Persons with Intellectual Disabilities*) returned.

Our new brother, David DeFay, and Sir Knight Gene Gannon oversaw the effort and about 40 volunteers manned the doors of the church on June 9th/10th (Saturday/Sunday). **It was an amazing group effort.** Bill Lehman manned the doors at every Mass. Bless you.

Final results were about **\$1,900** gross less **\$450** expenses for a net profit of **\$1,450**. We bought 5,400 tootsie rolls and have plenty left for another drive on September 29/30. All proceeds for that one will be net profit. Stay tuned.

Part of the money goes to Supreme and promotes events like the *Special Olympics*. Part will benefit the *Elaine Clark Center for Exceptional Children* in Chamblee. See www.elaineclarkcenter.org. June 30th is a workday there.

We used this opportunity to separately sell 85 leftover archdiocesan history/directory “coffeetable” books that were purchased last year. Monsignor made a special plea to the Council in this regard at the May Business Meeting. They sold for \$25 each and gamered \$2,125 for the parish. Many of these magnificent volumes are still available.

Fr. Watters Assembly Meets at McGivney Hall



This is what a typical 4th degree Assembly meeting looks like. Each month the fourth degree Sir Knights have an opportunity to get together for a good hot meal and some fun and fellowship. Benny Mastrogiovanni and wife Bridget always prepare a good Italian meal when the meetings are held at All Saints McGivney Hall.

Meetings rotate among All Saints, St. Andrew, and St. Brigid. Each council relates what they are doing and share ideas for fund raisers, fun activities, and community projects. All honor guard activities also are coordinated at the Fourth Degree organization level by the Color Corps Commander, Joe Noa, of St. Benedict.

The organization is called the *Fr. Charles J. Watters Assembly #2688* — named after an Army chaplain who gave his life in service during the Viet Nam War and earned the Congressional Medal of Honor. It consists of 4th degree members from the Councils of All Saints, St. Andrew, St. Brigid, St. Benedict, St. Monica, and St. Brendan. All six Councils are located in this general North Georgia area. The theme of the Fourth Degree is patriotism and many of their activities are pointed into that direction.

On October 13th, there will be an opportunity to become a Fourth Degree Sir Knight. If you are a 3rd degree member, get ready to join an elite group of men who serve their Catholic Church and nation proudly.

Atlanta Fourth Degree to be Held on October 13th

On Saturday October 13th, a Fourth Degree Exemplification will be held at 10 AM at the Atlanta Airport Marriott Hotel. It is a grandiose affair with hundreds of candidates in black tuxedos and over a hundred honor guards in regalia. It is not something you will easily forget. This is the culmination of Father McGivney's dream for a huge, active organization that can make a difference in society. Unsuspecting onlookers staying at the hotel are usually in shock and awe.— and especially if they are non-Catholics who are not familiar with the Knights of Columbus.

The All Saints Council has about 75 third degree members. There is no reason that we can not field a huge contingent of candidates, spouses, and officer observers to make this a big Council event. Our sister councils in the Watters Assembly always field sizeable groups and they all have less members. For that reason, all 3rd degree members will be alerted. Because this is a fourth degree event, our Watters Assembly provides the coordination rather than our Council.

This event will not be without costs— a tuxedo may have to be purchased, there are costs for the hotel ballroom rental, the cocktail reception, the spouses' lunch during the closed exemplification, the group Mass, and the seated dinner later. Don't plan to cut the grass on this day, it is an all-day affair. It will leave a favorable, lasting impression on candidates.

Step 1: Obtain a **Form 4** to register for the ceremony. These are available at McGivney. Fill one out and return it to us.

Step 2: Get a regular black tuxedo (no tails) if you don't already own one. You will need a plain white tuxedo dress shirt (no frilly lace, no upward wing collar), a black cummerbund (no vest), studs and cuff links, a black bowtie, and shined dress shoes. We suggest purchase for about \$260, rather than rental over \$100. Fourth degree Sir Knights often use tuxedos for other Assembly formal events or optional honor guard duty. If you ever go on an ocean cruise, they also have a formal captain's tux dress-up night. You will be presented a ceremonial baldric during the event (a colorful diagonal K of C sash that goes across your chest.)

Tuxedos may be purchased anywhere. A good local source is located in the new huge Perimeter Place shopping center across from Perimeter Mall. The store below is just off the central car roundabout circle.

Step 3: Pay the other event costs to Bob Heald of our council (who is also the comptroller of the Watters Assembly.) Some, like the spouse's luncheon and the formal dinner, are optional. These were typical costs last year: Candidate fee \$70, Banquet \$42 (non-candidate), Ladies Luncheon \$25 each, Buffet after degree \$15 each. (*Candidate fee includes, one Banquet ticket, Fourth Degree lapel pin, Social Baldric, and Degree Certificate*)

Join the group of 75 fourth degree Sir Knights in our Council and become part of this elite group of Catholic men who make a difference in our parish, our Church, our community, and our nation. Don't wait until next year.
