# A Very Special Night at the Oscar's

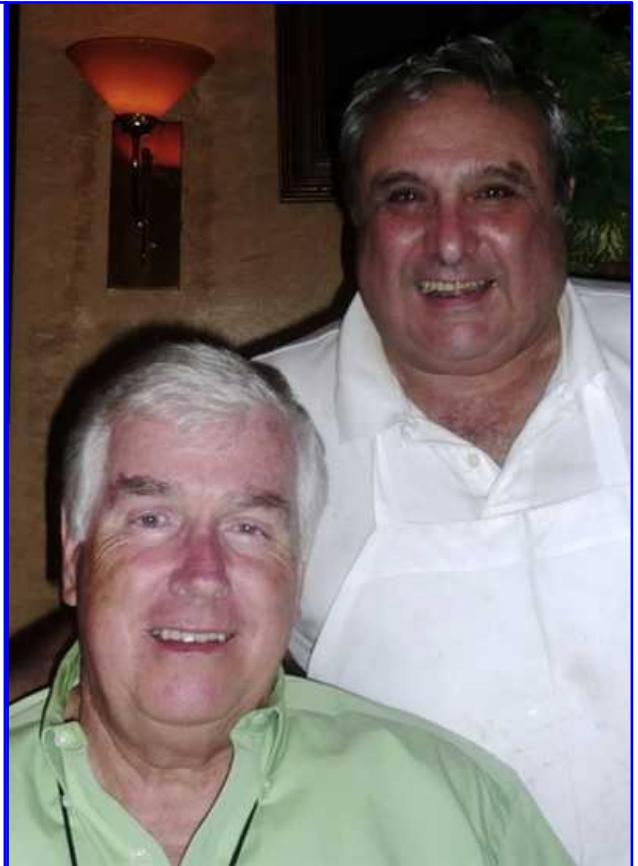

# Continuing Charitable Benevolence Efforts

- The Charity Review Committee reported favorably on a request to donate \$500 for the field refurbishment fund for the *Dunwoody Seniors Baseball Program*. It was approved and they will display a banner thanking the Knights.
- The Council donated the total of \$1,900 of its Vidalia Onion Drive profits to install two water fountains in the vestibule of *All Saints Church*. A cup dispenser was also set up in the ministers room by Greg Crnkovich.
- The Council donated the sum of \$150 to *Camp Inspire* for the benefit of Special Olympics children. The camp was started by the Georgia State Council and each local council was asked to contribute to its funding.

## Pope Announces Special Year of the Priest

As has been announced, the Holy Father Benedict XVI has decided to establish a special Year for Priests on the occasion of the 150th anniversary of the death of St John Mary Vianney, the holy Curé d'Ars, a shining model of a Pastor totally dedicated to the service of the people of God.

During the Year for Priests which will begin on 19 June 2009 and will end on 19 June 2010, the gift of special Indulgences is granted as described in the Decree of the Apostolic Penitentiary, published on 12 May.

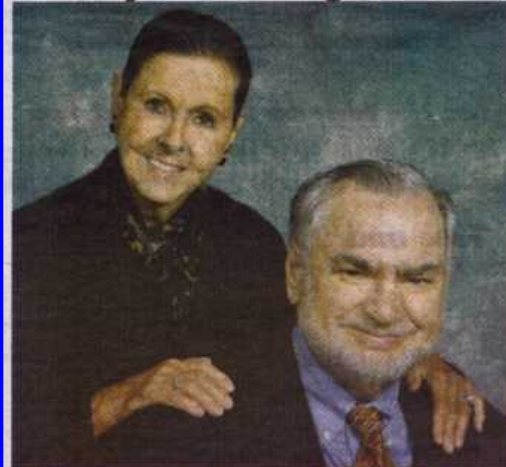
Shortly the day will come on which will be commemorated the 150th anniversary of the pious departure to Heaven of St John Mary Vianney, the Curé d'Ars. This Saint was a wonderful model here on earth of a true Pastor at the service of Christ's flock.

Since his example is used to encourage the faithful, and especially priests, to imitate his virtues, the Supreme Pontiff Benedict XVI has established that for this occasion a special Year for Priests will be celebrated, from 19 June 2009 to 19 June 2010, in which all priests may be increasingly strengthened in fidelity to Christ with devout meditation, spiritual exercises and other appropriate actions.

This holy period will begin with the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, a day of priestly sanctification on which the Supreme Pontiff will celebrate Vespers in the presence of the holy relics of St John Mary Vianney, brought to Rome by the Bishop of Belley-Ars, France..... **You will hear more about this next month.**

Thus begins the special announcement from the Holy Father of a special year dedicated to the sanctification of priests. The full text is carried on our web site [kc11402.org](http://kc11402.org). As a council, we will be especially honoring, thanking, and praying for our clergy this year.

## Council to Help Complete New Church Directories

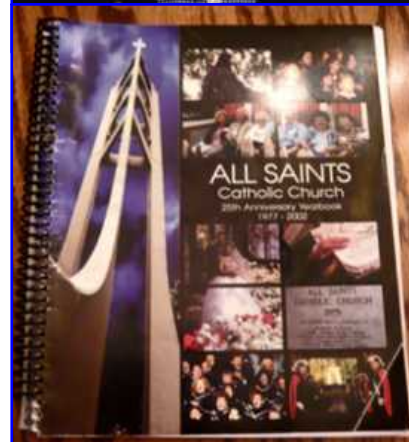
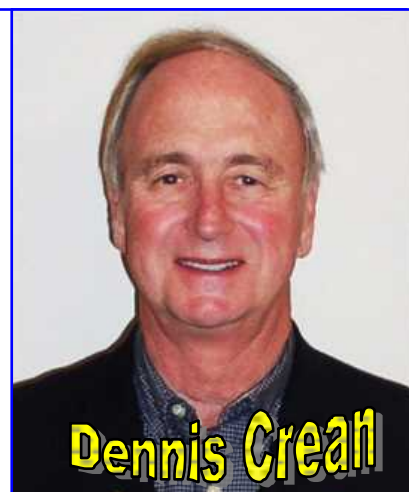
